This mater was discussed in the Gazerra there weeks ago and the prediction was made that the government would find it necessary to make a change in the sugar duties. The new scale of duties on sugar only came into operation in the United States on the 1st April and consequently business in that country has hardly settled into its new channels, but there can be no doubt that the effect of the change in the U. St duties, if our duties remained unaltered, would be to keep sugar in Canada at a much higher price than in the United States. 


