## Eighteenth Annual Report.

The accounts for the past year (ending the 30th June, 1896) duly audited, are herewith submitted, and Schedules containing details of all Receipts and Disbursements appended.

The gross revenue from all sources has been about the same as that of former years, while the expenditure has been somewhat in excess, owing to the extraordinary outlays involved in repairs to the St. Sacrament Street property and the extra expense incurred in putting the Library into a more efficient condition; the services of two extra employees cataloguing books having been continued during the past year.

In the Seventeenth Annual Report the Governors stated that they expected to effect a sale of the Knox Farm property together with the water-power privileges appertaining thereto for the sum of \$100,000, and they now have the pleasure to state that the trans action referred to has been brought to a successful issue, and the purchase money received in full.

The Board having funds at their disposal availed themselves of the opportunity to pay off the several remaining mortgages on the Institute property, amounting in the aggregate to \$59,596, thus relieving it of all such encumbrances, and effecting a saving in the annual charge for interest of nearly \$3,000. A balance of

\$30,400 remains on hand for investment, the interest on this sum alone will yield larger revenue than formerly derived from the rent of the farm property which has been sold

The Governors have experienced much difficulty ir renting the offices in the Fraser Building to advantage, and the revenue from that source, has for the time undergone considerable diminution but it is confidently believed that the financial changes above referred to will more than compensate for the loss, and henceforth provide the funds necessary to maintain the ordinary expenses of the Institute, and to some extent improve and extend its facilities.

The attendance at the Library shows an increase of 9,500 over last year, when the attendance increased by over 13,000; the number of regular borrowers from the Circulating Department continues to increase steadily. It is gratifying to the Board to see that the efforts which have been made to provide for the wants of the public and make the Institute, both useful and attractive, are being appreciated by the citizens of Montreal.

The Institute has been the recipient of 328 volumes of very useful books, the gift of generous friends; 470 of the newest and most important works of French and English literature have been purchased and 328 volumes have been bound and repaired, at a very moderate cost.

It will be observed by reference to the Abstract of Receipts and Disbursements that \$3.554 remains on hand of the Special Reserve Fund for the purchase and binding of books. The Library Committee, will, as in the past, see that this is judiciously expended in providing suitable literature.
