HIS is the trenchant motto of the "**Baden-Powell**" **Boy Scouts** and covers in a very concise way the entire aims and objects of the organization. In the following pages will be found a few of the many useful accomplishments which a boy is taught in the Scouts.

Is your boy doing in his spare time? Keep him out of mischief and danger by enrolling him in the **Boy Scouts**. It will do him an incalculable amount of good, both physically and morally.

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SCOUT CRAFT

IT is in this branch of the organization that the Boy Scout develops his mental and physical being. A good Scout must be of keen perception; he must lead a clean, healthy life; and he must be resourceful, self-reliant and quick-witted. With this objective the Boy Scout is taught to exercise his own judgment, to act upon it, and to have confidence in his own powers of observation and deduction. He is also taught how to use a compass; how to utilise a watch for a compass; how to steer by the stars, and he is initiated into the general mysteries of Scout Craft, such as tracking etc.

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Map Reading, Etc.



AMONG the many interesting and useful subjects taught a Boy Scout is map reading and sketching. In a pioneer country like British Columbia this accomplishment is sometimes one of inestimable value. A boy is taught how to make a sketch map and how to commit same to paper for future permanent reference. He is also taught how to read a map and by it to travel either in rough or settled countries.

The inculcation of a patriotic spirit in the young does not necessarily breed militarism. The object of the *Scouts* is to make a boy "a man," to teach him self-reliance, to make him a good practical and useful citizen.

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BRIDGE BUILDING



TO some people Bridge Building may seem an unnecessary and a superfluous accomplishment for a boy. On second thoughts, however, it will be seen that it may be of almost incalculable benefit not only to the boy himself but under circumstances to a whole community at large. In this country of floods and heavy freshets, where rivers rise to tremendous heights and in quick time destroy highways and bridges, the most elementary knowledge of bridge building gained by a Boy Scout may at any moment be put to a practical use. In the Boy Scouts a boy learns how to throw a bridge across either creek, river or ravine.

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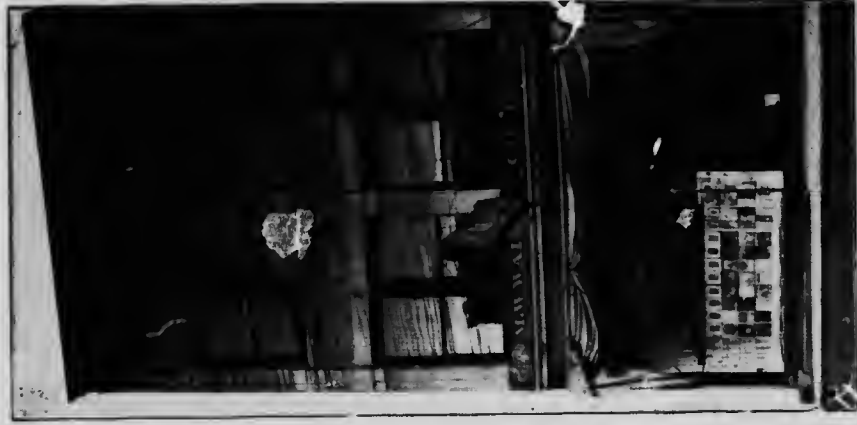

FIRST AID



THE knowledge which is derived from a course of instruction in "First Aid to the Injured" is invaluable. At any moment the knowledge thus gained may be put to a practical use and may in many cases be the means of saving life or limb, or reducing suffering to a minimum, until medical aid can arrive. A Boy Scout learns to improvise a stretcher, to know how to show the position of the main arteries and how bleeding may be stopped.

The boy of to-day is the man of to-morrow. The Empire in the future will rightfully expect from the boy of to-day certain duties and obligations, and it is only by sowing in childhood the seeds of national ideals and strong love of the flag that these duties can be reaped at their due season.



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SOME OTHERS



HE foregoing notes include only a few of the items which are embodied in the regular curriculum of the Boy Scouts. Besides these the boys are instructed in cooking, camp-craft, signalling, field engineering, botany, swimming, life saving, pioneering, astronomy etc. The "**Baden-Powell**" **Boy Scouts** takes your boy out into the open, it instils into him loyalty, patriotism and good citizenship. Why is your boy not in the organization?

"The great rally of some twenty thousand boy scouts, which took place recently at Crystal Palace, provided a striking object lesson to the nation of the wonderful success achieved by Lord Baden-Powell in the great enterprise he embarked upon two years ago to provide Great Britain with a healthy, manly occupation, one that would instill into them the spirit of self-reliance and make of them useful, practical men, such as will eventually prove a credit to the nation to whom they will owe their training. That the movement will make for the real education of our boys there can be no shadow of doubt, for, apart altogether from the technical instruction which they receive, they receive a strong character-forming education in the system of training. When a boy becomes a scout he receives three things: first, to be loyal to God and the King; secondly, to help other people; and thirdly, to obey the Scout Law. One important point in the latter is that a scout must do his best in every good turn, no matter how small, to somebody every day. Also he must be kind to animals and as far as he can from pain. Scouts must not beg or cadge for money, they must earn it by doing their own work, by making and selling useful articles, of which the recent rally afforded many examples.

Enlist your boy with the **Scouts**. It will teach him to become an "all round" man, it will give him "character," and it will render him capable of looking after himself in whatever circumstances he may be placed.

"At first many were sceptical that the boy scout movement would ever come to anything, but its phenomenal progress during the past twelve months has definitely removed all doubts on the subject. On all sides we hear nothing but praise of the wonderful improving influence it is having on our youth, and, even those most opposed to what they are pleased to call 'militarism' are fain to acknowledge that the spirit of service which actuates the lads identifying themselves with the boy scouts is something which compels their admiration, and has in it none of that aggressiveness which they naturally associate with the idea of compulsory training or compulsory service. Although the movement is distinctly military in its origin and in its administrative methods, it is as an educational force that it has attracted most attention. Object lessons are regarded as of the greatest importance in a school curriculum, but no scheme of object lessons has sought to embrace as wide a range of subjects as that contained in the syllabus of boy scouts' organization.

"Camping, cooking, day and night marching, taking bearings, judging heights and distances, sending and receiving messages by semaphore and the Morse code are regarded as an invaluable training in prac-

tical observation. When added to these there are included instruction in map-reading, sketching, woodcraft, natural history, first aid, and conciseness in expression, the educational value of such training becomes patent at once. Good reason is there, therefore, why schoolmasters warmly advocate the new movement, and do all they can to encourage the formation of new 'patrols' in the various schools under their charge. A number of these patrols were employed in connection with the recent Territorial training in various parts of the country. Their endurance, intelligence and keenness were surprising, and officers of well-known standing expressed themselves as being thoroughly pleased with their work.

"The secret of the success of the movement lies in the fact that it appeals to that spirit of adventure that lies latent even in the man of mature years. What British boy is not fond of adventure, or has not a taste for hunting in some form or other? Probably few indeed, and so it is that the principles and work of the scouts are such as appeal directly to the lad's nature, while the training is all that can be desired to make a clean, healthy, wholesome man of him. He is taught hygiene, and has to go through

There is no military meaning attached to the word scouting. Peace scouting comprises the attributes of frontiersmen in the way of resourcefulness and self-reliance, and the many good qualities which make them men among men. There is no intention of making the lads into soldiers or of teaching them blood-thirstiness.

a course of physical drill; nothing, in fact, is neglected to induce him to get the best out of his body, and, naturally, the manoeuvres he performs in the country benefit him not a little. Everything is done with the object of sharpening the boy's intelligence, power of observation and sense of responsibility. But the training is much wider even than this, for, in fact, the handicrafts, the arts and sciences are brought in to make him a good scout. He is taught something of the mystic movements of the stars; to be a good hunter, he learns how to build huts, bridges and even boats, to light fires and to cook; he learns of trees, of plants, of the birds and beasts of the field, and he studies field sketching to enable him to report on the country. Again, he is specially instructed in ambulance work, life-saving, fire brigade work, and the way to stop runaway horses. He is also encouraged to learn history, and always his eyes are kept busy, and the little brain behind his eyes also, to direct his hands to works of usefulness. Who then can gainsay the fact that General Baden-Powell has accomplished a truly wonderful work among the youth of this country, while he is providing an unfailing source of supply for the national army of the future?"—United Service Gazette.

To sum up, the whole object of the **Boy Scouts** is to seize the boy's character in its red-hot stage of enthusiasm, and to weld it into the right shape and to encourage and develop its individuality so that the boy may become a good man and a valuable citizen for our country in the near future, instead of being a waste of God's material.





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
