ntierly abortive. The name of the ill-fated youth was George Gook. 21 years of age, and a native of Cowness Ferry, Harvich, county of Suffolk, Eggland. He is spoken of by all who knew him as ayoning man of the most amable disposition, and the devotedness which won've him a watery grave, in his endeavoring to save the life of a stranger, has also caused a very extensive, sympathy for his fate. We hope something will be done to commente this feeling and mark the spot in which his remains are deposited.

An imposit was held on the body, before John McKay, E-q. Coroner, when the Jury returned the following verdict: "Came to his death by failing off time Market Slip, while in the act of rescuing a woman who had fallen into the water near the same place."

We cannot let slip this opportunity without commenting on the infamous condition of the ferry wharf. In the first place, it is entirely detached from the shore, so that a person in walking to it in the dark, is in imminent danger of heing precipitated into the intervening space; whilst the slips attached to it incline from the plane of the horizon at angles of perhaps 75 degrees, rendering it impossible to hold their footing except by the few cross pieces placed upon them, of which there are only a very few. Already several persons have searly lost their fives at this disgraceful spot, and, even on Sunday last, a second person ronning for the same object, saved himself by a mere miracle from the fate of the youth whose untimely fate we have recorded. If those who orgat to look aftor these matters will take no cognizance of them, it is ting the public should take it into their own hands.—Olss.
