

The Toronto News discussing the campaign after nomination day says:—

"It is clear that Mr. Rowell and his nondescript platform have failed to galvanize a bankrupt and moribund Liberalism into fresh life. It is doubtful if any Opposition in this Province has ever made a worse start on nomination day, or entered the race more seriously handicapped. Many of its entries have failed to face the rope. As a consequence no fewer than seventeen of Sir James Whitney's candidates were elected by acclamation. That is a remarkable beginning in a Legislature of 106 members.

"More than this! The Opposition has been unable to produce candidates in a number of other constituencies. Independents are running in six constituencies and straight Liberal contestants are wanting in twenty-three. It is known that many of the Rowell candidates entered the field only under the greatest pressure, and some of them may be expected to drop out before polling day. From present indications the treasury benches will be at least as strong as ever for four years to come. It will be surprising if the Liberals hold more seeps in the new House than they did in the old—that is to say eighteen.

"A notable feature of the nomination proceedings was the return of four Cabinet Ministers by acclamation—Mr. Beek, Mr. Hears, Mr. Duff and Mr. Matheson."






