A LITTLE HISTORY.

There are a great many issues of stamps which have a history unknown to the average stamp collector. It is very interesting indeed to know the cause or reason why such and such an issue was brought into use, and singe there have been a large number of what are to the uninterested, encalled for changes in the issues of the stamps of Canada since their first appearance in 1850, I shall in this short article endeavor to give a list of reasons for the most prominent issues and varieties.

The 12 pence was issued to prepay letter postage to Great Britian but was in use only for a short time when the postal rates were greatly reduced, and the 6 pence sterling stamp was put into use, This value being a British denomination was equal to 714 pence in Canadion currency, a shilling being equivelent to one shilling and three pence of Canadian currency.

These early issues (1851-57) are records of the transition state of the monetary systems of the then Province of Canada, the stamps in many instances showing the deceimal as well as the old currency. At this time if the letters were sent through the United States the postage was 8 pence sterling or to pence Canadian currency, which was cause for issue of the last mentioned denomination in 1855. A year or so latter, the rates for postage to Great Britian, not changed, the 716d green stamp was introduced.

When the deceimal currency (dollars

and cents) were adopted the 6 pence sterling-71/2 pence correctly, was changed to 121/2 cents (1859) green. The 8 pence sterling - 10 pence carreacy -was represented by the 17 cent (1859) blue, it was in this year the monetary denominations were all changed.

In 1862 during the course of the civil war in the United States, some trouble arose between that country and Great Britain which required the presence of British troops in the Province of Canada, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, for a very uncertain length of time, and as these troops were brought from the British Isles, where it was customary always to allow soldiers' letters to go or come, to or from any part of the world at the rate of one penny per half ounce; the previledge was demanded by the two or three thousand men sent here. The various Governments decided as they none of them had a stamp of the denomination required-two cents-new dies should be obtained, which very soon resulted in the issue of the 2 cent of the respective Provinces. Strange as it may seem not one hundredth part of these stamps which were issued specially for the purpose were used as letter postage, the soldiers prefering to use the 5 cent stamp which contained a representation of the emblem of Canada, the beaver. This was a rather strange affair as they had to pay five cents in cash for that stamp, as only the a cent was kept at the regimental postoffices; but maybe they took a fancy for the beaver.

The stamps of the Prince Edward Island to many seem to be odd in denomi-. nation; but the fact that the currency not only differed from that of Great Britian but also from the rest of Canada as it were; the shilling of the island province was only worth about 8 pence sterling, and in the decimal currency issues the denomination had to be higher to be on a par value with the other provinces.

The shilling of Nova Scotia, commonly known as the Halifax shilling as also the Halifax currency, was only equal to 20 cents Canada or 10 pence British, New . Brunswick being so near Nova Scotia used the monetary values, mostly altogether of the latter.

STOLEN STAMPS.

The residence of Chas. A. Needham, of Hamilton, Ont., was burglarized during his absence on one of his trips. Toronto detectives called on all the dealers here telling them to be on the lookout for the goods. Among those stolen were 500 foc violet 1859, 6003 5c beavers, 2000 1c pinks 1859, 2000 3, 4, 5, 6, 8 and 10c Columbians, and about 25000 stamps in stock books. The value is not given, and dealers everywhere are requested to keep their eyes open for the goods. We will give further particulars next week.

The 5 cent 1875 issue of Canada was caused not to take the place of the 5 cent 1860, which was used as prepayment to letters only in the province, but as rates per half ounce to Great Britain.

NOVA SCOTIA REMAINDERS.

The story of the Nova Scotta Remainders is the philatelic question of the day. We make no apology, therefore, for reproducing in Mr. Phillips own words from the Monthly Journal, what must be considered to be the only authentic account of an incident which has created the greatest stir of late in stamp circles.

We shall now endeavour, as far as lies in our power, to relate all the facts in reference to the lot of remainders of these stamps, that we have been for some weeks supplying to the trade.

We should have published some particulars before this, but we are not the only persons interested, and we have had to correspond with Mr. Bartlett in Prince Edward's Island, which necessarily took up much time; and even now we cannot give as many details as we should wish.

The first imtimation we had, of the existance of any remainder of the cents issue of Nova Scotia, was on May 14th last, when we received the following cablegram from the Hon. W. S. Fielding, then Premier and Principal Secretary of Nova Scotia, but since advanced to the important position of Finance Minister of the Dominion of Canada:

"For what quantity Nova Scotia stamps of cents issue will you give face value? Our Government guarantee them to be remainders.—FIELDING, Premier."

The same day we replied by cable as follows:

"State quantity of each value; we probably take all. The lot must not be broken, or market will be spoiled,—Gibbons."

On May 15th we received a reply cable from the Premier:

"Denominations one, two, eight and a half, ten, and twelve and a half. You might offer for each denomination, with your own limits; if offer satisfactory, will close for whole—Fielding, Premier"

On the same, or following day we cabled again as follows:

"Cable quantity of each value; our offer cannot be made until this is known.—Gibbons,"

No answer was received to this last cable, and the next information we had was that the catire stock of remainders had been purchased by Messrs. A. A. Bartlett, of Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, and Mr. Donald A. King, of Halifax, Nova Scotia, both well known philatelists of many years' standing

We at once opened negotiations, with Messrs. Bactlett and King, to see if a business arrangement could not be entered into, for us to have the sole sale of these stamps for certain districts, and eventually we secured the sole right of sale in Europe, Asia, Africa, and Australia,

The following certificate was given with the stamps:-

"Halifax, N.S.,
"June 4th, 1896.

"A. A. Bartlett, Esq.

"Dear Sir,—For the information of all whom it may concern, I desire to say that, acting for the Government of Nova Scotia, I have sold and delivered to you the remainder of the cents issue of Nova Scotia postage stamps, and that no other stamps of that issue are in the possession of this Government.

"Yours faithfully, "W S, FIELDING,

" Provincial Secretary."

As soon as we received a supply of the stamps, we prepared the following circular, for issue to the trade renerally in the countries we represent.

"NOVA SCOTIA.

"GOVERNMENT REMAINDERS OF THE CENT INSUE.

"The Government of Canada, through the Premier of Nova Scotia, the Hon. W. S. Fielding, has just sold the whole remainder of the Cent Issue of that Colony to a strong syndicate of stamp dealers; and the entire sales of these stamps for the whole of Europe, Asia, Africa, and Australia, have been placed in the hands of STANLEY GIBBONS LIMITED.

"The stamps have been carefully sorted, and divided pro rata into three classes, to be sold respectively at £12 10s, £51 10s, and £103, net cash with order.

"The prices are guaranteed, and no lot will be obtainable for a less sum than that quoted. As soon as a certain number are sold, the price will be advanged.

"The stamps are all guaranteed GENUINE ORIGINALS, and all have the full gum.

"STANLEY GIBBONS, LIMITED, "801, STRAND, LONDON, W C."

We arranged that this circular should be posted on the last day of August, and no lot was delivered until September 1st, when Messrs, W. H. Peckitt, Buhl & Co, Limited, Richard Senf, etc, etc., had their lots either delivered or posted to them. Unfortunately, owing to delay in procuring the electros of the stamps for the heading of the circular, the issue of this was delayed a few days, and hence the fuss some of the small dealers have kicked up about lots having been offered at so many different prices prior to the issue of our circular.

No lot has been, or will be, sold by us for less than the sum stated in the circular; but it will be noticed that the parchaser of a lot for £103 may, if he thinks fit to work at a very close profit, retail our No. 1 lot at a less price than we have fixed as our minimum. For this reason, we propose to discontinue to supply No. 1 lot at £12 10s, and in future we shall only execute orders for the lots at £51 10s and £103.

We further hereby give notice that from January 1st, 1897, the prices of these loss will be advanced to £60 and £120 respectively.

Among the lot it is reported that a clerk found a strip of 3 12d Canada in a cancelled state.

This is the season of the year that the collector thinks he ought to buy good stamps, but hesitates. It will quickly be followed by the season wherein the collector kicks himself for hesitating.

It is thought that a special stamp will be issued by the United States for the use of carriers and railways, who, by a recent order of the Post Office Department have to pay postage on their own letters, etc., even though carried by their own men and rolling stock.
