## THEY GAVE CREDIT FREELY

#### HOW HIRAM SILVERMAN GOT \$8000 WORTH OF GOODS.

Told Wholesale Merchants He Had Property and Secured Stock From Many Firms-Arrested in Montreal on Three Charges and Possibly More to Come-A Toronto House Interested.

MONTREAL, April 15.-Hiram Silverman of Webbwood, Ont., a merchant and general storekeeper, is now an inmate of the Montreal jail, with one charge of theft against him, besides two writs of capias. Silverman was arrested in Sudbury by Constable Bissonette on Thursday last on a warrant granted by Judge Dugas, charging him with defrauding Mr. Edward Ross out of \$457 worth of goods. But it is claimed that the total amount of the fraud will be between \$7000 and \$8000.

When the time came for payment there was no money and on investigation it was found that his property was in his wife's name and that he had given a chattel mortgage to his brother for all the stock in the store, hence the swearing out of the warrant. Silverman was caught by surprise and at once taken before Magis-trate of Algoma W. A. Quibell in order to be transported back to Mont-real, but did not arrive here on time, as the Canadian Pacific train was 15 hours late. This was on account of the burning of a trestle near Thorncliffe, North Bay. Silverman will be brought before Judge Dugas on Tuesday to stand his trial.
