CAP. XXXI.

An Act for the Encouragement of the Fisheries carried on from Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions in Europe, and for fecuring the Return of the Fishermen, Sailors, and others employed in the faid Fisheries, to the Ports thereof, at the End of the Fishing Season.

ODEREAS the Fisheries carried on by his Preamble. Majeffy's Subjects of Great Britain and of the British Dominions in Europe bave been found to be the best Murseries for able and experienced Seamen, always ready to man the Royal Mavy when Dc=

cations require; and it is therefore of the highest national Importance to give all due Encouragement to the faid Fisheries, and to endeabour to secure the annual Return of the Fishermen, Sailors, and others employed therein, to the Poits of Great Britain, and of his Bajefty's Dominions before mentioned, at the End of every Kilhing Season: Now, in order to promote these great and impor-

tant Purpoles, and with a Cliew, in the first Place, to induce Dis Majesty's Subjects to proceed early from the Ports of Great Britain to the Banks of Newfoundland, and thereby to profecute the Kilhery on the faid Banks to the greatest

and be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, Forfeitures That from and after the Kirst Day of January, Dne thou- Newfoundland to be fited fand seven hundzed and seventy-six, the Penalties and for in the Vice Admiralty Forfeitures inflicted by any Act of Parliament relating to Court in faid the Trade of Revenues of the British Colonies of Plantations in America, which shall be incurred in the faid Mand of Newfoundland, thall be fued for, profecuted, and recovered, in the Court of Aice Admiralty having Aurisdiction in the faid Island, and in no other; and Persons agif any Person or Persons thall think him or them appeal to the selves aggrieved by any Judgement, Sentence, or De ralty Court in termination of any Court of Aice Admiralty, or other Court having Jurisdiction in Newfoundland, upon any Suit or Profecution commenced there for any Penalty or Forfeiture infliced by any Act of Parliament relating to the Trade or Revenues of the British Colonies or Plantations in America, it spall and map be lawful for such Party to appeal from such Judgement, Sentence, or Determination, in the first Instance, to the proper Court of Admiralty in Great Britain, of to His Wajelly in Council; and that no Appeal thall in such Case lie or be brought in any other Court of Jurisdiction whatsoever, any Law. Custom, of Alage, to the contrary notwithstanding.

Duties on Goods exported or imported to be under the Di rection of the Commissioners of Customs,

and it is hereby further enacted by the Authority afores faid. That from and after the first Day of January, Dns thouland seven hundled and seventy-sir, the Customs and other Duties which now are or hereafter may be due and papable upon any Goods or Werchandiles brought or imported into, or exported or carried from, the Island of Newfoundland, by virtue of this or any att or atts of Parliament, and the Officers of His Wajedy's Culloms aps pointed for executing and carrying into Execution the feveral Laws relating to the Trade and Revenue there, thall be under the Wanagement and Direction of the Commissioners of His Wajesty's Customs in England for the Time being, under the Authority and Direction of the bigh Treasurer of Great Britain, of the Commissioners of the Treasury so, the Time being, any Law. Patent, Custom, of Usage, to the contrary notwithstanding.

Deputations arranted by the Commissioners for North America before: Jan. 1, 1776, to any Officers for Newfound-Land to be in Force.

Provided always, and it is hereby further enacted by the Authority aforelaid. That all Deputations and other Authorities granted by the Commissioners of the Customs for North America, before the said Kirst Day of January. One thousand seven hundred and seventy-six, to any Officer or Officers asting in and sorthe said Island of Newfoundland, thall continue in Korce, as fully to all Intents and Purpoles as if this Ast had not been made, until the Deputations or other Authorities so granted to such Officer or Officers respectively thall be revoked, annulled, or made void by the high Creasurer of Great, Britain, or Commissioners of the Creasury sor the Time being.

Persons sued for any Thing done in pursuance of this Act may plead the General Ifsue,

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That is any Acion or Suit shall be commenced against any Person or Persons for any Thing done in pursuance of this Act of Parliament, the Defendant or Defendants in such Action or Suit may plead the General Asue, and give this Act and the special Obster in Evidence at any Trial to be had thereupon, and that the same was done in pursuance of and by the Authority of this Act: And if it shall appear so to have been done, the Jury shall sind so, the Defendant or Desendants; and if the Plaintist

hall be nonsuited, or discontinue his Action after the Destendant or Defendants have appeared, or if Judgement hall be given upon any Aerdick or Demurrer against the Plaintiss, the Desendant or Desendants that recover and recover Treble Costs. Treble Costs, and have the like Remedy for the same as Desendants have in other Cases by Law.
