THE SCOTT ACT.

There is to be an election in Fredericton, in the course of a few weeks, with a view to decide as to the continuance of the Canada Temperance Act in that city. We understand that many temperance men seeing the impossibility of the act being carried out are in favor of its repeal while other temperance men, whose zeal is perhaps greater than their wisdom, are preparing to engage in a vigorous campaign in favor of retaining the act. The notable feature about this election is the fact that the temperance men are for the first time divided on the Scott Act question and that many of them, while taking no active part in the agitation against it, will quietly vote for its repeal.




