Dominion Parliament.

(Specials to St. John Sun.)

OTTAWA, APRIL 22. In Supply, on Saturday morning, on the item of \$150,000 to increase the accommodation at St. John in connection with the Intercolonial, the following debate took place:—

SIR CHARLES TUPPER. It is known to me at all acquainted with the subject that the accommodation at St. John has been of a very inferior character, in fact only of a temporary makeshift character. A large and important contract was entered upon there by my predecessor, the late Mr. Mackenzie, which furnishes communication with shipping. The station buildings and everything connected with the St. John arrangements are on a scale altogether inadequate to the interests of the city. An expenditure for improvements of \$150,000 is asked for—to purchase additional land and to complete the sheds and bonded warehouse, \$21,000; for four sheds, \$20,000; for grading and for the building of a branch service, \$15,000. It is proposed to go down nearer the water. We take more ground at the side.

In answer to Mr. Burpee (St. John), Sir Charles Tupper said the work will take up the entire land charge of the subject, and was entirely inadequate to the business of the place. No passenger station is provided in this. It was proposed to deal with the freight accommodation in the first place.

MR. DOWLING. I recall the attention of the Minister to the fact that employees on the I. C. R. receive very little pay for their services in proportion to the increased rate of wages other employees are receiving in other parts of Canada.
