AN AWFUL DISASTER IN EARLY MORNING

Montreal Express Crashes Into an East-Bound Freight.

ELEVEN PEOPLE KILLED, A SCORE INJURED

Western Passenger Train Takes the East-Bound Track at Murray Hill

And the Result is Simply Appalling—Two Toronto Drivers Among the Victims—Two Grand Trunk Engine Drivers and One Fireman Meet Instant Death—A Family Almost Wiped Out—Great Sorrow at Belleville—Heartrending Scenes After the Disaster—Strange Identification—An Inquest To-Day.

Trenton, Nov. 15.—(Special).—The Grand Trunk train, which left Montreal for the west on Monday evening at 8 o'clock, met with a terrible disaster at Murray Hill, a couple of miles west of this town, shortly after 4 o'clock this morning. When running at full speed, the express, which is known as No. 5, crashed headlong and head on into an east-bound freight, which was heavily loaded. The result of the collision was simply appalling. The driver and fireman of No. 5 met instant death, the former dying with his hand on the lever, while by a mere miracle the engine-men of the freight—Thos. Ivens, driver, and Alex. Topping, fireman—only saved their lives by jumping in answer to a brakeman's warning that the express was upon them.

But it was among the passengers of the second-class car that the hand of death was dealt. Nine persons in this car were killed outright and a score were wounded, several perhaps fatally. Nearly all the dead were so frightfully mangled that identification, where identifications were made, was most difficult. Several bodies are still unidentified.

How It Happened.

All went well till No. 5 ran into Trenton at 4 a.m. sharp on time. Between Sydney and Murray Hill, about two and a half miles west of Trenton, is a piece of single track, connecting the double tracks. No. 5 ran along the south of the double track, over the single track and, instead of taking the south of the double tracks, the train took the north of the double tracks, on which was the freight running east. Here was where the fatal error occurred. The official report of the accident sent out from Montreal says that Engineer Brady of No. 5 took the east-bound track in the face of switch and signals set against it, and proceeded until it collided with the freight on the east-bound track. HON. A. S. HARDY SAT AMONG HIS FRIENDS

At the Pavilion Banquet Tendered Him by Supporters.

PREMIER'S SPEECH OF WIT AND WISDOM

Postprandial Sentiments, Provincial, Canadian, Imperial, and All Eminently Loyal.

A Solid, Black-Coated Phalanx—Ladies and Their Escorts Viewed the Scene From the Gallery—A Full List of Those Who Honored Their Chief—A Song Composed in Honor of the Guest of the Hour—Staunch Patriotism the Watchword of the Orators.

The spectacle last night in the Pavilion at the banquet tendered Hon. A. S. Hardy differed only from the late Aberdeen celebration in that there were no ladies on the floor of the house.

The diners presented a solid, black-coated phalanx, but the decorations were as handsome, the menu as inviting, the gathering as distinguished, and the speeches as brilliant, as on the night when Lord and Lady Aberdeen were given the loving cup by Toronto's citizens.

The galleries were even better filled. Probably the ladies who dined at the first evening tenanted the gallery in the second, because it is pretty well conceded that, although a woman may be loyal, she cannot be a statesman. But she and her escort numbers sat through the dinner and were like well-behaved children, allowed to come in for dessert, for delectable trifles and gracefully manœuvred with long spoons and leas-ally allowed them.

Mr. George A. Cox, chairman, sat to the right, next to the hero of the evening, and together they sat under electric bulbs designed in the name of the Premier of the Province, "Hardy."

The speeches, it might be noted, started with Hardy, whose provincial, then Dominion, and finally outgrown Canada and became Imperial, and eminently loyal.

CHAMBERLAIN IS EXPLICIT.

Britain Must and Will Control the Whole Valley of the Nile.

Manchester, Nov. 15.—At the National Liberal-Unionist Conference here to-day Mr. Joseph Chamberlain, Secretary of State for the Colonies, made his first public speech since his return from the United States. Mr. Chamberlain, who was much more eloquent on the subject of Anglo-French relations than any of his colleagues in the Cabinet, said it was the hope of every friend of peace that the French withdrawal from Fashoda is indicative of their acceptance of the principle of British control of the whole valley of the Nile, regarding which there cannot be any discussion whatever.

WHO KILLED THE OLD MAN?

William Murray of Beaverton Found Dead in His House—His Skull Crushed In.

Beaverton, Ont., Nov. 15.—William Murray, an old man who lived alone in a small house here, was found dead on the floor of his house. His head was crushed in and lay in a pool of blood on the floor. Evidently he had been murdered by blows with a blunt instrument. He was last seen alive on Saturday. An inquest is being held this afternoon.

COLD HAN KEPT THEM OUT

Prospectors Driven Down From Omineca—Mining Deals Reported— Vancover's Bananas Trade.

Vancover, B.C., Nov. 15.—Intense cold has driven all prospectors down from the Omineca. Yesterday Messrs. W. Steele, C. F. Venok and C. H. Bienenman returned. All agree that the Omineca is, without a doubt, a great country for hydraulic mining, and will return in February with enough food and provisions to last for a year's work.

Among the latest mining deals reported in the district are: Vital Creek, sold to an English company for \$1200; Lost Creek, sold to an Englishman for \$5000; Black Jack on Manson Creek and Gormanson Creek have also been sold. The last strike reported is on the Iskoot. The report has caused some little excitement in the district, and a number of men are wintering at Buckley House on Tatla Lake, so as to proceed to the Iskoot early in the spring.

Several claims have been taken up on the Stranger River by Mr. C. H. Bienenman. Vancover is working up trade with Fiji, particularly in bananas. Formerly that fruit was only available for eight months of the year, and came from a distant part of the island. From Fiji it will come all the year round. On arrival here the bananas are hung up green in a cooling room until they begin to grow yellow, then they are passed into a cellar heated by gas, where they become fit for food and are sent to the stores.

Fiji varieties have a better flavor than those from Panama. In exchange for bananas Fiji is taking from British Columbia apples, potatoes and onions.

COPPER AND GOLD.

Forty-Three Standard Oil Miners Start for Michipicoton Island.

WAR EAGLE RECORD FOR THE YEAR.

Ore Sales Have Netted on a Basis of \$850,000 a Year—Two Miles of Underground Tunneling, Drifting and Sinking Accomplished—A Hundred Thousand Tons of Ore Blocked Out and Valued at \$1,700,000—Cost of Mining and Treating Ore.

At the head office of the company in this city yesterday was held the second annual meeting of the War Eagle Consolidated Gold Mining and Development Company. Some of the not very well informed shareholders of the company may have been disappointed at the failure of the management to take this occasion to announce an increase in dividend rate, but an executive stated in the afternoon, no step in this direction will be taken until the mine's earning capacity with the new plant now being installed had been ascertained.

The most important piece of information given out was that the net proceeds of five months' sales of ore have been over \$850,000. At this rate the War Eagle, with its old equipment, is yielding a net profit on its ore of \$850,000 per annum. It is estimated that the new plant now being installed should be well over the million and a quarter mark in net profits.

Two interesting bits of data gleaned from the reports read are that the underground workings of the mine and that there is now blocked out ready for stoping and hoisting 100,000 tons of ore, valued at \$1,700,000.

General satisfaction was expressed after the meeting of the conservative and at the same time detailed character of the report submitted to the shareholders. The total settlement presented was for the twelve months ending Sept. 30, and read:—

The \$170,000 item was the premium obtained from the sale of five weeks ago to Messrs. Osler & Hammond 100,000 shares of capital stock at \$2.70 per share.

The sale was reported exclusively by The World, and the money obtained was employed in the purchase of the company's indebtedness to the original owners.

Development of Past Year.

According to a report presented by Manager Hastings the total amount of tunneling, drifting and sinking done in the past year is 4118 feet, including 3180 feet of tunneling. The work done during the year, added to former headings, makes a total of: Tunneling, 8304 feet; raising, 851 feet; sinking, 635 feet; total, 9820 feet.

Thus the underground workings are nearly two miles in length.

Ore Extraction and Value.

During the year (for the first seven months of which practically no ore was shipped) the mine has produced and shipped 28,715 tons of ore, with a gross value of \$270,744.23. Details are furnished regarding the different grades and stopes from which the ore was taken.

Ore Reserves.

Mr. Hastings' report shows a vast reserve of virgin ore between the 250-foot level and the bottom of the mine. He says: "There are large bodies of ore ready for extraction, of which the aggregate will run lower in value than the past product of the mine. It places it at 100,000 tons, smelters' gross value \$1,700,000."

Company's Other Properties.

The following reference is made to the War Eagle Company's other properties, the Richmond group, lying in the Sicoca silver belt:

ment work has been done on the claims, and they have been surveyed and advertised for Crown grant which, I believe, will be immediately taken up. On our instructions, the company's holdings have been increased by purchase of one-quarter of the "Summit," a contiguous claim, of which it now owns half; and the purchase of the whole of the "Mineral Hill" and "Bureka," also contiguous claims, these last having the Sicoca Star vein for about 800 feet.

Cost of Smelting.

The directors congratulate the shareholders on the reduction in the cost of freight and treatment from \$11 per ton last year to about \$7 per ton at present. The C.E.P.I. is smelting ore at Trail at cost, and the directors feel that it is the interest of the War Eagle Company to give this experiment a full trial before considering the propriety of investing a large amount of capital in the construction and operation of a smelter.

It is pointed out that by employing electrical power, supplied by the West Kootenai Light and Power Company, a saving in the expense of working the mine is expected to be attained.

MICHIPICOTON COPPER.

Standard Oil People Start Their Adventure.

Houghton, Mich., Nov. 15.—(Special.)—Capt. James Wilcox of the Arcadian Mine left on the late train last night with 43 miners for Michipicoton Island, where the Standard Oil people are reopening the old copper mines. They will have several hundred men employed there before spring.

The above despatch confirms statements recently made in these columns to the effect that Rockefeller and his Standard Oil associates were opening up the copper deposits on Michipicoton Island in Ontario.

It is believed that the north shore of Lake Superior will develop mines similar to the Standard Oil property on the Arcadian, etc., on the south shore, which are the greatest in the world and have in ten years paid \$71,000,000.

Telford Syndicate.

The directors of the above syndicate have recently received advices of a very encouraging nature from Mr. E. M. Telford, the leader of the party, who is now, with several of his men, camped a few miles up the Stewart River, another contiguous tract situated between the Stewart River and the Pelly River. Mr. Telford reports having staked between 20 and 30 claims for the syndicate on Brewer Creek, Telford River and Pelly River. Gold has been taken out of several claims on Brewer Creek "as big as wheat." A strong company as in course of formation between London and Toronto, for the purpose of acquiring and developing these claims, and several quartz claims owned by the syndicate. Further particulars will be announced later on.

Mr. Tyrrell to Go to Klondike.

Mr. J. B. Tyrrell, M.A., B.Sc., F.G.S., who for the past 15 years has been in charge of the geological survey of British Columbia, having been engaged during the whole of that time in investigating the mineral resources of Northwest British Columbia, and having spent the past summer in the Yukon district, at and in the vicinity of the Klondike gold fields, will leave for Toronto on Monday next, about Jan. 1 next, and will be prepared to report on the extent, character and value of mining properties.

OKANAGAN MINES.

Rich Properties Just Across the Boundary Line.

In Okanagan County, just beyond the confines of the Colville Reservation, and within about two miles of the international boundary line, says the Spokane Spokesman-Review, is a group of five claims which have been developed beyond the prospect stage and which are about to be equipped with a mill and operated extensively. This property is owned by the Okanagan group and was just passed into the hands of a British Columbia company, with headquarters in Rossland. The men interested are Dr. Paul Langhammer, M. E., of Rossland, and James Langley, prominent expert of that camp, was late United States Mining Commissioner for New Mexico, and has operated as a mining expert in all parts of the world where mines exist, except in Australia. He came to Spokane with S. Thornton Langley, prominent mining promoter, to close a deal with the owners of the Okanagan properties, whereby the new company secures control of the property. They have already had a number of parties interested in a number of Spokane people in the property. In speaking of the claims last evening, Dr. Langhammer said:

"The claims are on the Shalkamene River, within about two and a half miles of Oroville. But I do not ask you to give me any report regarding the properties. I may be a prejudiced witness, you know. I will submit the report on the properties made by A. Edgecombe, M. E., of Rossland, an expert who gained a wide reputation in Australian mining camps. When he went to see the claims I never had a word to say about them. He wrote me back: 'I am simply astounded. This surpasses anything I had imagined. It will be a most payable proposition right from the start. Without taking into consideration the ore, it is in fact, one can pan gold from everywhere. It is the best property I have seen for years and reminds me greatly of a man for this is a deadly earnest. I say \$25 in my report, but I can positively say that there is plenty of ore that will run into \$1000 per ton. The silvante is just like curants in a plum duff and the lodes cross each other like pie crust. That is rather too good to be true, but one has to see the property to appreciate its worth. The ore is a friable quartz. During all my working there I never had an assay made. I always tested it by panning. It is absolutely free milling. Associated with the gold is platinum in paying quantities.'"

"We have cross lodes on the claims, which we term the east and west lode, and the north and south lode. Where the lodes cross each other we have a shaft down 50 feet in a solid body of ore, showing free gold in every pound of it. A lower lode crosses each other to be driven 50 feet further to the north and south lode, and at 120 feet it struck a body of ore 30 feet wide. This is the east and west lode. The shaft is 50 feet apart. It is driven 50 feet further to the north and south lode.

The report of Mr. Edgecombe states that there is about 1000 tons of ore on the dump.

No Favours From Hardy Now. "That means nothing, argues the alderman, the Private Bills Committee, composed as it is of ex-municipal councillors, will throw it out. They will say: 'Go to the people. We don't wish to overburden them by legislation. The present regime in Toronto can expect no favours from the Hardy Government. Therefore, the only way out of it now is to prepare a bylaw for the people in January, and be quick about it, for there isn't much time. Bylaws must be advertised, beginning not later than Dec. 30."

"I think the people, realizing that the money must be spent, will pass the bylaw. If they don't, then there is nothing left for it but to put it in next year's estimates."

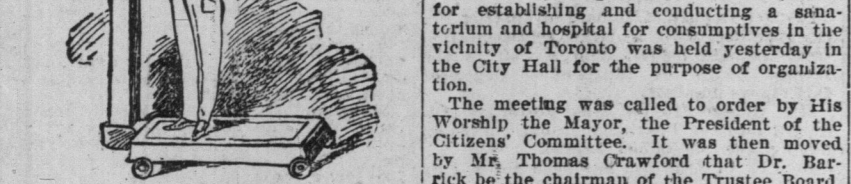
