Mr. Morley moved an amendment to the effect that an advance of money should not be granted under the bill except with the approval of the council in the district in which the holding for which the advance was asked might be situated.

Mr. Parnell agreed with the principle which Mr. Morley advocated, but he objected to waiting for local government. It was undeniable, he said, that tenants had better terms by waiting, but he was anxious to see the bill passed.
