



Report of the Session for 1890.

In presenting the annual statement for the year 1890, the Elders would call upon all the members of the Congregation to join in thanksgiving to God for another year of prosperity and blessing. Surely it is a privilege to know that the Master's favor has been resting in a very marked degree on the various departments of this Congregation's work.

Our membership at the close of 1889 numbered 277, and during the past year 50 members have been added, 23 by certificate and 27 by profession of faith. There have been removed from the Roll during the year 24 members, 4 by death and 20 certified to other churches, so that our membership now stands at 303. It is interesting to notice that 23 out of the 27 added by con-

fession of faith are from the Bible Class and Sunday School, a gratifying indication of the faithfulness in sowing by those to whom is entrusted the great work of

feeding the Lambs.

The attendance at the weekly prayer meeting has been well sustained, as also the interest in the subjects discussed. Can we all not add our presence on such occasions? The Lords' day morning and evening services have been larger than at any time in the past, and with God's blessing on the preached word, must in the near future, yield a large spiritual harvest. The Sacrament of the Supper was observed 3 times during the year, with the following large attendance of members, 230, 248, 243. The number of Baptisms for the year was 9.

The pastor's visiting book shows a record of 283 pastoral calls and visits, of which 76 were to sick and

afflicted.

As the various organizations present their own reports, it is unnecessary for the members of Session to dwell on the good work accomplished but they would thankfully acknowledge the zeal and earnestness displayed by all the workers of both sexes. In addition to the organizations of this Congregation for Christian work mentioned in last year's report, the members of Session mention, with much gratification, The Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor recently formed, and which gives promise of great usefulness.

During the year we have had many sad bereavements which we trust have drawn us all nearer to the Lord, and deepened in us all a sense of responsibility for the improvement of our remaining times in the world. The Lord has taken from us the little child, the youthful entering on womanhood, the strong man in the midst of his days, and the aged who have long borne the burden and heat of the day. Let us all so live that we will be able to say in beginning the unknown future of 1891, "whether living or dying we are the Lords."

To the Members and Adherents of the Streetsville Presbyterian Church:

The Managers have much pleasure in presenting to the Congregation the report of 1890. It includes the Treasurer's detailed account of Receipts and Expenditure, also the third statement of the Treasurer of the Building Committee. The Managers kindly thank the Members and Adherents for their interest in the temporal affairs of the Church, and for the very hearty way in which they have met the third call of the Building Fund.

The Expenditure for the year, as appears from the Treasurer's Report, is less than that of last year, but shows that the Revenue has not been equal to the Expenditure by about \$130. The Managers therefore have decided to visit the various families of the Congregation

at an early date, and with their help, would endeavor to increase, if possible by a revision of the weekly and yearly offerings, the ordinary revenue of this Church. They hope the Members and Adherents will extend to them a cordial reception and that the result will guarantee the temporary prosperity of our beloved Zion. order to attain such end the sum of 1,500 dollars yearly is necessary, of which sum any surplus will be applied to a reduction of the total liability of this Congregation.

Treasurer's Statement—Building Committee.

In presenting this my third annual statement of the Building Fund to the Congregation for their approval, I would in the first place take this opportunity of thanking the subscribers for the prompt manner with which they have met the calls made upon them, as it has to a large extent lightened the labours of the Treasurer.

As this is the year in which all subscriptions to the Building Fund should be met, I thought it would be advisable to give a brief statement of how the fund stands. It has also been suggested by the Pastor that we consolidate the debt; that is put in one statement the debt on the church including the amount still due from the ladies, also the debt on the manse and stable; se that any one taking up this year's report will be able to tell at a glance the whole indebtedness of the Congregation.

In conclusion I would urge those who are still in arrears to the Building Fund to make an effort and pay them up as soon as possible, in order to lower the debt and keep the interest account as low as possible.

Synopsis

Of Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Streetsville Presbyterian Congregation for the year 1890.

Pursuant to notice duly given, the annual Congregational Meeting of the Streetsville Presbyterian Church was held on Monday evening, January 19th, 1891, in the lecture room of the Church. The Rev. R. J. M. Glassford, pastor of the Congregation, presiding. Mr. N. Steen was appointed Secretary. The meeting was opened with devotional exercises.

The minutes of the last annual meeting were read and confirmed.

The Moderator and Clerk of Session, Mr. Thomas McCraken, presented a full statement from the Session, showing the work done during the year. On motion the report was received and adopted.

Then followed full and satisfactory reports from the different organizations of the Congregation. These were considered *seriatim*, finally adopted and ordered to receive a place in the annual printed report.

The election of Managers to fill the place of the retiring Managers was then proceeded with. The Chairman named Mr. L. Scruton and Mr. W. Jardine, scrutineers.

Nominations having been made and a ballot taken, the Scrutineers reported that Mr. Wm. McCraken, Mr. John Weylie, Mr. N. A. Steen and Mr. Jas. Douglas, Jr., had received the highest votes, and the Chairman declared them duly elected.

Mr. John McCaulay, one of the Managers, having been called to the office of Elder in the Congregation, tendered his resignation as Manager. After discussion Mr. McCauley withdrew his resignation.

The Moderator, on behalf of the Session, introduced the matter of obtaining historical facts in connection with the establishment, etc., of this Congregation. The matter was well received, and the following Committee was appointed to procure same, and report at the next annual meeting;—Mr. Wm. Steen, Mr. George Murray, Rev. R. J. M. Glassford, Mr. T. K. Beaty and Mr. James McClure, Sr.

On motion, duly seconded, Mr. J. B. Leslie and Mr. F. W. Morgan were appointed Auditors for the year 1891.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned, the benediction being pronounced by the Chairman.
