## SECOND ANNUAL REPORT.

The interest manifested in the Public Library has continued to increase during the past year, and the steady growth in all its branches is highly gratifying.

The Reading Rooms, which are now regularly supplied with 404 newspapers and periodicals, have at various times been filled to their utmost capacity, and at any hour of the day, during the winter season, it is becoming difficult to secure a vacant chair. Arrangements have just been completed for the railing off of a Ladies' Reading Room, and the necessary periodicals have been ordered for it. The list of periodicals now contains the names of almost all the principal art, scientific, engineering, mining, and manufacturing journals, as well as the leading reviews.

The debates and votes and proceedings of the Senate, House of Commons, and House of Assembly have been regularly placed on the files, during the sittings of the Dominion and Local Legislatures.

By the tabulated forms attached, it will be seen that the issue of books from the Circulating Libraries has grown during the past year to 278,000 volumes, an increase over the previous year, after making allowance for the period when the library was not open in 1884, of 65,000.

The number of those who hold Readers' Tickets has increased from 8,156 in 1884, to 11,844 in 1885.

It is to be regretted that it should have been found necessary to collect the large sum of \$793.16 as fines for overdue books, but this only emphasizes the fact that without such a system of fines as are imposed, it would be almost impossible to depend upon the books being returned within a reasonable time. No less than 10,715 post cards containing notices of books overdue were sent, and 367 visits were paid by special messengers to borrowers who had not responded to the written notices.

The Library, during the year, has received, by purchase, donation and exchange, 3,518 volumes, while 388 have been sold or withdrawn,

leaving a net addition to the Library of 3,180, which now numbers 41,286 bound volumes and pamphlets. Among the additions for the year have been a limited number of books in French and German literature. About 100 parts of the great catalogue of the British Museum have been received, which already amply carries out, so far as it has gone, the anticipations of the museum authorities, and bids fair to be the only practical catalogue of general literature.

During the month of December an arrangement was entered into with the Minister of Education by which the British specifications of patents, numbering 3,036 volumes, were placed in the library, and as a special room is now being prepared for their reception, those, not only of our citizens, but inventors from all parts of Canada, who are interested in patents and inventions, will have every facility for consulting them. The collection of patents which we possess—British, American and Canadian—is now the largest and most complete in the Dominion.

The Central Library was closed from June 1st to 6th for the purpose of cleansing and stock-taking. The examination proved highly satisfactory, only 25 volumes remaining unaccounted for; a surprisingly small number considering the large issue which has taken place.

It is exceedingly gratifying to notice the steady increase in the number of applications for books from the Reference Library, which this year amounts to 11,201. The growing demand for greater facilities for consultation and study, must soon lead to the consideration of a separate room for this purpose. The Card Catalogue has been completed, and placed in the Reading Room; continual additions are being made to it as new books are received.

In October, the Northern Branch Library was examined and checked. Every book was accounted for, and the condition of those on the shelves was exceedingly creditable to the watchfulness of the Librarian in charge.

The Catalogue of the Western Branch is now in the printer's hands, and its issue will, no doubt, result in still greater interest being taken in the library, and an increasing demand for the higher class books which it contains.

During the winter of 1884 the Chief Librarian invited the employees in a number of manufactories in the city to spend the evening in the examination of the more important books in the Reference Library, especially those bearing on their special work. It is impossible

to speak too highly of the kindness with which the invitations were accepted and of the interest taken in the meetings by those present. Among the trades represented were the builders, carpenters, cabinet-makers, iron-moulders, machinists, cutlers, pattern-makers, painters, safe-makers, lithographers, and paper-stainers. A number of the employees of the Great North-Western Telegraph Company also spent an evening in a similar manner.

The question of ventilating the Reading Room has engaged the attention of the Board at intervals during the year, and the services of Alan Macdougal, C.E., have been engaged to investigate and report upon the subject.

Statements of Receipts and Expenditure for the past year on the Appropriation and Debenture Accounts, which were duly audited by the City Auditors, in accordance with the provisions of the "Free Libraries Act," are appended, and also a detailed statement of Assets and Liabilities.

While this report was being prepared, the handsome donation from Mr. Hallam was received, of a complete set of the publications of the Palestine Exploration Society on Western Palestine, consisting of seven volumes, quarto, of memoirs, reports, and name lists, together with the great map, on the scale of one inch to the mile, and a portfolio of plans and elevations of Jerusalem.
