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SYNOPSIS.

PROCEEDING: OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, 4th JUNE, 1856.

The Annual General Meeting of the Board of Trustees of Queen's College, was held this day.

The Rev. Rob. Burnet, of Hamilton, was unanimously elected a Trustee in room of the late Rev. Dr. McGill.

The Hon. John Hamilton was unanimously re-elected Chairman for the ensuing year.

The Meeting then adjourned to such day as the Chairman could be present.

Queen's College, }
3rd July, 1856.

The Board of Trustees met this day.

The proceedings of the Executive Committee for the past year were sustained and approved.

The re-election of the following lay Trustees, who had retired by rotation, according to terms of the Royal Charter, was reported.

John Cameron, Esquire,
John Mowat, Esquire,
F. A. Harper, Esquire,
John Thompson, Esquire.

The following gentlemen, selected according to terms of the Royal Charter, from a list nominated by the various congregations, were reported to have been elected by the lay Trustees, to fill vacancies in the Board:

ALEX. McLean, Esquire, Cornwall. Dr. Livingston, Russeltown.

The Secretary was directed to inform these gentlemen of their election, and to place their names upon the Roll of

Trustees, as required by the Royal Charter.

An anonymous letter, signed "A Son of Alma Mater," and written by Mr.H.J.Borthwick, Head Master of Queen's College Preparatory School, having been referred to the Board of Trustees by the Executive Committee, it was resolved that a Special Meeting for consideration of the matter should be held on Thursday, the 10th instant .-The Secretary was directed to intimate this to Mr. Borthwick, and to inform him that any statements which he might have to present, would then be received in writing.

Application having been received from the Rev. Professor Smith for re-payment of the sum of £29 5s. Stg., being expenses incurred in travelling to London on College business, it was resolved that this amount should be repaid

to him.

It was further resolved, that the Trustees would not at present remit any money to the Rev. Prof. Smith for the purchase of books for the College Library, it being deemed advisable that the selection of such books should be left to the Senatus Academicus.

In reply to the Rev. Prof. Smith's application, it was further resolved that one-half of his salary for the past year,

should be paid to him.

The Rev. Dr. George having during the past year undertaken the Class in Church History for the Rev. Prof. Smith, and having also discharged the duties of Principal of the College, it was resolved that the sum of One Hundred Pounds should be paid to him, as remuneration for such extra services.

The Trustees then considered the subject of making some adequate remuneration to the Rev. Dr. Machar, who had, during the past year, conducted the Hebrew Classes of

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the Rev. Prof. Smith. Dr. Machar being present, respectfully submitted, that in undertaking the Hebrew Classes, he had determined not to accept any salary for teaching them, and that he now abode by that determination. But if the Trustees should see fit to record their approbation of his services by presenting him with a suitable book, it would be highly gratifying to him to receive from them such a memorial of the manner in which he had discharged the duty which he had undertaken at their solicitation.

It was then unanimously resolved that a copy of WALTON'S POLYGLOT BIBLE, with Castell's Lexicon, should be presented to Dr. Machar by the Trustees, as a Testimonial expressive of their appreciation of the value of his services to the College, and to the Young Men com-

posing the Hebrew Classes.

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It was resolved that the sum of Five Pounds should be placed at the disposal of the Rev. Dr. Williamson, to be

expended on Philosophical apparatus.

The Secretary was directed to write to the Rev. Dr. Fowler, of Ratho, Convenor of the Colonial Committee of the Church of Scotland, in reference to the annual grant to the College.

> QUEEN'S COLLEGE, 10th July, 1856.

The Secretary reported that he had communicated the resolution of last meeting to Mr. H. J. Borthwick, Head Master of the Preparatory School, and read a letter in reply, in which Mr. Borthwick stated that he considered himself no longer answerable to the Board for the opinions contained in the anonymous letter.

It was then unanimously resolved that the Secretary be directed to inform Mr. Borthwick, that the Trustees would have no further occasion for his services after the

close of the current year, ending 30th September.

It was further resolved that the Secretary should advertise in four leading papers for a Head Master for Queen's College School, applications and testimonials to

be sent in before 10th September next.

It was decided that steps should be taken to procure legal opinions as to the possibility of College Funds being at any time alienated to the use of the Medical Faculty.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, 15th October, 1856. 3 P.M.

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A General Meeting of the Trustees of Queen's College, specially called in accordance with the Royal Charter, was

held this day.

A letter from Mr. H. J. Borthwick, formerly Head Master of Queen's College School, having been laid before the meeting, it was resolved that Mr. Borthwick should be informed, that, as his case had been decided at an adjourned General Meeting of the Trustees, at which a letter was read from him declining to recognise their jurisdiction, this Board cannot now enter upon it.

There not being a sufficient number of Trustees present to proceed to the election of a Professor to fill the vacant chair, the meeting was adjourned to the evening at

8 o'clock.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, 15th October, 1856, 8 P.M.

An adjourned Meeting was held this evening.
On motion of the Rev. Dr. Urquhart, seconded by the
Rev. Dr. Machar, it was resolved that this meeting should
adjourn to Wednesday, the 19th November next, and that
in the meantime an urgent letter should be addressed to all
of the Trustees, strongly pressing upon them the necessity
for a full attendance.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, 19th November, 1856.

An adjourned General Meeting was held this day. The appointment of a Professor to fill the vacant Chair of Oriential Languages, Church History and Biblical Criticism, having been brought before the Meeting, it was

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Resolved—That inasmuch as no definite time had been stated by the Board for receiving applications to fill this Chair, the Board agree to publish in one or more papers in Edinburgh, Glasgow, Aberdeen and St. Andrew's, in Scotland, and in the newspapers of Montreal, Quebec, Kingston and Toronto, that applications will be received up to the 1st May, 1857; also, that the following be a Committee to carry out the above, the Hon. John Hamilton, the Rev. Dr. Machar, the Rev. Dr. George and the Rev. Dr. Williamson.

It was moved by Mr. Mowat, seconded by Mr. Drum-

mond, and

Resolved—That the Minute of the Board of Trustees, dated 20th June, 1855, appointing Medical Professors in this University, be confirmed. Dr. Machar, Dr. George and Mr. Malloch, dissented from this motion.

The Meeting then adjourned to next morning.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, 20th Nov., 1856, 9½ A.M.

An adjourned General Meeting was held this morning. The minutes of last Meeting were read and adopted. After conversation and the interchange of opinions on subjects connected with the College, the Meeting adjourned sine die.

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SYNOPSIS.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, 26th May, 1856.

A Special Meeting of the Executive Committee was

held this day in the usual place.

An anonymous letter signed "A Son of Alma Mater," was laid upon the table by the Rev. Dr. George, copies of which, it appeared, had been sent to each member of the Board of Trustees, as well as the Ministers of the Church. Mr. H. J. Borthwick, Head master of Queen's College Preparatory School, having been called in, stated in reply to the questions of the Chairman, that he was the author of the letter; and further, that he was not at liberty to mention from whom he had received the information upon which the charges contained in the letter were grounded. Mr. Borthwick was then informed by the Chairman, that the letter would be laid before the General Meeting of Trustees, and also before the Synod.

The Committee appointed at last meeting to lay the Financial position of the College before the Synod, were charged with the refutation of Mr. Borthwick's letter.

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QUEEN'S COLLEGE, 5th August, 1 56.

A Special Meeting was appointed to be hold on Monday, the 18th inst., for the purpose of con idering the applications for the office of Head Master of Queen's College School, and filling the vacancy.

The Medical Faculty having applied for encreased accommodation, the matter was referred to the special

meeting on 18th instant.

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QUEEN'S COLLEGE, 18th August, 1856.

A Special Meeting was held this day.

The applications for the vacant office of Head Master of Queen's College School, were laid upon the table, and referred to a sub-committee, consisting of the Rev. Dr. George, the Rev. Dr. Machar, and the Rev. Dr. Williamson. This Committee was requested to report at a Special Meeting of the Executive Committee, to be held on Wednesday the 20th inst., at 3 o'clock.

A sub-committee, consisting of the Rev. Dr. Williamson, Mr. Drummond and Mr. Mowat, were appointed to meet with the Medical Faculty for the purpose of providing such additional accommodation as might be found necessary. This sub-committee were requested to inform the Medical Faculty that the Trustees were willing to grant a site upon the College grounds for the erection of a building to accommodate the Medical Department, and the Trustees therefore expected that they would not occupy their present rooms more than one session. The sub-committee were further required to intimate the understanding that the Medical Faculty should pay a proportionate rent for the rooms to be granted to them.

A special Donation in aid of the Building Fund was stated to have been received from Colin Miller, Esq.,

which the Secretary was directed to acknowledge with the thanks of the Trustees.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, 20th August, 1856.

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A Special Meeting was held this day.

The sub-Committee appointed at last meeting to consider the applications for the office of Head Master of Queen's College School, presented their report.

Mr. Robert Campbell was then elected to fill the vacant office, and the Secretary directed to write to him accordingly.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, 9th September, 1856.

A letter was read from Simon S. Laurie, Esq., Secretary to the Colonial Committee of the Church of Scotland, authorizing the Trustees to draw for the annual grant of £300 Stg., together with £35 Stg., in aid of the Bursary Fund. The Treasurer reported that the above sums had been drawn for, as authorized.

Application having been received from the Rev. Dr. George for an increase of salary during the ensuing year, in consideration of the extra duties devolving upon him as Vice-Principal, and Professor of Divinity. In accordance with the above application, an addition of £100 Cy., per annum was made to the Rev. Dr. George's salary, so long as he may be called upon to perform the extra duties refered to.

The Rev. Dr. Machar, having laid upon the table a letter from the Rev. Dr. Barclay, communicating the sudden and lamented death of the Rev. Prof. Smith, Professor of

Oriental Languages, Church History and Biblical Criticism in this University, which took place at Gairlochead, in Scotland, on the 8th ultimo. The Chairman was unanimously requested by the Trustees present to call a General Meeting of the Trustees of Queen's College, to be held in accordance with the Royal Charter, in Kingston, on Wednesday the 15th day of October next, for the purpose of taking steps to fill the Chair which had thus been left vacant.

The Secretary was directed to write to the City Council, reminding them that the conditions agreed upon for grading and otherwise improving Arch street, had not

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Messrs. Drummond and Mowat were appointed a subcommittee for the purpose of rectifying the Deed given by the Ven. Archdeacon Stuart for the College Grounds, which Deed contained other lots than those actually sold

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, 7th October, 1856.

On application of Mr. Robert Campbell, Head Master of Queen's College Preparatory School, the sum of £10 was granted for the purchase of Maps and apparatus.

The contemplated arrangements for the accommodation of the Medical Department having been taken into consideration, the Committee expressed the unanimous opinion that no portion of the central building should be given up for this purpose.

The Committee made arrangements for availing them-

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, vissing supering a wolfe 4th Nov'r, 1856.

with the sum of Two Hundred Pounds Currency, the fol-A Circular to Congregations, reminding them of the instalment falling due of the subscriptions in aid of the Building Fund, was approved.

Queen's College, 2nd Dec'r, 1856.

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A Petition was read from Charles Warwick, asking leave to make a drain from the cellar of his house in the rear of Queen's College, to the large natural drain which passes through the College grounds. The Trustees having an arrangement with the Corporation respecting this natural drain, the Petitioner was recommended to apply thro' them.

A letter was read from Mr. H. J. Borthwick, applying to be received as a Student of Divinity. The case of Mr. Borthwick having been referred to the Senatus, and being still in their hands, it was resolved that such application can only be made to them.

The Rev. Dr. Machar stated to the Committee his willingness to undertake the charge of the Hebrew Classes, provided he could obtain that assistance in his other duties which was indispensible.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, 19th December, 1856.

The Committee made arrangements for availing themselves of the services of the Rev. Dr. Machar, and of the Rev. Dr. Urquhart, in carrying on the classes in Church History, Hebrew and Biblical Criticism.

The Ladies' Association of St. Andrew's Church, Toronto, having offered to endow a permanent Bursary with the sum of Two Hundred Pounds Currency, the following resolutions were unanimously adopted:

Resolved—" That the thanks of the Trustees be given " to the Ladies' Association of St. Andrew's Church, in the "City of Toronto, for their zeal and liberality in raising " the sum of Two Hundred Pounds,"-and further resolved, "That the said sum of Two Hundred Pounds be held in "trust for the endowment of a Bursary, to be called, 'The "Bursary of the Ladies' Association of St. Andrew's "Church, Toronto."

For the further securing of the above object, the Chairman was authorized to sign an Indenture as drafted by Oliver Mowat, Esq., of Toronto, and recorded in full on

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An error having been committed in the Deed given by the Ven. Archdeacon Stuart, for the land on which the College Buildings are erected, the Chairman was authorized to sign a Deed, jointly with the Archdeacon, by which the land to be held by the College will be correctly defined and described.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, 3d February, 1857.

It was reported that a Deed had been executed by the Chairman, as authorized in Minutes of 19th December last, properly defining and describing the land occupied by the College and grounds, which Deed is now in the custody of the Treasurer.

A grant of £50 Currency, was made to the Rev. Dr. Urquhart, as a partial remuneration for his kind services in teaching the Church History Class.

The Treasurer was ordered to pay the instalment falling due on the College Buildings.

The Rev. Drs. George and Williamson were requested to draw up the Annual Report to the Colonial Committee.

The Chairman was authorized to sign the usual petitions to the Legislature.

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QUEEN'S COLLEGE, 2d March, 1857.

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The Treasurer reported that the following sums had been received since last Meeting:

St. Andrew's Church Ladies' Association, Toronto, to endow a Bursary,—£200.

On account of Subscriptions in Toronto, per John

Cameron, Esq.,—£252 10s.

The sale of the following lot was confirmed; East ½ lot 40, in the 3rd con. Osgoode; 100 acres, to Peter Ferguson, for the sum of £100. £25 being paid in cash, and the balance in three annual instalments.

The Secretary was directed to make enquiries respecting the title of the Trustees to lot 16, in the 3rd con. of Osgoode, there being some doubt as to whether it can be legally sold.

The taxes upon College lands for 1856, were ordered to

be paid.

The Secretary read the draft of the annual report to the Colonial Committee, which he had prepared at the request of the sub-Committee appointed at last meeting, which report was approved and ordered to be transmitted.

The necessary instructions were given to have £1000 additional Insurance effected on the College Buildings.

The sum of £20 was granted to the Rev. Dr. Williamson, to be expended in apparatus for the Natural Philosophy Class.

Queen's College, 7th April, 1857.

The Chairman reported that the usual Petitions for the annual grant, had been presented to the Governor General, and to the two branches of the Legislature.

The Secretary having reported that considerable difficulty existed in regard to the title to lot 16, in the 3rd con. of Osgoode, Mr. Drummond and the Secretary were appointed a Committee to arrange for the sale of the lot, if possible, with power to take legal advice in the matter.

The Secretary was instructed to take steps for collecting several amounts overdue on Mortgages to the College.

Instructions were given to invest the £200 remitted by the Ladies' Association of St. Andrew's Church, Toronto, in Commercial Bank Stock, as a permanent endowment for a Bursary.

The Treasurer reported that he had effected £1000 additional Insurance on the College Buildings, in the

"Royal," as instructed at last meeting.

The Secretary was directed to ascertain the value of the College lands through the Appraisers of the Trust and Loan Company of Upper Canada.

A letter was laid upon the table from the Rev. Francis Nicoll, of St. John's, Newfoundland, applying for the

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A letter was read from J. W. Cook, Esq., enclosing the sum of £12 10s., from the Sabbath School of St. Andrew's Church, Quebec, as a Bursary.

A letter was read from G. M. Innes, Esq., of the Royal Canadian Rifles, applying for information respecting a Bursary for a son of Quarter Master Harkness, the latter having been killed at the late Railroad accident.

The Secretary was instructed to have drawn up and printed, the Annual Synopsis of the proceedings of the Executive Committee.

The Rev. Dr. George stated that he had again received the sum of £7 stg. from the Student's Missionary Association of the University at Aberdeen. Dr. George also stated that the Rev. David Watson, of Thorah, had promised a Bursary next year.

On application of the Rev. Dr. George, the Executive Committee appropriated the sum of £5 as an additional

"Merit Bursary."

The following appropriations were also made:

To provide Prizes at the close of the Session, £16.

Remuneration to Librarian, £4.

The Rev. Dr. George having reported that several Students had formerly received Bursaries on the understanding that if they did not enter the University they

were to be refunded, but which agreement had not been carried out, the Secretary to the Senatus was directed to write to such parties, demanding restitution of the amounts so paid to them.

The Secretary was directed to make enquiry respecting any books which might have been purchased or collected for the use of the College by the late Rev'd. Prof. Smith.

The Secretary was also directed to ask the authority of the Colonial Committee to draw for the annual Grant.

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The following appropriations were also made:
