DARROW TALKS AT **DEPRI CONFERENCE**

WASHINGTON, Dec. -Over one thousand persons packed the John Wesley A.M.E. Zion Church here last Friday to hear Clarence Darrow, noted lawyer of Chicago, address the final meeting of the De-Priest Non-Partisan Conference which convened here last week. Mr. Darrow told his audience that the time had passed when the Negro was the darling of the North and that now the only salvation of the colored man lay in band ing together for their own deliver-

"I think the Negro needn't expect much from the white man. Nowadays the white man has a hard enough time looking after himself even after taking jobs away from the Negro." declared the speaker.

Discusses Politics.

The audience broke forth in applpause a number of times during the lawyer's address. Most of the applause came during his caustic comment on the political situation for the colored voters: "I have voted every ticket except the Republican ticket, said the speaker.

"While I am not going to advise the Negro not to vote the Republican ticket, I do say that there is no reasonable weapon which the Negro can get that he ought not use. The bailot is about the cheapest and most effective weapon the Negro has, and he certainly ought to make full use of

Would Have Negro Keep Politicians Guessing.

Political power is very important thing the Negro ought to do it is to keep politicians guessing. You cannot add to your political power unless they think you will vote independently. While I would not advise any group in America to put themselves first above other interests of good government, I certainly advise the colored people to do so. No other question on earth is so important to Negroes as the question of color. In other words, you have got to make politicians afraid of youand politicians are none too brave.

NEGRO VOTERS SHOW STRENGTH

Remarkable Gain in Power is Shown by Electorate in Campaigns in Various Sections.

DEFEAT PARKER BACKER

Trio Wins in the Cleveland Council manic Race. Fred Moore is Loser in New York.

WASHINGTON, -- Coupled with political backwashes in New York, Boston and Detroit, where Negro voters were instrumental in electing white candidates over their colored opponents, came unprecedented surges of power shown by a Negro electorate thoroughly awakened to the power of the ballot. At least seven Negro candidates for important State and omunicipal office emerged victorious in the off year election. In practically every election the Negro balloting was responsible for the defeat or election of white candidates. This year's collection was marked, not only by a larger Negro registra. tion as well as bp a wonderful display of political individualism on the part of the masses of Negro voters. In Cleveland three of the nine Ne-

In Cleveland three of the nine Negroes seeking places on the city Council were successful. Dr. Leroy N. Bundy and Attorney Lawrence O. Payne were elected from the Third Ward and Attorney Clayborne George from the Fourth Ward. Alexander H. Martin, local attorney, seeking election as municipal judge was defeated. In Cincinnati, Frank A. B. Hall, seeking election to the City Council was elected.

LOS ANGELES, Calif. — Demonstrating an invention which apparently defies the laws of physics, J. H. Montgomery of San Gabriel, Calin his laboratory at 115 W. 7th street sent a dead vulture flying head on into an electricity produced thirty-five mile gale, the bird at times lifting clear of the tracks a four pound carriage to which it was attached.

After twenty years of study of the flight of birds and of the construction of their wings, Mr. Montgomery claims to have discovered what he and his associates hope to establish as a new principle in aviation, which it is believed will revolutionize the science of flying.

"In the wings of every soaring bird is a true power plant, with which the bird has nothing whatever to do further than his ability to control it." Mr. Montgomery said. "Contrary to the prevalent view of scientists, birds do not fly by taking advantage of air currents, but their power to soar is due to the structure of their pinions, which are filled with thousands of vortices which catch the air. In other words, the law of vorter

In other words, the law of vorter and vacuum is the principle which enables the bird to soar. Nature steps in and endeavors to close the vacuum by lifting the bird into it."

According to Montgomery, the same principle by which birds soar, could be applied to a new type of airship which would require no motor, but could be regulated to by at any speed up to 350 miles an hour.





DAUGHTER OF SLAVE SOLD DOWN RIVER

RICHMOND, Va., — Efforts of Maggie A. Devers at LaFayette, Ga., to locate members of her family who may be living here, revealed again the sad facts of family disruption attendant upon the whole slave system before the War of Rebellion. In a letter published here recently, Miss Dever writes:

"My mother, who is dead, was born and reared in Richmond. She often told us children of her life there. She said she was sold in front of the Orange Court House along with two other children. A white man by the name of Tolerver sold her as slave to a white man by the name of Jim Wardlau before the War of Rebellion. She was Mr. Jim's servant and slave till the war. Afterwards she came South. She met and married my father. Well, they had four children.

"I am the only one living. father served in the War of Rebellion. After the war they lived together, then he died. Mother often told us she was separated from her father and mother there. She said her mother's name was Hanna Johnson. She also had some brothers named George, Robert and Phillip; some sisters named Martha and Mary Johnson. I am writing you to ask you if you could find any of the Johnson family or any of the descendents of the Johnson's. If you can I will be glad to find them as mother had no folks and I am lonely without them."

BUSINESS OF NEGRO LAUDED OVER AIR

WASHINGTON, That the recent observance of Education Week was the most wide-spread and most significant since the inauguration of the movement was the opinion of the United States Bureau of Education, following the reports received from various sections of the country.

The highlight was the coast to coast broadcast over the National Broadcasting Company's network of stations of a special program with Dr. Julius Klein, assistant secretary of the Department of Commerce as the principal speaker.

"Education" is satisfying in itself and it will always pay its way. More ample education facilities for our Colored fellow-citizens will prove an eminently worth-while investment from every conceivable business as well as social point of view" concluded Dr. Julius Klein.

"The increase of wealth, productivity and consuming capacity among Negroes," he said, has progressed in the same proportion as their educational advancement. Education of the Negro, "declared he, pays by creating more wants and increasing his purchasing power. Plainly, then, it is the part of wisdom for our business to give careful and persistent thought to the Negro as a potential market.

The future success of business in this Country absolutely requires an increasingly high standard of intelligence in our citizens, and that means, most assuredly a great extension of eduation facilities for Colored people."

He presentedd a statistical picture of the status of the Negro business and gave data on the extent of the Negro Market. He also described the development of the C.M.A. Stores a group of Negro owned groceries sponsored by the National Business League and commented upon the advance in commercial education being made by the Race group, Incidentally, he paid a compliment in connection with the progress of business training to J. A. Jackson of the Department of Commerce Staff whom he described as "Competent" and to whose work he gives great credit.

"With reference to the business possibilities of The Negro he said: "The Negro has proven that with opportunity, he can achieve scccess in almost any business field. And he is eager to know how to fill his place effectively in any of the diverse spheres of industry and trade. In general, he earnestly desires to be equipped to meet the demands that may be made upon him for service to the Nation and the age in which he lives."

Other speakers on the program were H. Council Trenholm, president of the Alabama Teachers College, Dr. Ambrose Caliver of the U.S. Bureau of Education and Dr. G. C. Wilkerson, First Assistant Superintendent of Schools of the District of Columbia.

Music for the occasion was furnished by the Howard University Glee Club under the direction of Prof. Rop W. Tibbs.


MANUFACTURE IN LONDON . . .



It is a point at which raw materials can be assembled quickly and economically and as a distributing centre it has no superior in Canada. The city is served by the Canadian National, Canadian Pacific, the Michigan Central operating its own terminal in London, Pere Marquette and Wabash, the latter three roads operating jointly with the London and Port Stanley Railway, a modern municipally-owned and operated electric road connecting the city with Port Stanley, the largest and best-equipped harbor on the norm shore of Lake Erie. Interswitching facilities on terms very advantageous to shippers exist between all lines entering the city. Lake shipping facilities at Port Stanley include a daily freight and passenger service to Cleveland, by Steamships of the Cleveland-Canada Division of the Cleveland and Buffalo Transit Company. There is also a daily car ferry service between this portand Conneaut Harbor, Ohio. The Canada Steamship Lines, the largest operating on the Great Lakes, and Tree Line freighters, make Port Stanley a regular port of call for east and west bound service.

The city owns and holds for disposal at reasonable cast to manufacturers, large acreage on trackage eminently suitable for industrial purposes.
