That Joseph H. Ham, Liberal candidate in South Brant, despite professions shouted from the house-tops that he stands for public ownership of public utilities, was under the barn when Hydro-Electric, the People's Power Project, was last voted upon in Brantford.

That Joseph H. Ham, Liberal candidate in South Brant, is still under the barn in regard to this most important people's project.

That the present supporters of Mr. Ham comprise the very element, with one or two exceptions, which fought Hydro-Electric's coming to Brantford, and this same gang are still fighting it, despite the fact that every Brantford ratepayer is now a part owner in the city power plant.

That at the great "Abolish the Bar" rally held in the Liberal Club rooms last week, a number of the prominent workers there assembled adjourned to a nearby bar-room in an endeavor to abolish it by consuming its contents.

That the last time liquor was found in a political club room in Brantford, and the only time liquor has ever been found in such a place, it was in the Liberal headquarters on George street, and also in Ward 4 Grit rooms.

That Joseph H. Ham, when chairman of the Buildings and Grounds committee of the City Council, virtually sold to himself and his friends civic property, viz., the Waterous property on Dalhousie street, and that subsequent events have shown that this sale was bad business for Brantford.

The above are only a few of the bomb-shells fired into the Ham-Expositor camp at a rousing rally of the Conservatives of the city Saturday evening in the Borden Club rooms.

Mayor Spence, in a speech bristling with fight and with facts, turned the calcium on several spots in the campaign of hypocrisy which the Conservatives of South Brant have been called upon to fight.

The speech of Mayor Spence was of the real fighting kind. The Mayor effectively criticized the record of Mr. Ham while that gentleman was a member of the City Council, having control over the city's assets and the city's property.

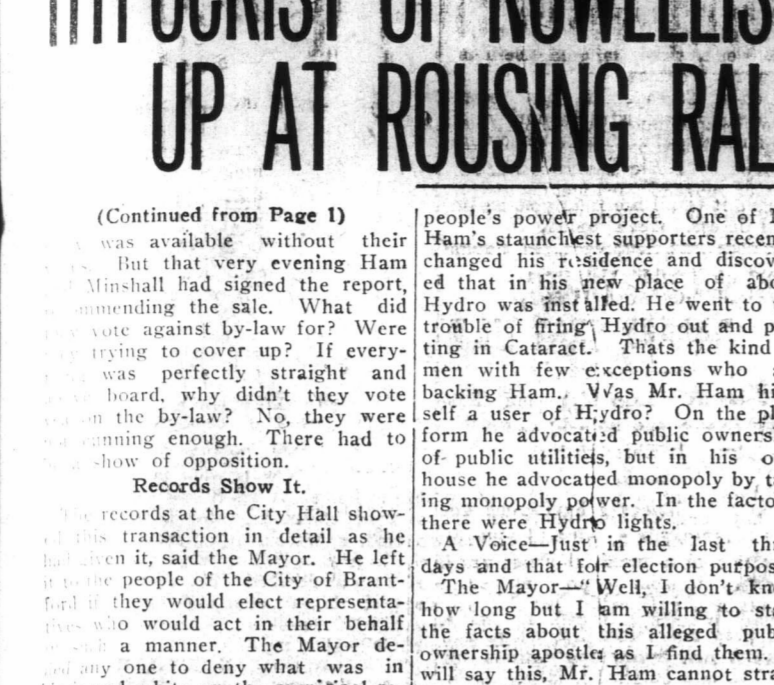
