



ONTO AND HAMILTON GETHER

About twenty years ago Toronto and Hamilton were contending in bitter rivalry for the trade of the northwestern portion of the peninsula by railway. The result of that struggle was the building of two new roads-the Wellington, Grey and Bruce in connection with the Great Western, and the Toronto, Grey and Bruce as an independent line. 




