MOTHER AND CHILDREN DEAD. Asphyxiated by Gas in a New York Hotel. FIVE LIVES WERE SACRIFICED.

Apparently it Was a Deliberate Case of Murder and Suicide. The Children Were Put to Bed and Allowed to Go to Sleep—Then All the Apertures of the Room Were Stopped and the Gas Turned Full on by the Mother, Who Lay Down and Died With Her Offspring—Husband and Father Distracted.

New York, Oct. 1.—Mrs. Caroline Reardon, who lives in the West Shore Hotel, 42nd-street and 11th-avenue, Asphyxiated by gas was the cause of death. It is believed the mother waited until the children were asleep, then closed all apertures and turned on the gas from a two jobs. Mrs. Reardon appeared to be about 40 years old.

Retired to Their Rooms. After supper the family retired to their rooms. It must have been about 9 o'clock when they left the dining room. About 8 o'clock this morning a chambermaid detected the odor of gas in the hallway.

The night that met Clerk Sprague's eyes was horrible in the extreme. In one of the rooms the woman and the child were interlocked about each other's necks. The features of the little girl were distorted with agony.

The police were sent for and ambulances from Roosevelt Hospital. The physicians worked over them for nearly two hours, but in vain. The preparations for the murder and suicide were most deliberate.

There is considerable doubt about the name and address she gave. Aside from the truthfulness in the trunk-barely sufficient for a two days' supply for a family of five—the woman had but few effects.

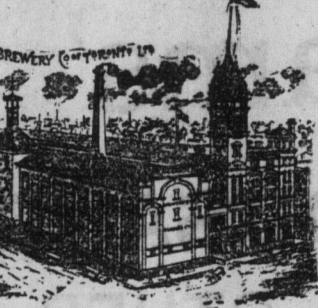
