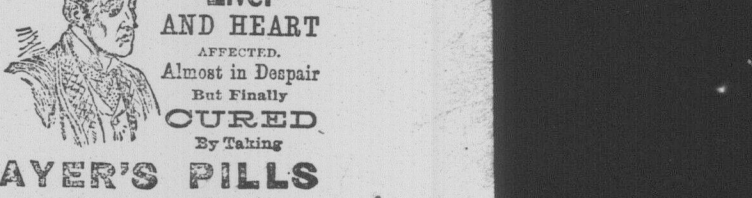

Another Steamer—An Excellent and Safe Passenger Steamer.

Mr. J. M. Riddock, who has built some of the best of the Miramichi steam fleet, past and present, is about to launch what appears to be the best specimen yet produced of his work in that line. The new boat is being built under cover at the Miramichi Foundry and Machine Works, where the boiler, engine, pumps and all other machinery and fittings were also made. The extreme length of the new boat is 42 feet—keel 35 feet—width 8 ft 6 in.—9 ft over guards—depth 3 ft 6 in. The frames are jupiter, of extra size, and the bottom of the hull is of the quality of jupiter, and the fastenings of galvanized iron. While the finish of the whole displays especially good workmanship, there is evidence everywhere of the wood entering into it having been selected with great care and its preparation being very carefully made. This is especially noticeable in the work about the handsome round stern, where the grain and covering-board are worked out of one piece of jupiter on the natural bend, with only one butt in the centre, aft, while each piece reaches well along the respective sides, where it is joined by the more straight work, very long scarf, which are firmly secured by screw-bolts. Indeed, it is one of the features in the construction of this used wherever possible, in fastening—rails, gudgeons, knees, etc.

Although of generous breadth of beam and ample depth, the new boat presents every advantage to the eye. There is an entire absence of the roundness from sternboard to bilge which insure to produce a rolling craft, the midships floor being quite straight up to the bows; the entrance is sharp and the run clean, and, yet, there is no concavity on the water-line, so that the hull should approach to a minimum of resistance in going through the water.
