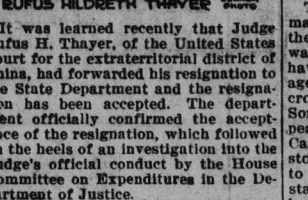
BRIDGE WORK SCARCE IN GR. BRITAIN

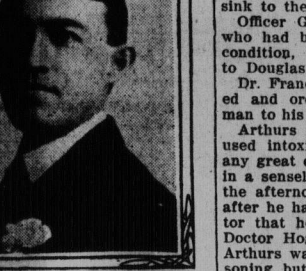
