PROFESSIONAL JURY FIXING.

A Woman Offers to Secure the Liberation of Murderer Durant.

San Francisco, Aug. 14.—Some idea of the corruption which is being practised in the case of young Durant, charged with the atrocious Emanuel Church murder, may be found in the fact that the mother of Durant was visited Monday by a woman who declared that for money she could get three of the present jurors to vote for the acquittal of her son, no matter what evidence might be submitted. The woman said that jury fixing was her business and she cited recent cases in which this work had saved the neck of criminals, notably the case of M. E. Curtis, the actor, who was tried twice for shooting Policeman Grant, and who spent a fortune to secure his release. She said that money could be put up, and she would make no claim on it till she had redeemed her promise. After over an hour only eight jurors have been secured to try Durant.
