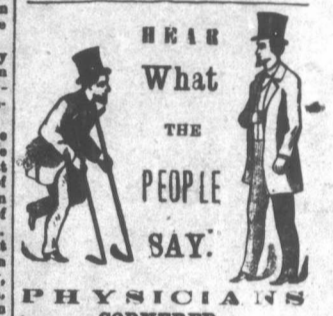

SUDDEN DEATH.

On the 25th inst., Mr. Geo. Higgins, agent of the Canada Company who has resided in Sudborth for some time, dropped dead while preparing to take his tea. Three days previously he had taken a bad turn and Dr. Campbell having been called in, told him that it was heart disease, known to medical men as Angina Pectoris, and cautioned him against all kinds of excitement, and put him under treatment. The next day, however, proved fatal, as he dropped dead almost instantly. The funeral took place Sunday, the 27th, and was a very large one indeed. His remains were taken to Brussels for interment. He leaves a wife behind him, but no children.

By an explosion in a colliery at Biggall, Staffordshire, twenty miners lost their lives. Thirteen bodies have been recovered.

The subscriptions to the New York Tribune fund, for the relief of the sufferers in Kansas and Nebraska so far amounts to \$45,000, and further contributions are daily coming in.

CLINTON ITEMS.

From the New Era.—On Saturday last 43 car loads of grain, amounting to 17,000 bushels, were shipped from this station, valued at \$16,163.00.

Rev. H. Canfield, formerly pastor of St. Paul's Church, Clinton, died at St. Louis, near Montreal, on Friday, the 11th, from diphtheria. Deceased was well and favorable known in this locality, as a gentleman of rare abilities, and an earnest and devoted laborer in the cause of his master.

On Monday last a heavy amount of work in the shape of horse-shoeing was done in the shop of Mr. Thos. Tipling of this town. On that day one hundred and fifty-two shoes were put on and part of them made from the bar, in ten hours. Beat this who can.

One day last week, Mrs. Biddlecombe was out driving, her horse took fright and ran away, Mrs. Biddlecombe was thrown out, but escaped uninjured, and the horse was brought to a stand by running into a ditch and overturning the cutter.

On Friday night a horse and cutter was being driven out of the lane near Joslin's hotel, a little girl named Patterson, who was not looking where she was going, ran up against the horse and the animal reared up, knocking over the child, but very fortunately she received no injury beyond a few scratches.

The youngest daughter of Mr. A. Poole, of this place, aged about 13 years who has suffered from sore eyes for a number of years, was some time since sent to Toronto to undergo medical treatment, which course was pursued for some time, but without much improvement. A few days since it was resolved by the doctors in attendance to remove one eye, with the hope that the other would in a measure be relieved, and the operation was successfully performed, the patient being under the influence of chloroform. The sight of the remaining eye appears to be improved.

The young man named Mitchell, living with a step-brother, John Cole, in Hall's, a few weeks ago, undertook to fix up some young ladies by laying a saddle-girth on their bed, previous to their retiring to rest. He succeeded admirably, one of the young ladies being thrown into violent fits, which she has had on several occasions since. Mr. John Kirk sprained his back while pushing flour barrels at the Station on Friday morning.

VISITOR.

ASHFIELD.

The quarterly examination of S. S. No. 10, was held on Monday, 21st, and was in every respect a decided success. There were seventy-nine pupils and thirty-eight visitors present. The business of the examination commenced at twelve o'clock, noon, and was continued with much interest until late in the evening. The pupils, who have been for the past three years, under the efficient guidance of Mr. S. J. Kilpatrick, acquitted themselves in a very creditable manner indeed, not only in one particular subject, but in each and every branch received by the programme to be taught in our public school. Another thing also attracted my attention, which was the amount of interest and attention evinced by the pupils generally, in fact so much so that their minds seemed to be centered, almost solely on the work before them, and in consequence of such diligence on the part of the pupils and the untiring exertions of Mr. Kilpatrick a very marked change in the state of the school is observable since he came to labor among us; and we shall ever feel grateful to him for the interest exerted in behalf of the young and rising generation. We must say, too, judging by what he has accomplished these three years, that he is in no small degree gifted with that faculty calculated to fill the youthful mind with real ambition and a love to acquire. At the close of the examination the pupils, to express the kind feeling existing between them and their teacher, presented him with a handsome pocketbook containing thirteen dollars, and five elegantly bound books, valued at ten dollars.

The following address accompanied the presentation:—

Dear Teacher.—We, the pupils of this school, in presenting this present, small as it is, express our love and kind regards to you for the interest you have taken in our welfare since you came among us. You have done what will be of incalculable value to us in after life if we only treasure up in the mind those things which you have so diligently endeavored from time to time to impress upon us. You have exerted yourself always to impart that knowledge calculated to fit us for the duties which we may be called upon to perform. You have always governed us by love, and though we disobeyed often, still you over had our love and respect. And now that you are about to leave us we feel our loss much, but trust wherever you go, or in whatever business you engage, the same zeal and affectionate feeling may ever characterize you and that the same respect may be extended to you by those with whom you may associate. We shall ever remember our school days, and though time may work great changes and many ups and downs in life be our lot to experience, yet we shall, with pleasure, look back to the time when we attended your school. And may he who governs all things ever guide and guard us aright.

During the reading of a solemn feeling which arose from the cheering heart within, told that the party was bitterly regretted Mr. Kilpatrick made some very appropriate remarks in return for the favors he had received, and as the parting time had come, one thing afforded much consolation, that it was possible that all might again meet where parting is unknown. Several visitors made approving remarks for the manner in which the school had been conducted by its present teacher, Mr. R. Treloven, and the closing speech, which was very appropriate. This section deserves credit for the ample school accommodations they have provided.

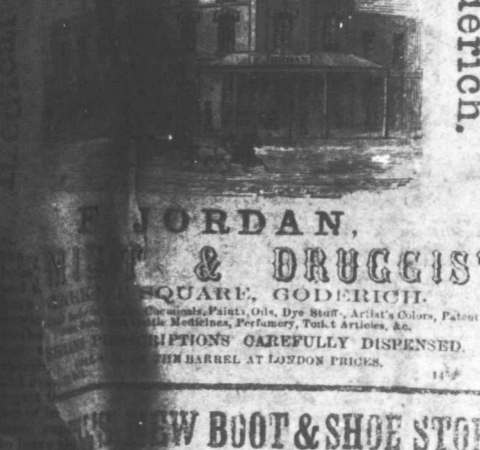
