## RULES \& REGULATIONS.

## ARTICLE I.

NAME.
This Company, independently organized 1st September, 1854, subsequently embodied under the Militia Law of 1855, shall bear the name of the 1st Volunteer Militta Rifle Company of Montreal.

## ARTICLE II.

UNIFORM:
The Uniform stiall be-
Full Dress-Riffe green braided shell jacket, facings black braid, on scarlet ground. Rifle green pantaloons, black braid stripes, with scarlet 'edging. Patent leather pouch, with silver crown ; patent leather belt, withesilver .. mountings ; shako and knapsack.

Fatigue Dress.-Russel cord jacket's scarlet buged collar; black pantaloons ; forage cap, with band of cak-leaf braid, silver bugle above peak ; and accoutremejtis.
Officers' uniform shall be the same as Privates; with the exception of accoutrements, which shall be the same as those worn by Officers of Her Majesty's 60th Rifles.

The Arms of the Companylshall be those furnished by Her Majesty's Government.

## ARTICLE III.

meetings.
SECTION 1.
The Company shall meet for Drill at such time and place that a vote of the majority shall direct.
section 2.
A Full Dress Parade shall be held the 1st Drill of each month.
section 3.
Meetings shall be held for the transaction of business, on the 1 st Monday of each Month, at $8 o^{\prime}$ clock p.m. The Meeting in January, shall be designąted the Annual Meeting, when the election of Civil Officers and the presenta-. tion of the Annual Report of the Board of Management shall take place. The Meetings in April, July and October, shall be termed Quarterly Meetings, when a Quarterly Report shall be presented by the Board.
section 4.
A Special Meeting, Drill, or Parade, may be called at any time by-order of the Captain.
section 5.
At all Meetings, one Officer, one Non-Commissioned Officer, and ten Privates shall constitute a Quorum.

ARTICLE IV.
MILITARY OFFICERS AND NON-COMMISSIONED OFFICERS, section 1.
The Military Officers of the Corps shall be one Captain, one Lieutenant, and one Ensign. The Non-Commissioned Officers shall be one Color Sergeant, two Sergeants, 1st and 2nd ; and three Corporals, 1st, 2nd and 3rd.

## section 2.

The Officers holding Commissions, and the Non-Commissioned Officers holding appointments, upon the passing of these Rules and Regulations, shall continue to hold them at their pleasure.

## section 3.

Any vacancies that may occur by resignation, death or dismissal, shall be filled by a vote of the Company, by ballot, at one of its regular Meetings. Candidates to be nominated two weeks before election, and their names posted in the Armory. The Member elected, must be free from indebtedness to the Company, and must have the plurality of votes.

## SECTION 4.

The Officers and Non-Commissioned Officers, shall be vested with the same disciplinary power as their equals in rank in Her Majesty's Service, and each Member shall, on joining the Company, sign a Rull. signifying his willingness to abide by said power, while under the uniform of the Company.

## section 5.

The Color Şergeant shall keep the Roll, which he shall call at the opening of every meeting. A separate Roll shall be kept for each month, which shall, when completed, together with a staternent of absentees and delinquents, be handed over to the Board of Management for consideration. All excuses for non-attendance shall be addressed to the Color Sergeant in writing, and shall be by him laid before the Board at the first Board Meeting of every month. He shall divide the Company into 3 Squads. Squad No. 1,
shall be underiiis management, assisted by the 1st Corporal ; suguad No. $\underset{\sim}{\text {, }}$, under lst Sergeant and 2 nd Corporal ; Squad Nu. 3, under ind Sergeant and 3rd Curporal. It sha!l be hus duty tu have ail notices or urdery served that may emanate trow the Captain or Board of Management.' In his atientice, whe Sumor Sughdit present, shall assume his duties.

## ARTICLE V.

## CIVIL OFFICERS

## section 1.

The Civil Officers of the Company shall be :-
A Pressdent, a Secretary-Treasurer, and a Buard of Man. agerment, composed of the President, Secretary.Treasurer, and ois Parate Members. The Offictrs and Cuiur Serseant being (ei Officio,) Members of the Board.

## séction 2.

$I^{\prime}$ resclent. - The President shall be ciected at the annual meening in January, and the quarterly mectius in July, to hold office for six current months. His clection shall be, as all wither Oificers of the Cumpany, by tallot. He shall preside at ail nectings of the Cumpany and Board of Management, shaii maintain goud urder and decorym in accordance. wath the rules of order; (his decision being subject to an appeai to the ruceting) said appeal fo be conducted in the manner specified in the rules of order ; and shall supervise all covel matters relating to the Comprang. In bis absence the Semur Mhitary Offuer present, shall assunie his duties and be vested with his powers.

## section 3.

Secretary-Treasurce-The Secretary (as Secretary) shall keep correct minutes of all pruceedings at meetings of the Company and Board of Managenient, and shall conduct the correspondence ; (as Treasurer,) shall collect, all monies due to, and pay all accuunts due by the Cumpany, as authorized by the Board. He shall open an account in a Bank of this City, in which all monies received shall be deposited in the name of the Board, and his checks countersigned by the President, shall be valid in all cases. He shall have the privilege of keeping $£ 10$ in cash, in his hands, to meet the current expenses.

## section 4.

Burd of Mynagement.-The Buard of Managenuent (five of which shall form a quurum) shall have complete cuntrul in all civil matters. All assessments upun Mcmbers voted by the Company, shall be levied by the Board. It shall receive and report upon all matters laid before it for consideration, shall make all purchases, contracts, and investments, in the Company's behalf, and shall present one annual and three quarterly reports of its proceedings, and the state of the finances.

On recciving a monthly statement of the absentees from Meetings, handed in by the Color Sergeant, it shall have poner to phace the fines impused, to the debit of each absentee, in the bouks of the Secretary. A Member wishing. to propuse a gentieman, as cundidate for membership, shall address the President in writing, and the Buard having en. tertained the application, shall report thereon at the first regular mécting, when the candidate shail be balluted for, -three votes in the negative shall preclude admission.

Should a Court Martial be at any time deemed necessary, to try a special case of delinqueney, dereliction of duty or ungendemanly conduct, a motion passed by two-thirds of any meeting, shall delegate to the Board, the powers of a Court Martial, to be presided over in this case by the Captain. The decision of the Court shall in all matters laid before it, be final.

## ARTICLE VI.

## DUTY OFMEMBERS.

SECTION 1.
Members shall be required to attend all Drills of the Company, in either Full Dress or Fatigue, as the Captain shall in orders direct.
section 2.
A Member wearing any portion of the uniform, shall be responsible to the Company for his conduct.
section 3.
No Member shall be permitted to lend his uniform or any portion thereof, to any Gentleman not a Member of the Company.

\text { SECTION } 4 .
$$

Each Member shall pay to the Secretary-Treasurer 2s. 6d. at each monthly meeting, to meet current expenses. An entrance fee of 5 s. shall be paid by each candidate admitted.
section 5.
Any sum of money that may be received from Government, either as a grant, or in payment of services rendered by the Company, shall be placed in the funds, to be appropriated at any time by a vote, for such purposes as the Company may deem expedient.

## SECTION 6.

Any Member absenting himself for four consecutive meetings, without adducing sickness or business as an excuse, and complying with the directions contained in these rules for furnishing said excuse, shall be returned by the Board for expulsion.

## section 7.

No Member, two months in arrears, shall be entitled to vote on any question, and if three months in arrears; shall be returned by the board for expulsion.

## section 8.

No Member shall be expelled, except by a vote of twothirds of the Members present, at any meeting. When a Member shall be returned by the Board for expulsion, his case shall lie over until the next meeting. In the interval, the Secretary shall notify him of such return, and summon him to appear and shew cause why expulsion should not ensue, should he neglect said summons, he shall be declared by the President, duly expelled by default.

## section 9.

Any Member appearing at Drill, deficient in equipment, accoutrements, or uniform, shall be returned to the Board as a delinquent by the Color Sergeant. The Board shall inflict such fine as it shall deem suited to the offence.

Any Member leaving the City for any space of time, shall have the privilege of obtaining a written furlough from. the Captain, for 3 mopths, during which time he shall be: exempt from all fines, dues and penalties ; should he neglect
to secure such furlough, he shall be subject to these rules, as if in the City. The Captain shall inform the Board of all furloughs granted.

ARTICLE VII.

## FINES AND PENALTIES. BECTION 1.

Any Member absenting himself from a meeting of the Company, without furnishing a written excuse addressed to the Color Sergeant, shall be fined 1s. 3d. currency. The Board shall have the power of deciding upon the validity of the excuse offered.
section 2.
Absence from an ordered parade of the Company, without complying with this article, shall entail a fine of 5 s . curreney.

Any delinquency noted by the Color Sergeant, shall be decided upon by the Board.

## section 4.

Any Candidate admitted to the Company, shall order his complete outfit within one week from his election.

## ARTICLE VIII. <br> EXCURSIONS.

The Company shall have the power of ordering an excursion, by a vote of two-thirds of the Members present, at any meeting. The Member proposing said excursion, shall give one week's notice of his intention, and the Color Sergeant shall inform Members of the proposal, and the evening on which it shall be considered.

## ARTICLE IX.

RULES OF'ORDER. SECTION 1.
When a Member wishes to speak on any subject, he shall rise and address the Chairman, and no Member shall. be permitted to speak more than twice on the same motion, (except in explanation, by special permission of the Chairman.)

The President shall open all businéss meetings of the Company; by calling the Members to order and desiring the. Color Sergeant to call the Roll.

The order of business shall be as follows:-
1.-Minutes of Preceeding Meetings.
2.-Liquidation of Accounts.
3.-Reports of the Board.
4.-Motions pursuant to notice.
5.-New Business.
6.-Adjournment.
section 2.
All motions shall be in writing, when requested by the Chairman, accompanied by the names of the mover and seconder, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, until the Chairman shall have formally read and deolared the motion to be before the mreting. In case of an amendment or 'amendments, the vote shall be first taken upon the last offered, and if lost, retrogressively towards the main motion.

## section 3.

When two Members shall rise to address the Chair, the Chairman shall name the first speaker.

An appeal against the decision of the Chair on any point of order, can be made at the request of five Members present. In a case of appeal, one of the appellants shall have the privilege of explaining his reasons for said appeal. The Chairman shall then state his reasons for so deciding. No further discussion shall take place. The vote shall then be taken, and the result declared by the Chairman.

A motion for adjournment shall be always in order, (except when a Member is speaking in order.)

## ARTICLE X. <br> WITHDRAWAL.

A member wishing to withdraw from the Company can do so on giving one month's notice, and settling his account in the Secretary's Books. The Captain shall then give him a formal discharge.

## ARTICLE XI.

Should any amendment, addition to, deduction from, or substitution for, any of the above rules be deemed expedient, the Member wishing so to alfer shall give one week's notice of his intention; said notice to be accompanied by the proposed alteration. It shall require a vote of threefourths of the members present to adopt such alteration; and for referenge, the Secretary shall keep a minute book, with copy of any alteration that may hereafter be carried into effect.
