Laying the Corner Stone.

We observe that the City Council, at its last meeting, passed a resolution inviting the Masonic fraternity to lay the corner stone of the new city building, on the first day of July next.

Without doubt the most important legislative measures which have engaged the attention of the present Dominion Parliament are those which were introduced last week, relative to the reorganization of the departments of Government.

It is a humiliating spectacle, to say the least, to behold our chief magistrate rudely pushed aside and debarred from discharging a public duty which devolves upon him in virtue of his office, by any society not representative of the community in general.

THE DOMINION PARLIAMENT.

The time of the House on Monday, the 19th inst., was occupied in discussing Mr. Janssen's prohibition motion. Two amendments to the main motion were made, one making some changes in the Bill, and the other referring the Act altogether. The main motion and both amendments were defeated on division.

The supplementary estimates for the year 1885 were laid on the table of the House on Monday. The total amount estimated for is \$1,566,950, of which \$383,946 is chargeable to capital account.

Under the second general head, territorial account, the sum of \$224,754 is estimated for, of which \$513,000 is to be paid to the provinces.

Under the third general head, consolidation fund, the sum is \$1,048,226. Of this amount \$1,700,000 is for New Brunswick, \$1,000,000 for Ontario, \$1,000,000 for Quebec, \$1,000,000 for Nova Scotia, and \$1,000,000 for the Maritime Provinces.
