





Ambler appealed and on Saturday last at Osgoode Hall, Mr. Justice Ferguson set aside the verdict and ordered a new trial. After coming home from the assizes Mr. Armstrong said that a brother of Stewart had come to the hotel where the jury were stopping. 





QUAINT HALL SETTLES.

Old-Fashiened Pieces of Furniture i Modern Gnise.

The old-fashioned hall settle, which has been taken in favor, has undergone of late considerable change. In its first form it was a ponderous, carved, semi-gothic piece of furniture found chiefly in black oak, and of somewhat too baronial dimensions to fit into the every day life of the average hall. The newest settles are much smaller affairs. They are not larger than the ordinary settletable of our kitchens, which continues to be an ironing-table, and which, turned back against the wall, forms the back of a convenient seat. Some of these high-back settles are painted in white enamel. The back and seats art upholstered in Morris tapestries in indigo blue or russet browns, and they are exceedingly useful in the hall or on the summer piazza, which can hardly have too many seats, if it is as ample

Almost any village carpenter can make this bench with its straight back To be comfortable the seat ought to be deep. Where the woodwork is too rude for enameling, it may be completely covered up with tapestry or upholstered all over. The Society of Associated Artists have recently been making settles covered in this way with their beautiful green cotton arras, which is so cool and

Some of these settles are of very large size, with the straight back and arms and ample seat; and they are balanced below. Carved settle are considerably smaller than they were. They are generally made of ebonized wood or oak, and the straight back is carved by decorative artists in a variety of patterns suggestive of mediaeval designs. Sea green velveteens and delft blue tapestries are favorite materials for the cushion of the seat.—New York Trib-

The Great Wall of China. Authorities differ as to the exact date when the great wall of China was built, ensus of opinion appears to be that it was begun, at least, in the reign of the Emperor Che-Hwang-Te, the founder of the Tsin dynasty, who ascended the throne in 231 B. C., and died 210 B. C.. There does not seem to be any reason for doubting its actual ter Harrison, of Chicago, when visiting China in 1886, wrote home that he was inclined to look upon it as a myth. Subsequently a paragraph went the round of the papers, copied from the London Times of August 5, 1887, which attempted to show on the authority of Abbe Larrien that the great wall "does not and never did exist," that there are indeed, square towers of earth faced with brick at considerable distance from each other, but these were never join-ed together by any wall as originally intended." This paragraph called out a lively controversy which was settled in favor of the wall. Among others, H. S. Ashbee wrote to Notes and Queries, in sisting that he himself had seen the great wall, that he had climbed upon it, and though he had never measured it. and though he had never measured it length, he could bear ocular evidence that it extended from the point where he stood upon it in a straight line, unbroken save in places where it had bee allowed to fall into decay, as far as the eye could reach in either direction.
"While crossing the gulf of Liao-Tong
I plainly saw, from the deck of the steamer, where the great wall started from the sea. Further, in the same part of China, but unconnected with the great wall, I observed the square tow-ers in question."—New York Herald.

Trade of the Week.

In the first half of 1894 the total was \$457,747,687; the gain is about 7 per cent. The total for this week is \$19,244,000, against \$19,660,-000 last week, \$16,983,000 in the week last year, and \$21,751,000 in the first week of July, 1893.


