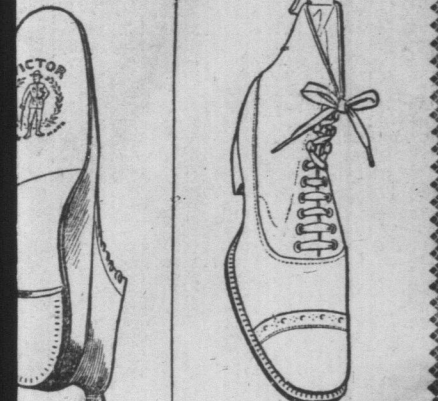

FATHER FALLON IN BUFFALO. Spoke Only a Few Words Asking Help of Parishioners in His Work.

Buffalo, July 1.—Holy Angela's parish of this city, at Porter and West-avenues, greeted its new pastor, the Rev. Michael Francis Fallon, D.D., yesterday. Dr. Fallon introduced himself to his new parishioners at 9:30 o'clock mass.

"I appear before you today for the first time, as your parish priest," he said, "and if I were not a Catholic priest and you a Catholic people I would say that I was a stranger. But I know I have come among friends, and am entirely unacquainted with the circumstances and needs of you and your parish, and I ask you to bear with me patiently while I learn what I have to do."

SWISS LEAD THE WORLD. Greater Amount of Foreign Capital Per Inhabitant Than Any Other Country.

Washington, July 1.—One of the most interesting extracts from the volume entitled "Commercial Relations of the United States for 1900" was made public today by Mr. Frederick Bremer, chief of the Bureau of Foreign Commerce, State Department, dealing with United States trade in Switzerland. Consul Gifford, stationed at Basle, says that Switzerland's trade figures are especially noteworthy as showing that this distinctive republic, which is about half as large as the State of Maine, and which would be swallowed up in Texas, is commercially the most highly developed part of the world.

Not even industrial Holland, of Belgium, says the Consul, can display the astonishing figure of \$100,000,000 of commerce for every unit of the population of barely three millions reached by Switzerland. These remarkable figures are based on statistics by a country without seaward frontiers, and in fact without any considerable quantity of raw material for the manufacture of its raw to sell.

According to the statistics at Asau, Switzerland is almost wholly dependent upon the outside world for her well-being. She produces only a few articles, such as cheese, wine, and silk, and more than 90 per cent of her raw material is imported. Of the nations trading with Switzerland, Mr. Bremer says that the United States is far in the lead, the United States standing fifth in rank. Our trade with Switzerland has not been growing of late, a decline being noted in our export of food products. Our manufactured goods, however, have shown an increase, our bicycles and dried fruits particularly outstripping other foreign articles in the little republic.

Our sales in Switzerland, according to Consul Gifford, are much more important than are commonly supposed, amounting in some years to \$100,000,000. The Consul notes that since the termination of the commercial treaty between the United States and Switzerland in last November, American goods have been subjected to the general tariff of Switzerland, he says, however, that the new tariff does not seriously affect our trade as a whole, although the rates on shoes, bicycles and iron manufactures, flour and dried fruits have advanced, and in some cases doubled.

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STRIKE AGAINST U.S. STEEL TRUST WILL BE FORMIDABLE IN AUGUST

Schwab Spoken of as Likely to Act as a Mediator—Shaffer Will Have at His Nod and Beck 35,000 Workmen at the Outset.

Pittsburg, July 1.—As a result of the refusal of the representatives of the American Sheet Steel Company and the American Steel Hoop Company, subsidiary companies of the great United States Steel Corporation, to sign the workers' new scale at Saturday's conference, circulars were sent out from the national headquarters of the Amalgamated Association of Iron, Steel and Tin Workers yesterday and today, declaring a strike at all the plants of the two combines. The great strike is now on, but it will be several days before its actual extent is known. At the outset, however, over 35,000 men will be involved.

Three Non-Union Plants. The American Steel Hoop Company's main offices are in this city. The company has three non-union plants in this city. They are Palmer's Mills on the South side and Lindsay & MacIntosh's and Clarke's, located in Allegheny. The company has also a non-union plant at Monaca and one at Dunbarville, the employees of the latter are ready for organization as soon as the Amalgamated people will take them in. The other plants of the company are claimed by the Amalgamated Association, and a strike in these plants would be a serious blow to the company.

What the Strike Will Eventuate. The United States Steel Corporation is expected to be a strong force in the management of any company in which stock is held by the Amalgamated Association.
