Bomb Thrown Dead.

Lods, Russian Poland, April 3.—The would-be assassin of police commissioner Stanokovic, of the second district, (who was seriously injured Saturday by a bomb which was thrown at him in the street) is dead. He never regained consciousness after being shot down by the policeman who arrested him. Considerable excitement was caused at midnight by two Cosacs, who attacked four pedestrians, killing two and wounding the others. The governor-general has prohibited the sale of revolvers. The gun-dealers have been ordered to enclose all revolvers in sealed cases and to hand them over to the police.

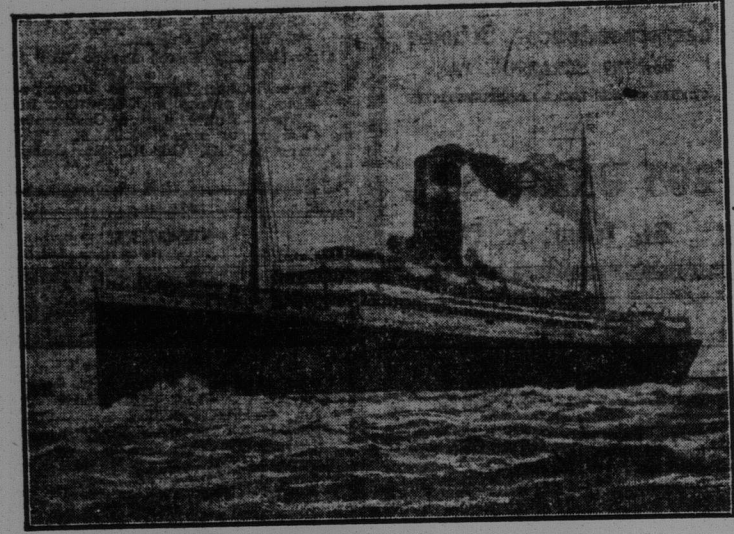

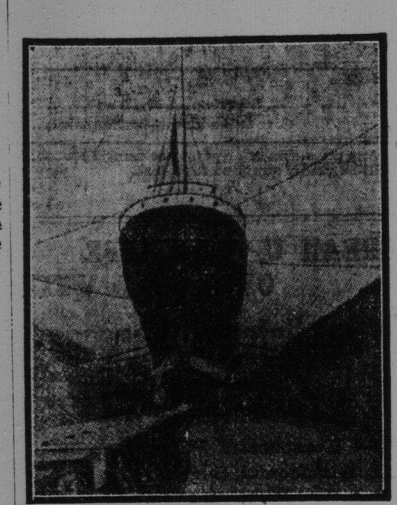

LEGISLATURE.

A Good Deal of Progress Made on Saturday.

The Factory Act to Be Further Considered Tomorrow—Act Relating to Schools Agreed to.

Fredericton, April 1.—The house met at 8 o'clock. Mr. Allan presented the petition of U. Benson Armstrong, in favor of his auto road bill. Mr. Robertson, the petition of the city of St. John, for a bill to remove doubts as to the harbour of St. John. Hon. Mr. Jones introduced a bill to amend the acts incorporating the town of Woodstock.

provided for proper sanitary arrangements, the safety of employees, the hours of labor. It also provides that one or more inspectors should be appointed. He thought that one would be sufficient. The fact of the act being on the statute book would have a good effect. The bill was the result of the most careful inquiry and the taking of much evidence on the part of the commissioners. They had carefully guarded it, so that it would not interfere with the great industries of the province.

The bill in addition to and in amendment of the school act, was then taken up. Mr. Fleming thought that there might be a provision which would enable them to have more superior schools. He would suggest that the number of persons required for a superior school in taking account of the population of a county, should be reduced from 6,000 to 4,000.

Hon. Mr. Pugsley agreed with the honorable member, that the number of superior schools should be increased, and promised that the matter would receive careful consideration during the recess. The bill provides for scholarships for teachers taking a course of manual training and nature study, and also for the consolidation of school districts to the number of these or more. Large powers are given to the trustees, where they desire to rebuild a school house.

Mr. Hasen said there was a number of bills now before the house to borrow money. What would be the policy of the government in regard to these bills? Would they be passed, or would these trustees have to do their work over again by making an application to the chief superintendent. Hon. Mr. Pugsley said the bill would cover almost every possible case.

After some discussion on the subject of trustee boards borrowing money, the bill passed and the house adjourned.
