

PROMISE TO WED

Berlin Detective Unravels Mystery of Boy's Death

Servant Girl and Lover Were Robbing The House When Lad Surprised Them—Strangled and Body Then Hung to Window to Indicate Suicide

Berlin, April 25-How a detective induc l a young girl to make a confession in

connection with a murder by bethrothing himself to her has been revealed here.

In October last year a fifteen-year-old schoolboy named Ernest Tiemann was apparently found hanged at his home in Charlottenburg. At first it was supposed that the boy had committed suicide, for cases of that kind are common in Germany. But as the lad had stood well in his class and had not been despondent his mother suspected that he might have been murdered and that one of her two servants, who was alone in the house at the time of the boy's death, might have been connected with the tragedy. The girl in question was named Elsie Heinrich, and she recently received notice to leave.


The boy's mother engaged a detective to watch the girl at Rummelsburg, where she went to live with her father, the leader of the town band, he detective, masquerading as a wealthy young merchant, became a suitor for the girl's hand and was soon engaged to marry her. But he received a letter from Berlin warning him against marrying the girl as she was under suspicion of having murdered the boy. The detective assured the girl that he was ready to marry her, even if she were guilty, but she must make a clean breast of the affair. Thereupon she confessed that her former sweetheart, a locksmith, strangled the boy, who had found them in the act of rifling the house. In order to give an appearance of suicide, they fastened a curfain cord round the boy's neck and hung the body from a window-frame. The girl was arrested and the police are searching for the locksmith.

FFORT TO COMBAT CHILD DRINKING IN GERMANY

Berlin, April 25—Under the protectorate of the imperial chancellor, the first German congress for the non-alcoholic upbringing of children was held in this city. This clumsy title concealed what is described as a national tragedy—the extent to which all classes of the community allow their children from earliest years to take alcohol

hol.

Dr. Von Strauss, president of the first administrative court, says:— "Babies are given schnaps and children not yet ready, for school take bottles of beer with them to the playground. The majority of German school children, boys and girls, in all classes receive alcoholic drinks, and when past their twelfth year they partake, as a matter of course, in the habits of their parents—'mornings after' are nowise uncommon among children, and there is a deep-rooted theory that beer, wine, and schnaps do children no harm."
