
LeBlanc Elected by 752 Votes

With over fifty per-cent of the student body casting their ballots in Wednesday's election, Sandy LeBlanc overwhelmed Robert Kerr with 987 votes to Kerr's 235 to become the new S.R.C. President. In a much tighter race, Richard (Pooch) Clark defeated Dan Mersich 610 to 558 in the contest for First Vice-President.

In the A.A.A. elections, Brian Ross gained a margin of 176 votes over Russ Irvine to gain the Presidency. The votes were Ross—642; Irvine 466. The Second Vice-Presidency went to Louis Savoie with 627 votes over Campbell Tidman with 462.

In the political elections, the Liberals won with 441 votes to give them 21 seats in the legislature. The Progressive Conservatives came second with 393 votes, and 19 seats, and the Christian Atheists were third with 246 votes and 12 seats. With no party having anything like a clear majority, Model Parliament should be interesting this year.

A total of 78 out of the approximately two hundred post-graduate students at UNB voted in the special poll to see if they wanted to be represented on the S.R.C. and pay the additional fees this would require. Of those voting, the split was very even, with 38 in favour of representation and 40 against. The law school had a 75% turn out at the polls, 60% of these, 21 out of 35, were in favour of electing a representative to the S.R.C. As a result of this, it is quite probable that it will be recommended to next year's council that the Law School be enfranchised and represented, while the rest of the Post Grads continue as before.

Following the ballot-counting, Robert Kerr issued this statement to the *Brunswickian*:



I do hope that by running I prevented an election by acclamation and ensured that our President-elect was called upon to place his views before the students in a campaign.
