As the vessel was down, no communication could be had.

The police were immediately despatched on land. On their arrival they found the whole neighborhood lit up and that Wreck Commissioner Evans had sworn in a dozen special constables. He was in charge and had steadily done his best to prevent wrecking. He was overpowered by crowds of men who boarded the schooner which they stripped, taking the running rigging and all the cabin gear. They also broke into the cargo taking some tea and wines. On the arrival of the police, the wreckers were dispersed and ordered on shore. The steamer Lady Glover was also despatched to the scene of wreck with police at ten o'clock. The steamer Iceland followed in the morning. Immediately after arrival they commenced transferring the cargo from the vessel by boats to the steamers. London, May 7.—The ratification of the Behring sea arbitration agreement and modus vivendi convention was arranged between Great Britain and the United States to-day.

Dublin, 7.—Edward O'Brien, who was recently released from Mountjoy Prison, is dead.

Dunbar, 7.—A sensation has been caused here by the suicide of Victor Jaegersten, chief member of a noted Commission firm, and the attempted suicide of his brother. They left home together Thursday and did not return. Last night they were found in the Thiergarten. Victor was dead, having shot himself with a revolver. His brother had attempted to hang himself but the rope, part of which was attached to the limb of a tree, had broken. He was partly unconscious, however, and was at once removed to the Moshil Hospital where his condition was pronounced critical. No reason for the acts of the brothers is known. Their affairs were supposed to be in a most prosperous condition.

Potatoes at Potsdam.

LONDON, May 7.—The new palace in Potsdam is being partially overhauled by upholsterers and decorators preparatory to the reception of four or five of the high crowned heads of Europe this season. The most significant visit will be made by the Czar, either immediately before or immediately after the Danish golden wedding. It is not expected that the Czarina will accompany him as her arduous journey is expected to take place in June and she will hardly be able to endure the excitement of the court festivities during the visit. German Chauvinists are rejoicing in the fact that the Czar is swinging away from his French ally, and they assert that the complete isolation of France, begun by the Zollverein treaties, is about to be completed by the betrothal of the Emperor's youngest sister, the Princess Margarete, to the Czarowitch. The Princess Margarete is an attractive girl of twenty years, of fine form and pleasing face. The Emperor has held her in reserve for the last three years as a winning card in his political game. A short time ago he planned to marry her to Prince William, heir to the Luxembourg throne, hoping thereby to gain eventually possession of the Duchy and its fine strategic position, from which an entrance could be effected into Belgium in case of war with France. Redistribution
