Fredericton, N. B. March 25—(Special)—
The Lumber and Limit Holders' Association which has been in session here for two days had a conference with the surveyor general this morning. Yesterday atternoon the association elected Hon. John P. Burchill president, Henry Hilyard, vice president, and R. A. Lawlor, secretary.

The conference this morning was in connection with the presenting of a memorial setting forth their views on the matter of business relations between the lesses of the crown lands and the government. After talking the matter over in an informal manner, with Mr. Grimmer it was dicided to submit the memorial to the executive of the government at a later day to be fixed by the surveyor general.

A new element has entered into the discussion of this question. The delegation now in Fredericton represents all the large interests of the lumber business in the province and all the holders of leases that it may continue over tomorrow.



WAS THE BEST **IN PORTO RICO**

Member of Porto Rican Commission Says the United States Admistration Did Much to Ruin the Island

Washington, D. C., March 24—That Porto Rico was governed better under Spanish rule than under American, that the Spanish-American war and the consequent occupation of the island by the United States has ruined the coffee industry, the most important in the island, and that the executive council, composed largely of Americans, is responsible entirely for the present crisis, were declarations tonight by Luis Munoz Rivers, chairman of the commission now here. The commission was appointed by the heuse of delegates to lay before President Taft, congress, and the American people, the reasons for the existing conditions in the island, and to ask for concessions from this country, both regarding the form of government of the island and the tariff.

Commissioner Larinaga, delegate from Porto Rico, to congress, will endeavor tomorrow to arrange for an interview with President Taft. The latter has the power to straighten out the situation, but the desired change in government would entail congressional amendment to the Foraker act by which the island is governed.

City Druggists are Busily Preparing for the New Act in Force April 1st

The druggists all over the city both wholesale and retail, are busy now pasting stamps on proprietary medicines in readiness for the coming in force on the first of April of the act governing proprietory medicines.

After the first of April any druggist who sells any prepared medicine without the formula of the preparation on the label, the registered number of the preparation or a stamp on the package to show that the medicine was manufactured before the act came into force, will be subject to a fine. And result is that every druggist has to secure a great number of stamps from the inland revenue department at two cents a hundred, and stick them on all the packages of medicine to be taken internally, which have not a registered number or the formula on the label. The wholesale houses have already complied with the regulation and the goods being sent out now bear the goods the proper the proper to the proper to the good to the proper to the

THAT CONCRETE PIPE

With regard to the construction of the concrete pipe on section 3 of the waterworks the following statement was made by Inspector John A. Kane:

"My orders from the engineers (Barbour and Hunter) was for a mixture of one part cement, two of sand and four of gravel, with one barrel of loam. To this I strongly objected, and the pipe, of course, was spoiled, as I told them it would be, and had to be taken up. This can be proved. It included a section of 65 feet and parts of others."
