In a row at Henderson's hotel, opposite the Great Western railway station, Hamilton, one man was shot and another was in the arm and two others seriously beaten.

Mr. Moomph's hotel in London, East was destroyed by fire, yesterday. The flames did their work so completely that the people in the house barely escaped with their lives.

FOREIGN NEWS.

The royal decree dissolving the Spanish cortes was read yesterday. The damage by the fire at the Victoria docks, London, Tuesday night, is \$440,000.

The royal commission on the parliamentary election in Boston, Lincolnshire, England, which on last July last was declared void, and no new writ issued, reports that the town is corrupt.
