

# REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

#### OF THE

# Dominion of Canada Rifle Association

The Council has the pleasure of presenting the 28th Annual Report of the Association, and of congratulating the members on the success of the Bisley Team, which (although not winning the Kolapore Cups) achieved—through the brilliant shooting of T. H. Hayhurst, G.M., Private in the 13th Batallion, Hamilton, the high honor of winning the much coveted "Queen's" prize. Other members of the team won first prizes in other matches, as well as a large number of smaller prizes in money and in kind, making in the aggregate the largest amount won by any Canadian team up to date.

The report of Major Markham, 8th Hussars, Commandant of the team, with the scores, etc., will be found in its place in the Annual Report, and the suggestions it contains may well be considered by the incoming council.

The scoring in the matches this year was of a very high order, as may be seen by an examination of the scores for the Bisley Team of 1896, and comparison with that for the team of 1895. In the 100 for 1895, 85 were inners and over, and out of the 100 for 1896, 98 were inners and over.

The matches were carried out promptly, and finished on time on Friday the 31st eagust, for which the working staff are entitled to much credit It must also be stated that the weather during the week was all that could be desired, and no doubt conduced to the high scoring that was made.

The subject of erecting permanent quarters at Bisley for future teams, and the best means to accomplish this desired end, was discussed by the Council during the progress of the matches, and a committee appointed, which has been in correspondence with the National Rifle Association, as to how the matter would be viewed, and the information received will be of service to that Committee in preparing its report.

It is believed that negotiations are proceeding between the Department of Militia and Defence, and proprietors of lands adjacent to Ottawa, with the view to obtaining a more extended Rifle Range than the one now used, the lease of which expires in 1897, and it is to be hoped that the Department will succeed in accomplishing this object, the necessity of which-for many reasons, is yearly becoming more urgent and apparent.

A communication has been received from the Federal Council of the Rifle Associations of Australia, through Captain W. Oldershaw, Honorary Secretary, inviting the Bisley Team of 1896 to travel to England via Australia. This kind invitation was considered by members of the Executive Committee of Council, and a reply was sent, thanking the Federal Council for the invitation, and at the same time stating that such an undertaking is quite beyond the ability of this Association in consequence of the great expense involved; but if a team be sent to Bisley from Australia it was hoped that they might return via Canada, and take in the matches of the Association.\*

The Council has again to acknowledge its indebtedness to His Excellency the Governor-General for continuing his annual contribution of \$500.00 to the funds of the Association, and for the kindly interest he takes in its affairs.

Through the kindness of Sir Adolph Caron, K.C.M.G., Postmaster-General, a Post Office was established on the range for the use and convenience of competitors, and the frequent deliveries were much appreciated.

The thanks of the Association are due to His Worship Mayor Borthwick and the Corporation of Ottawa, for the supply of light and water to the camp during the matches.

It is with much regret that the Council has to record the death of Lt.-Col. Allan Gilmour, who was for many years Vice-President for the Province of Ontario, and a liberal contributor to the funds of the Association, and also of S. Davis, Esq., of Montreal, the donor of the handsome Silver Challenge Cup, which forms the leading prize in the Dominion of Canada Match.

#### FINANCE.

The Treasurer's Statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the year, duly audited, is herewith submitted.

Affiliation Fees from Rifle Associations amounted to \$652.00 as against \$668 00 received last year. One Provincial, the Saskatchewan Rifle Association, has not affiliated this year.

The number of affiliating Rifle Associations is as follows, viz :- Provincial, seven; Regimental, County and others, thirty-eight.

Annual subscriptions received during the year amounted to \$198.00.

Associate Members fees amounted to \$340,00 as against \$314.00 received last year, an increase of \$26.00.

Receipts from Special Donations amounted to \$885.00 as against \$840.00 received last year, an increase of \$45.00.

Special donations from Banks amounted to \$750.00, the same as last year.

Entry Fees to Matches, including sighting shots, post entries and fines for challenge shots, after deducting refunds, amounted to \$3,998.65, as against \$4,118.20 received last year, showing a decrease in net revenue from this source of \$119.55. This is accounted for by the falling off in the sale of Extra Series tickets, as compared with last year.

The charge for ammunition collected with the entry fees and supplied to competitors, amounted to \$1,214.90, exceeding the amount received last year by \$26.00.

After deducting the cost of ammunition and the charges connected with the distribution at the firing points, including pay of employees and cartage, a balance remains at credit of Ammunition Account of \$165.98.

Cash Prizes and Badges amounted to \$6,999.34, as againat \$7,053.69, a decrease of \$54.35 as compared with last year.

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The expenditure on account of the Bisley Team amounted to \$5,648.61, as against \$5,859.78 last year, a decrease of \$211.17. This is accounted for by a saving in the cost of passages of the Team to England.

The Receipts from all sources for the year amounted to \$18,153.25, which with the balance sf \$548.69 carried forward from last year, shows a total of \$18,701.94, at credit side of the account.

The expenditure amounted to \$17,822.42, leaving a balance at credit of the Association of \$879.52 at the end of the year.

It will be noted that a considerable saving in the camp expenses and management of the matches has been effected as compared with former years.

A detailed account of the expenditure made by Major Markham, Commanding the Bisley Team of 1895, will be found in the appendix.

# MAJOR ALFRED MARKHAM

#### 8TH HUSSARS

# COMMANDING THE BISLEY TEAM FOR 1895.

ST. JOHN, N.B., OCTOBER 29, 1895.

To Colonel, the Hon. F. M. Gibson, President Dominion Rifle Association, Ottawa.

SIR,—Having been honored with the command of the Eisley Team of 1895, I beg to submit the following Report :—

In accordance with instructions received I had the team paraded in the Drill Hall at Montreal on Friday, 21st of June. One member of the team was unable to be present, but was vouched for as to uniform by a member of the Executive; the absent member of the team reported in the evening. Private Hayhurst had gone to England some weeks before on account of the death of a relative. Mr. Hayhurst joined us at Cambridge.

I would recommend that all members of future teams be instructed to assemble at a Hotel in Montreal to be named in the instructions sent to members of the team, and thus facilitate the checking and handling of baggage, besides largely reducing the expenses.

We embarked on the S. S. *Parisian* on Friday evening, and after a very delightful trip reached Liverpool on Tuesday morning, July 2nd, Dominion Day was celebrated on the steamer by an entertainment given by the team, consisting of songs, recitations and speeches, which were much applauded by the exceptionally large number of passengers, all of whom heartily joined in wishing the team success. Owing to improvements made at Liverpool the steamer was enabled to land the passengers near the new railway station, whence a special train was despatched with the steamer's passengers for London. A private car was given for the use of the team, and we were taken on the special fast train as far as Rugby, thence by a slower train to Bletchley Junction, and so on to

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Cambridge, which place we reached on Tuesday afternoon. I had wired from Moville to Col. Roberts at Cambridge, asking him to kindly have the range and ammunition ready for our use. We found everything arranged and I wish to express my appreciation of the kindness and courtesy of Col. Roberts to myself and members of the team.

The weather during our stay at Cambridge was very pleasant, and the team made excellent shooting practice from Wednesday until Saturday evening. On Thursday, leaving the team in charge of Capt. Mitchell, Adjutant, I went to Bisley to arrange for the team's quarters during our stay there. After much inquiry in London and at Bisley I found it was not possible to effect such arrangements for messing the team as were obtained in 1894; and having in view the desirability of keeping the team together as a unit I made an arrangement with the proprietors of the pavillion to set a special table in a pleasant part of the big pavillion for the team. After the first day or two the service and food were satisfactory. This plan caused a slight increase in the daily expense while at Bisley, thus necessitating a corresponding decrease in the individual allowance to members of the team for subsequent expenses, and I would recommend in order to avoid any question hereafter that the distribution of the allowances to the team for expenses be left to the discretion cf the commanding officer.

I found that Thos. White & Co of Aldershot, by their representative, Mr. Follett, had done all necessary work in the way of pitching marquees and tents, placing flowers and shrubs in position and arranging furniture and carpets in the marquees. The team arrived in the afternoon of July 8th at Bisley and were soon comfortably quartered in the tents assigned them. The weather was unusually warm and dry almost the whole twelve days and therefore our tents were very comfortable; but I would here endorse the suggestions of former commandants that permanent wooden buildings should be erected, not necessarily of an expensive character, but Canadian in design and finish. I spoke to Mr. Follett, of Thos. White & Co., on the subject. He informed me that if plans and specifications were sent to them they would submit a tender for the construction of the buildings. I have the fullest confidence in White & Co. and have pleasure in recommending them.

I have the proud honor to report that the Queen's Prize was captured for the first time for Canada by Private T. H Hayhurst, 13th Batt, after shooting off a tie with a Scottish competitor. The wildest enthusiasm prevailed when the contest was finished. Hayhurst was carried in a chair to the N R A. headquarters, where I introduced him to Lord and Lady Wantage, who expressed their pleasure that the chief prize had gone to a member of the Canadian Team. Shortly afterwards Lady Wantage, when presenting the badge, medal and purse to Mr Hayhurst, said that it was gratifying to know that the Queen's Prize had gone to such a grand and loyal colony.

On behalf of the team I wish to express our full appreciation of the kindness and courtesy extended by Earl Waldegrave, Col. Mackinnon, Mr. Rook, Mr. Hoey and other officers of the National Rifle Association. Our thanks are also tendered to Sir Charles Tupper, Mr. Colmer and staff of the Canadian Government Agency in London for kindness and assistance given.

The "At Home" was held on Thursday, July 18th The weather was perfect and the function was a decided success, one of the features being the presentation of the Canada Club Cup by Sir Charles Tupper. Messrs Thos. Ellen & Co., Cutlers of Sheffield, who are well known by all Canadian hardware dealers, kindly presented for competition by the team a very handsome set of silver mounted carvers in silk lined case This enterprising firm also presented each member of the team with a pocket knife, having an inlaid shield engraved thereon, "Bisley, 1895."

The Canada Club Cup was captured by Private T. H. Hayhurst, G.M., and the Carvers by Sergt. E. Skedden, 13th Battalion.

During our stay in camp we were visited by Major General Herbert, Lt.-Col. Otter, D.A.G., Lt.-Col. Wilson, R.C.A., Lt.-Col. Burland, 6th Battalion, and Major Lessard, R.C.D. The team were also honored by the presence of Sir Oliver Mowat, Mr. Justice and Mrs. Maclellan, of Toronto, and many other Canadians.

I enclose statements showing in detail the prizes won and scores made by the individual members of the team, also acquittance roll and account of expenditures with vouchers for same.

I wish to call the attention of the Association to the desirability of limiting the eligibility of competitors for position on the team, and am strongly of opinion that the limit as it existed in 1882 should be re-enacted, thus affording a chance for some of the younger men, who will be more encouraged to practice for positions on the team.

I have much pleasure in reporting the general behaviour of the team as excellent. I trust each member will have only the most pleasant recollections of our trip and stay in Bilsey camp.

In Captain Mitchell I had a most competent and agreeable Adjutant.



McLean, 43rd; Lieut. Brown, P.L.D.G.; Major McLaren, 13th Bat.; Capt. Brown, 66th Bat.; Capt. Evans, "B" Troop, R. C. Dgns., waiting, and in case of vacancies occuring, the following officers were to be notified, in the order written : Major Hartt, Capt. Hartt, Capt. Hopkins, 45th Bat., and Major Pellatt, Q.O. Rifles."-Carried.

Moved by Lt.-Col. Hood, seconded by Lt.-Col. D. A. Mac-donald,-

"That Major Walsh be appointed statistical officer, and is hereby authorized to appoint his own staff."—Carried.

Moved by Lt.-Col. Tilton, seconded by Major Blaiklock,-

"That the pay of the Camp Quarter-Master be fixed at \$3.50 per diem."-Carried.

Moved by Major Perley, seconded by Major Sims,---

"That Dr. James Grant be appointed surgeon (in attendance) during the Annual Rifle Matches of the Association."—Carried.

Moved by Major Perley, seconded by Major Sims,-

"That William Codd, who catered for the Association at last year's Matches, be given the catering for the coming year's matches."— Carried.

It was resolved that the ammunition distribution be conducted on the lines of last year's system.

NOTE.—To investigate how it was that Lt.-Col. Anderson was appointed a Member of the Bisley Team.

After which the meeting adjourned.

"That the Secretary do write to the officer commanding the district, and draw his attention to the fact that the smoke from the chimney of the caretaker's house obstructs the firing at 600 yards, and to request that he will be good enough to take such action as to cause the nuisance to be abated."—Carried.

The meeting then adjourned.

### Council Meeting held 16th December, 1895.

Members Present—Lt.-Col. Tilton, Lt.-Col. Massey, Major Perley, Captain Gray, Captain Waldo, Major Ibbotson, Lt.-Col. Hodgins, Lt.-Col. Anderson, Lt.-Col. Macdonald, Lt.-Col. Henshaw, Lt.-Col. J. Macpherson, Major Sherwood, Lt.-Col. White, Captain Sutherland and Secretary.

Lt.-Col. Henshaw, Chairman of Council, presided, and stated the objects for which the meeting was called, at the same time calling upon the Secretary to read the draft of Council's report which had been prepared, and Lt.-Col. Tilton and Major Perley were named a Committee to complete it.

It was resolved, that the printing of the report be given to Messrs. Taylor & Gilbert, provided they would supply an edition of 600 copies at the rate of \$1.25 per page, if not, that the matter be left in the hands of the Committee nominated to complete the Council report.

It was also resolved, that the correspondence having reference to the Canadian team travelling to England via Australia in 1896, be published in the Annual Report.

A letter from Lieut. Thomas Mitchell, relative to a prize of a Martini Henry Rifle given by him in 1892, it was resolved that his name be added to the list of Life Members.

The question of charging for use of bell tents at the Annual Matches was brought up, and some dissatisfaction being expressed thereat, it was resolved that the charge be cancelled.

The Treasurer, Lt. Col. J. Macpherson, read a synopsis of his accounts for the current year, which showed a very respectable balance in favor of the Association.

Staff-Sergeant Wynne was allowed \$20.00 for travelling expenses, which the Treasurer was instructed to pay.

With reference to the date of holding the Annual Meeting of the Association, it was resolved, that to comply with the constitution it should be called for Wednesday, the 22nd January, but in consequence of the early date which Parliament was called to meet, it be only "pro forma," except to move the adjournment of the Meeting to February 19th, at 11 a m., when the Annual Business Meeting will be proceeded with.

Lt.-Col. Tilton stated that on his application to his Worship the Mayor for a supply of electric light and water for the use of the camp during the continuance of the matches, he readily complied therewith ; it was resolved, that the thanks of the Association are due and are hereby tendered to the Mayor and Corporation for their liberality in this regard.

### Competitors' Meeting held Tuesday Evening at the Rideau Rifle Range, Ottawa, August 27th, 1895.

Present—Lt.-Colonels White, Tilton, Macdonald, Bacon, J. P. Macpherson and Starke; Majors Barnhill, Garrison, Bruce, Ibbotson, W. C. Macdonald, Manley, Parker and Hartt; Captains J. T. Hartt Winter, Weeks, Smith, Smart, Cartwright, Bell and McRobbie; Surgeon McLaughlin; Lieutenants Desbarats, Davidson and Ross; Sergeants Henderson, Ogg and Crowe; Privates Hayhurst, G. M., Binmore and many others.

It was moved by Lt. Col. J. P. Macpherson, seconded by Major J. E. Parker,---

"That Lt.-Col. White be Chairman."-Carried unanimously,

Moved by Major Parker, seconded by Captain Smart,-

"That Lieut. Shannon be Secretary."-Carried.

The Chairman then opened the meeting with a few preliminary remarks.

Lieut. Watters asked why \$1.25 was charged for the ammunition in the matches for which medals were held by competitors.

The Chairman explained that the price included the sighting shots.

Moved by Lt.-Col. J. P. Macpherson, seconded by Private Binmore,-

"That a revolver match be included in the D. R. A. programme for the Prize Meeting of 1896, and that a regular prize list be prepared for the same. Conditions to be left to the Match Committee."

Major Delamere explained the reason why no match was included was that the receipts heretofore when divided into prizes were so small that it was thought best to discontinue the match.

The resolution was then carried.

Major Henderson stated that all Affiliated Associations should only be composed of those residing in such districts, and that it would be advisable to have such a rule made. Also, that squadding of the one hundred in the Governor-General's Match should be done indiscriminately; also, that ammunition coupons should be discontinued, and in place of them, ammunition boxes should be supplied to the register keepers.

Private Binmore drew attention to malformed cartridges, and instanced his own experience at this meeting, and that some provision should be made to exchange a bad one for a good one,—also, that chequered rifle butts should be prohibited as is done by the N. R. A.

Surgeon McLaughlin also drew attention to the bad packing of ammunition, in many instances no paper being placed between the cartridges.

Moved by Major Bishop, seconded by Captain Thompson,-

"Whereas it is the opinion of this meeting that non-commissioned officers and men of the Active Militia on the Retired List of their companies should be entitled to shoot in the matches of this Association."

Therefore resolved,---

"That non-commissioned officers and men who have served nine years in the Active Militia of Canada, and who can produce a certificate to that effect, be entitled to shoot in all the matches of the D. R. Association."—Carried.

Captain Knifton wanted to know if reduced fares could be obtained on steamboats.

Major Parker explained that the C. P. R. granted them on the lake boats.

Major Garrison moved, seconded by Captain McRobbie,---

"Resolved that we recommend that the Annual Prize Meeting of this Association should be held beginning on the last Monday of August in each year." Captain Hartt said that the Council should be allowed a free hand in such matter.

Major W. C. Macdonald explained that it was not true that the reason was that the Toronto men had requested that the time of meeting should be changed, but it was from the east, but not the Maritime Provinces.

Major Bruce explained that upon representation from some, he had telegraphed to Major Hughes to see what could be done in the way of a change, and he also understood that there were many in Montreal who would also be pleased with the change.

Major Mason stated, that on behalf of the 13th Batt. he had protested against any change.

Lt.-Col. Starke, on behalf of the Montreal men, said that he had tried to get the date changed, and that he thought it should in future be the last Monday in August.

The motion then carried.

Major Macdonald brought up the charge of Extra Series Matches of 50 cents, that they should be 35 cents, and that the sighting shot should be dispensed with, and that the range should be thrown open for the first hour the first morning of the matches.

This met with the approval of the meeting.

Lt.-Col. Hood stated that he as a member of Council, had brought up this matter in Council, and that he was astonished when he bought his first extra series ticket at the price charged, and that it included a sighting shot.

Dr. McLaughlin said, that if there was to be a new range, provision should be made for an increased accommodation for extra series.

Capt. Grigg spoke strongly on this point and hoped that such a change would take place.

Major Mason said this was the practice some years ago, and did not see why it should not be done in future. Capt. Winter suggested that there should be some provision for obtaining extra series before the opening of the matches.

Major Macdonald moved, seconded by Captain Hartt,-

"That a recommendation be made to reduce the cost of the entries in the Extra Series Matches at 500 and 600 yards to 35 cents, and in the long range Extra Series Matches they be reduced to 50 cents, and that sighting shots be dispensed with at 500 and 600 yards; and furthermore, that the entire range be thrown open for extra series for a time on the opening morning of the meeting before the regular competitions."

Private Burns stated that he thought that the price of challenging shots is too high at 50 cents, considering that the telephone does the work so quickly.

The Chairman stated that this would be keeping back the matches, as there would be so many challenges.

Capt. McRobbie said he had seen a competitor to day on the range with his score ticket in the Dominion of Canada in his hands, and that register keepers should not be allowed to deliver them up to competitors.

The competitor in question, being present, explained that his ticket was for butt 1, target d., and that he handed his ticket to a range officer, whom he thought belonged to the butt he was to shoot on and that upon coming back to 500 yards, his ticket could not be found, and having found it he carried it to the range officer himself, and that he did not wish the blame to rest upon the register keeper, but upon himself.

Lt.-Col. Macdonald (Halifax) moved, seconded by Major Garrison, the following resolution :---

Resolved "That the annual competition of the D. R. Association be held at Halifax, N.S., for the season of 1897." Which resolution upon being put to the meeting was declared lost.

Major Macdonald brought up the question of squadding.

Some competitors firing always in the first, and others always in the last of matches, and that in future care should be taken that a competitor should not shoot in the same position in the different matches.

Captain Hartt said he thought the squadding this year was perfectly fair and satisfactory.

Lieut. Davidson suggested that when the new range was acquired, it should only be kept open for the use of the D. R. A. Annual Matches, and should not be used for the local force at any other time.

The Chairman drew attention to the fact that the range was the property of the Government, and if the D. R. A. wanted one exclusively for themselves they would have to pay for it.

Captain Hartt requested that when the programme for next year is prepared, that the regulations of the D. R. A. should be compared with the N. R. A. in order to have them the same, also that shooting off for ties for first places, especially in the Macdougall Cup Match, should be considered.

Captain Cartwright moved, seconded by Captain Macnaughton,---

"That in the opinion of this meeting no officer beneath the rank of Lt.-Col. should be appointed to the command of the Bisley team and recommend the same for the consideration of the Council."

Captain Hartt said he did not approve of this resolution as it prevented many good men from ever attaining that position.

Captain Winter spoke strongly in favor of the motion.

Captain Smith said that any commandant going to Bisley should not be a figurehead only, but should have a knowledge of rifle shooting as well as social qualifications, and that the best officers are not all among the Lt.-Colonels.

Captain McRobbie hoped that in future the commandant would be a rifle shot.

Resolution carried.

Private Binmore wanted to know how the Kolapore Cup team at Bisley was picked. After a lengthy discussion Major Mason said that the Council might make an effort to have the contest restored to the second week of the Bisley meeting, instead of the first.

Captain McRobbie stated that he thought the commandant and the adjutant should not be interfered with.

Lt.-Col. J. P. Macpherson brought up the question of permanent quarters at Bisley for the Canadian team.

Captain Pope was of the opinion that instead of shooting at Cambridge, arrangements should be made to shoot at a nearer point to Bisley, such as Runnemede range, and was also strongly in favor of permanent quarters.

Private Hayhurst stated that the practice range at Cambridge was useless to the Canadian team, and recommended strongly that Staines' should be chosen, as the range there was more like the Bisley range, also that the matter of permanent quarters was of the highest importance to good results of the team.

Captain Pope stated that the cost of hire of tents, furniture, etc., every year, would pay the interest on a loan sufficient to build good per manent quarters.

The Chairman asked where the money was to come from, as such buildings could not be erected at a cost of less than \$5,000.

Captain Grigg brought up Rule 12, Sec. A, of the regulations, viz : "The field of vision shall not be limited except by the orthoptic disc, and the use of sideflaps will not be allowed," and asked if any decision by the Executive Committee had been given as to the meaning of it.

Major Mason said that the decision of the Match Committee was that anything interfering with the full vision of the competitor should not be allowed.

Private Binmore asked for information how Lt.-Col. W. P. Anderson became a member of the Bisley team, he being on the Retired List when he shot last year. The Chairman stated that the Militia Department had placed Colonel Anderson on the Active List, and dated such back to 1888, and that the Militia Department having done so, the Council could not go behind the Department.

The meeting adjourned at 10.30 p.m.

## CONSTITUTION<sup>3</sup>

#### ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

I. That the Association be denominated "THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION."

2. Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00, and paying the same before the first day of September, or the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting, shall become a member of the Association for the current Association year, and any member may continue his membership by the annual payment of \$2.00.

Any person may become an Associate Member of the Association, for the current year upon payment of the sum of 1.00, and shall have the privilege of taking part in the annual matches, but shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Association.

3. Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association or of a prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life Members of the Association, they having the full rights and privileges of ordinary members, and their names to be published in the Annual Reports.

Donors of money or prizes in kind of Five Dollars value and upwards, but less than Forty Dollars, shall be entitled to be enrolled as members for the year in which they contribute to the Prize Fund, with rights and privileges of membership.

4. Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$25.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$12.00 annually, to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it. Each Affiliating Association shall be entitled to receive a Silver Medal for competition by its *bona fide* members. The winner of such medal, being an efficient member of the Active Militia, or an officer retired retaining rank, to be entitled to compete free of entrance fee in the "Dominion of Canada" and "Affiliated Association" matches at the first Prize Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, at which he is present after he wins the medal; provided always that the name of the winner and details of the matches at whicb it is won shall have been communicated to the Secretary of the D. C. Rifle Association not later than the first day of such prize meeting.

5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons, to be named by the Council.

The Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

6. There shall be a President, to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

7. There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, to be elected in the same manner as the President.

8. There shall be a Council of members of the Association, who shall be elected in the following proportions :

one half in each to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Dominion Association, the other half by the Provincial Associations of the respective Provinces at their Annual Meeting; the names of those elected by the Provincial Associations, to be notified to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association on or before the day of the Annual Business Meeting each year. Six members of the Council shall form a quorum.

9. The Council shall at its first meeting choose from its own members the Chairman of the Council.

10. The Council shall annually elect at its first meeting an Executive Committee, consisting of fifteen (15) of its members, and in the event of a vacancy occuring therein during its term of office, the same may be filled up by the Executive Committee from the members of the Council. Five (5) to be a quorum. The President of the Association and Chairman of the Council shall be *ex-officio* members of the Executive Committee.

11. The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with the Association, and the Deputy Adjutants-General commanding districts, *being members* of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.

12. There shall be a Treasurer and a Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure, who shall receive such compensation for their services as may be voted by the Council.

13. The Council shall have the arrangement of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

14. The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instructions

as the Council may from time to time order, respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.

15. The Council may from time to time make such rules for their guidance as they deem necessary.

16. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held in Ottawa, at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee, as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council; and such Prize Meeting of the Association shall be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by the Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other members of the Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision, or the decision of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding; but they, or a majority of them, may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

17. An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the Finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary under the direction of the Council, and shall be published and sent to members of the Association at least one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting.

18. The Annual Business Meeting of the Members of the Association for the Election of Officers and the Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Ottawa, on the third Wednesday after the assembling of the General Session of Parliament of the Dominion. At the close of such Annual Meeting or adjournment thereof the Association year will terminate.

19. A General Meeting shall be held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the discussion of all matters that may be brought forward by any members or competitors attending the matches, but no changes in the Constitution shall be made except at the Annual Business Meeting.

20. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made except by a

resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting, or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all members of the Association of such proposed amendments.

21. The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy occasioned by death or resignation in their number, from among the members of the Association.



### GENERAL BY-LAWS OF THE ASSOCIATION

### ADOPTED AT

### ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. Meetings of The first of which shall be held immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second, on the first day of the Annual Prize Meeting.

Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Extraordinary Secretary, if required by the Chairman, or by any four of the Members of the Council, at such place as the Chairman may direct—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least fifteen days previous to such Meeting and the requisition for the Meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meetings.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at The Council to all Meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for all proceedings. that purpose by the Secretary, and open to inspection of any Member of the Council.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of Finance Comthree members of the Council, to be chosen at the first meeting.

The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such Treasurer to deposit sums rechartered bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all ceived in Savings sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association. Expenditure of sums for current expenses.

All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the signature of the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or in his absence, by some one of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Expenditure of a general nature. Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

Annual accounts A detailed statement of all receipts and expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer, made up to and closed on the 30th November.
