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THIRTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
Irish Protestant Benevolent Society
OF MONTREAL,

SUBMITTED TO THE ADJOURNED ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING,
HELD ON MONDAY EVENING, 18TH MARCH, 1889.

GENTLEMEN,

Your Council and Officers have now the pleasure of submitting to you an account of their stewardship during their term of office for this the thirty-third year of the Society's useful existence.

COMMITTEES.

At the first regular meeting of your Council, held on the 3rd April, 1888, and in accordance with the duties devolving upon them, and in terms of the By-Laws and Constitution of the Society, the following Committees were elected to serve during the year:—

Your Council has now the pleasure to submit the Treasurer's detailed Statement, duly audited, and which contains a full account of the Society's financial condition.

Your Council regret to say that the balance now in the Treasurer's hands (being the balance of the year's financial operations and available for the purposes of relief) only amounts to the sum of \$80.93. The long and continuous cold weather after our last annual statement of March 5th, 1888, to end of that season of relief, and the continuance of the weekly relief during the present winter, which began on the 19th December, together with several cases of relief throughout the Summer, and one or two special cases, have drained our finances very low; and to the further fact that the annual collections by your President have fallen off to the amount of \$111.50, being this year only \$903.50 as compared with \$1014, the loss being caused by the death of several of our contributors and from other causes.

Contracts for coal and wood were made with F. Robertson, on very favorable terms.

Your Council also beg to bring to your notice that the Society has received from the Executors of the late George Browne, Esq., the legacy of \$50 referred to in a previous report.

Your Council held a special meeting on the 26th November last, to investigate the mode of relief to your poor, and to ascertain if a better system could be adopted. After a lengthy discussion, it was decided to continue the same mode of relief for the present season.

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Your outgoing Council would urge on their successors the careful consideration of the matter of relief to the deserving Irish Protestant poor.

IMMIGRATION.

This Committee has little to report during the past year. The number of Irish immigrants seeking help has not been large. Assistance to several individuals and families has been given. Advice and help to procure employment have been given in all cases.

Your Council would again urge the selection of members for the Committee who will undertake the duties required of them, or otherwise consolidate the duties of this Committee with the Charitable Committee.

SPECIAL CASES.

Some special cases of families in urgent need of assistance have been partially provided for.

MEMBERSHIP.

Your Council have pleasure in reporting a slight increase in new membership during the year, but regret it has not been larger; and they feel that some special effort should be made, either by a thorough canvass of the city or by advertising, to induce Irish Protestants and their descendants to send in their names, either to become members of the Society or to have their names on record, when they could be applied to in case of need. Your Council feel some such move should be made, as they are convinced that there is a large number of Irish Protestants in the city who do not belong to the Society and who are not known to its members.

DEATHS.

Your Council regret to have to record the death of four members of your Society during the year,—Hon. Thos. White, Alex. Gowdey (a former officer and member of the Council and one who took an active part in the working and labor of the Society), George Armstrong (one of the incorporators), and Samuel Burland.

SPECIAL THANKS.

The Society's thanks are due to Drs. Dugdale, Major, Reddy, Gurd and Wilkins, for gratuitous services during the past year; also,

to Messrs. H. & A. Allan and the Dominion Steamship Company, for reduced fares ; and to Miss Armstrong, Rev. Mr. Patterson, and to Messrs. McLeod and Sinclair, for valuable assistance to the Charitable Committee.

Thanks are due to our sister Society in Toronto, for an invitation to their annual dinner. Your President could not avail himself of the invitation ; but was ably represented by Mr. W. J. McMaster, an ex-President of your Society, and now residing in Toronto.

Also, to the St. Patrick's Society, for invitations to their entertainment on St. Patrick's night, March, 1888, at the Academy of Music, and to their pic-nic on St. Helen's Island ; to the Caledonian Society, for invitations to their pic-nic and games, and Burns' anniversary entertainment ; also, to St. Andrew's Society, for invitations to their ball at the Windsor Hotel last November. All of which your President accepted.

Your Council has to acknowledge, with many thanks, the handsome donations by its many kind friends who continue their annual contributions for the poor of our Society,—\$903.50 having been received for this object. The names of the donors are appended hereto ; and to whom the Society, through its President (David H. Henderson), tenders its sincere thanks ; and the Council hope a perusal of the work performed will satisfy the donors of the good objects to which they have subscribed, and that their donations have been well and economically expended and induce them to continue to give liberally in the future.

POOR RELIEF.

The detailed report of your Charitable Committee, hereto attached, is a correct account of the work your Society is engaged in.

GENERAL REMARKS.

Your Council regrets to see by the Treasurer's account that the members' annual subscriptions collected by him has not increased, but rather decreased by one member,—the total number of members who have paid their subscriptions this year being only 145, notwithstanding we have added several new members to our roll this year.

Your Council has much to be thankful for in that no deaths have occurred in the officers or Council of your Society during the past

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year, and that continued good friendship exists among the members and office-bearers of the Society generally. With such good-fellowship the good the Society can accomplish is only limited by the means at its disposal.

Your Council regrets that the backwardness of the collections, and other causes, necessitated the adjournment of the annual meeting to this date. The real work of this Society has been carefully and economically carried on, and those dependent on its ministry have received the needed help and succor. And now, in closing this the thirty-third annual Report of the Irish Protestant Benevolent Society, your Council feel that they have carried out, so far as in their power lay, the objects for which this Society was founded.

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We have to acknowledge the valuable help given us in this work by the Rev. Mr. Patterson and Messrs. McLeod and Sinclair, City Missionaries.

The Society has, during the past year, paid part or whole of the funeral expenses of seven persons.

Your Committee have during the year had quite a number of applications through the Ministers and Missionaries for fuel, for special cases of need which do not come under the usual class of applicants; and in every case we supplied coal or wood, as asked for.

This Committee, with the Council, had two meetings to devise some better plan for the distribution of fuel and provisions; but were unable to come to any decision. It is recommended by your Committee that this question be considered by the new Council and Charitable Committee, as we believe the same amount of money, fuel, and provisions, dispensed in a more private way, would result in relieving a greater amount of need in persons of a deserving character.

The services of the Rev. Mr. Patterson and Messrs. McLeod and Sinclair at our weekly meetings are again gratefully acknowledged.

The assistance of Miss Armstrong is also gratefully acknowledged at our weekly meetings, as also in visiting special cases of sickness, and procuring the donation of a considerable quantity of clothing for women and children who required it.

MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING.

MONTREAL, March 18th, 1889.

The Annual Meeting of the Irish Protestant Benevolent Society was held this evening, in the Protestant House of Industry.

Present:—D. H. Henderson, in the chair; W. H. Arnton, R. K. Thomas, Thomas Sutton, James Wilson, Moses Parker, J. Shinnick, Richd. Thomas, J. T. Hagar, D. McMillan. John Convery, George Forbes, John J. Arnton, Jr., J. H. Jones, Henry Dunne, James Moore, George Horne, R. W. D'Olier, W. Byrd, S. C. Kyte, John Stephens, J. C. Sinton, J. Doyle, and C. E. Dawson.

The minutes of the last Annual Meeting were read and confirmed. While the Annual Report of the Council was being read by the President, the legality of calling the meeting was called in question by Mr. R. Thomas, and led to some discussion.
