**Ransom, March 27.**  
Nearly the whole of the valley of the Mississippi is overflooded from New Orleans. Heavy rains have fallen for several days. English troops had left. Arrived at Havana and sailed for Bermuda.

**Mexican barracks near O'Leary's** accidentally blew up 13000 bottles taken from the ruins. French Division left Orleans for Tepecan. It is rumored that a consular rebellion on Yorktown is being planned. Large fire visible in that direction on Sunday night.

**Gen. Johnston** would have joined Gen. Jackson in Winchester battle, but not being able to follow, Jackson thinking Federal forces much reduced, hesitated fatal advance alone.

**Federal pickets** six miles beyond Strasburg. It is reported that Porter's mortar had not been sent South. West Pass. Besant's and Fort Meigs still in Confederate hands.

A report from a reliable source says that a local insurrection exists in Calhoun County, Va., where the Confederates array is among white people who are better in opposition to Jeff. Davis. They despair of their cause since the abandonment at Manassas and the defeat at Winchester.

It is doubted whether the Confederates will make a stand at Gordonsville.

Deserters from the 4th Carolina Regiment say the rank and file are greatly dissatisfied with repeated false statements of Confederate victories, the newspapers are carefully kept from them. The Merrimack is fully repaired and has some heavier guns. Confederate steamers James town and Yorktown have been strengthened, and will accompany her. The commander of the Monitor holds himself in readiness, and has no fear of the result.
