Propagation of *Dale Palma*.

The *dale palma*, which forms the wreath of the Arabs of the desert, and one which you have long known to be a tree always before you, like any female; the male tree bearing flowers of the date kind or pollen bearing flowers of the date kind, always grow on a separate tree; and pollen is produced by them in vast quantities; it is not necessary in palm groves to have more than a single male tree some forty or fifty fruit bearing individuals. The Arabs, therefore, never mix their palms from seed, as they cannot take suckers from the root of a female tree, already known to be a good bearer of fine fruit, and these suckers not only follow the sex of the so called mother tree, but she produces in special peculiarities of flower and seed, in every respect. They cannot fail to do so, indeed, so soon as they are part and parcel of the maternal plant, actual members of the same plant; just as the various breeds of all sorts from all bear the same kind of apples, or the bouquets of a currant bush are all the same—some sweet, some tart, some the self same common.—*Fruit and Science Monthly.*
