AWAITING THE ATTACK

Spain Presents Her Case to the World in Vigorous Words.

CLAIMS TO HAVE RIGHT ON HER SIDE

Also Correct Procedure and Prudence—The "Execrable Conduct" of General Fitzhugh Lee—Cuba Will Not Be Declared Pacified Until It is Ready for Annexation—Spaniards Will Sell Their Lives Dearly—Reported Repulse of American Torpedo Boats.

Madrid, April 26.—The Spanish Government today sent a circular to the powers, supplementing its circular of April 18, and expressing regret at the "hard necessity of being compelled to appeal to force in order to repel the scandalous aggression of the United States and defend the national dignity and historical integrity of the fatherland."

Continuing the circular note says: "History presents few instances where in the reason is so evident on one part and the outrage so undisguised on the other. Spain has on her side right, correct procedure and prudence, while the United States has on her side only disloyalty and the impulse of unbridled ambition."

After a reference to the "execrable conduct" of Gen. Fitzhugh Lee, the note reproduces the text of the resolutions of Congress, underlining the last words, "As intended to deceive the Cubans."

It is then predicted that the Island of Cuba will not be declared pacified until it is ready for annexation. Further, the note gives the details of the rupture of the negotiations between Spain and the United States, concluding with the following declaration: "The Spanish people await the attack with tranquil serenity, decided to sell their lives dearly, and to defend energetically their right to remain in America, confident that in this work they will have the assistance of the Cubans who are Spaniards like themselves."

INTERFERENCE WITH CABLES.

Mr. Balfour Would the British Government He Would Not Deny the Right to Cut the Cables.

London, April 26.—Mr. Balfour, replying in the House of Commons today to questions on the subject, said he had reason to believe the Spanish Government intended to limit themselves to the acquisition of auxiliary cruisers, like those proposed to be employed by Germany in 1870. Respecting interference with cables, he pointed out that article 15 of the Paris Convention of 1864, to which Great Britain, Spain and the United States were parties, provided that belligerents in time of war were free to act with respect to cables as if the convention did not exist.

"I am not prepared," said Mr. Balfour, to say on the subject, but he said that the interference with the cables between the Anglo-American fleet, which was in the part of the world.

With reference to the alleged detention of the Spanish vessel, the Lord, he said that, so far as he knew, the vessel had not been sold either to America or Spain.

SPAIN'S FINANCES.
