#### CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

The unsettled weather of the past week has tended to hold back orders for lumber. and the volume of business passing between retail dealers and consumers is not large. Buying by wholesalers has been in evidence, however, there being a noticeable disposition to pick up stock at each favorable opportunity. Prices have reached the point where there is very little speculative buying, as it is generally recognized that manufacturers will not endeavor to force prices much higher lest it should have the effect of restricting the consumption. Such buying, therefore, as has taken place has been of a healthy character and by persons who will hold the stock against any temporary depression. A recent transaction was the purchase by White, Gratwick & Mitchell, of Buffalo, and White, Rider & Frost, of Tonawanda, of ten million feet of white pine lumber to be cut at Spanish River this season. Prices are reported to have been very satisfactory to the seller, while the buyers are no doubt satisfied with their bargain.

The sawing season has not yet fully opened up, but a number of mills are in operation. The new cut will not be ready at the earliest before the middle of June, during which time the present light supply of dry stock is certain to be cleaned up. The situation, in our opinion, in re. spect to both pine and hardwoods, is fairly strong, with little or no probability of a decline in prices in the near future.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

Manufacturers who have depended upon the European markets can find little encouragement in the outlook for business. Shippers who have returned from England report that the conditions prevailing on that side of the Atlantic are quite unfavorable. Many who are usually ready buyers of spruce deals are not disposed towards placing contracts at prevailing prices, as they are of the opinion that they will be able to buy to better advantage at a later date. In the meantime the present stock of dry number on this side is being worked off, and as the log drives will be later than usual, prices are not likely to decline much below present quotations. There is a good demand for lumber for shipment to New York and the Eastern States, where the supply is lighter than usual. Shingle prices are steady on the basis of \$3.35 to \$3.40 for extras, Boston delivery. I aths are showing a little more activity. Present prices on Boston rate of freight are \$3.30 to \$3.35 fcr 1 1 inch, and \$3 15 to \$3 20 for 11/2 inch, but it is probable that there will be an advance on these prices in the near future.

#### UNITED STATES.

The white pine trade of the United is showing increased activity, while the hardwood business is in a flourishing condition. Recent large purchasers of white pine in the Lake Superior district stand as evidence that the large dealers do not anticipate a decline in prices. The Edward Hines Lumber Company, of Chicago, last week closed a contract for the 1904 production of the two mills of the N. Ludington Company at Marinette, Wis., amounting to 45,000,000 feet, which with 5,000,000 previously secured makes the total purchase nearly 50,000,000 feet. The consideration is said to have been almost \$1,000,000. Box lumber continues to receive more attention than any other grade. The factories are still in need of stock, notwithstanding that they have been buying heavily all winter. In Buffalo 1x12 box brings \$21. Mill culls are so scarce that some dealers have withdrawn their quotations altogether. No. 5 box lumber sells readily at \$10, which is an exceptionally high price.

Hardwood sales continue to show an increase and there is a pronounced scareity of some items. Birch is in very strong demand for furniture making and interior finish. The Wisconsin mills are asking \$18 to \$19 for mill run, and find no difficulty disposing of their stock, as jobbers are active in picking up dry lumber. While maple lumber is strong, the same cannot be said of flooring. The manufacturers

of this material still complain of low prices, as much as \$5 below the list price being quoted in some instances.

#### GREAT BRITAIN.

The shippers of Norway, Sweden and Russia are closing contracts for lumber for delivery to Great. Britain at sharp recessions, and long as there is pressure from this source, no improvement in prices may be expected. This week we are told that a large line of fourth quality 21/2 and 3x7inch redwood battens has been sold to a London importer at £7 10s. f.o.b., which is equivalent to a reduction of tenshillings as compared with recent sales. So little business has been done, and importers show so little disposition to increase their obligations, that it has been absolutely necessary for shippers to reduce their prices in order to effect sales. Importers are still fighting off the high prices asked by Canadian shippers of spruce deals, and the lower qualities of pine deals, but so far the sellers have shown no evidence that they will modify their demands. The situation is interesting if not encouraging, and it remains to be seen which side will weaken. The margin of profit to the shipper at the prices asked is not large, and as importers must be carrying light stocks, it would seem that they must of necessity replenish their supply in the near future. A rather encouraging report comes from West Hartlepool, where white pine deals are finding a ready sale and stocks are in a very limited compass.

The London dock stocks on March 31st last showed the following increases as compared with one year age: White pine deals, 117,917 pieces, pine battens, 92,143 pieces; pine ends, 45,332 pieces, spruce deals, 44,533 pieces; spruce ends, 63,707 pieces; white pine boards, 57,971 pieces; red pine boards, 67,358 pieces. Red pine shows a decrease of 11,866 pieces of deals, 10,355 pieces of battens, and 1,000 pieces of ends, and spruce boards is in lighter supply by 17,105 pieces.

#### STOCKS AND PRICES.

At a meeting of the Southwest Miramichi Log Driving Company held last week, it was reported that about 25,000,000 feet of logs will come out of that river this season.

Mershon, Schuette, Parker & Company, of Saginaw, Mich., List week bought 1,000,000 feet of box lumber in the Lake

Superior district, and 1,000,000 feet in Green bay.

Cornelius Hagerman, who conducted lumbering operations last winter at Lepreaux for Gregory and Dunn, of St. John, N. B., has commenced stream driving. He has about 3,000,000 feet to bring out.

A Buffalo dealer quotes the following prices on inch white pine: Uppers, \$82; selects, \$67 to \$72; fine common, \$38; No. 1 cuts, \$40; No. 2 cuts \$25; No. 1 mouldings, \$52; 1x12 shelving, \$45; 1x12 No. 1 dressing, \$38; 1x12 selected shaky dressing, \$32; 1x12 No. 1 barn, \$32; No. 2 and No. 3 barn, \$23.

Gilman Bros. & Burden, of Fredericton, N. B., who carried on lumbering operations on the Oromocto river last winter, commenced stream driving a few days ago. They have 1,000,000 feet of pine loys, which they expect to have in safe waters very soon. They are considering the advisability of manufacturing the lumber at the mouth of the river by a portable will

#### NEW BRUNSWICK LETTER.

(Correspondence of the CANADA LUMBERMAN )

ST. JOHN, N. B., April 16th, 1904.-Cedar shingles: The opening up of trade in this line has been later this spring than for many years. Comparatively few are being shipped, although inquiries are becoming more frequent and the outlook grows more hopeful day by day. The manfacturers are regaining confidence and look forward to a prosperous season. The output for this year promises to be smaller than last year's on account of the protracted cold weather, which will cause a very material shortness of the manufacturing season. The greater part of the output will be Provincial, American logs being scarcer and higher in price. The Provincial cedars are smaller and produce a lower percentage of high grades. There has been practically no change in price and those mentioned last month will still apply.

The quantity of spruce shingles manufactured in these parts is infinitesimal and at present writing none are available.

Spruce clapboards. These are very scarce and will remain so for the next two months. They are worth at present f.o.b. St. John, extras, \$41; clears, \$39; 2nd clears, \$37; No. 1, \$30; No. 2, \$20. With each succeeding year clapboards are becoming scarcer, owing to the scarcity of logs sufficiently large to serve for their

manufacture. In logs cut in the lower provinces there are practically none that will answer the purpose, while suitable Aroostook and Quebec logs are comparatively few. Stocks of clapboards are extremely low and are practically controlled by one firm, who would probably not sell at any price that would give the buyer an attractive margin.

Laths are decidedly firm and promise to be scarce and high in price during the coming year. It is rumoured that as high a price as \$2.55 f.o.b. St. John for American laths have been offered. This cannot be verified, but sales of large quantities have been made during the past month for \$2.45. Provincial laths are worth from \$2.20 to \$2.25. The output this year will be largely provincial. At this season it is usual for many manufacturers to sell their year's output of laths, but this year is remarkable for a tendency to hold on the prospect of a rise in price.

The quantity of laths on the wharves in

The quantity of laths on the wharves in this vicinity does not exceed 800,000 and it will be mid-June before any large shipment will be ready to go forward. The sales which have been made are principally for summer and early fail delivery.

#### COAST SHINGLE MILLS CLOSED.

At a meeting of the shing'e manufacturers of the state of Washington held at Seattle on April 14th, at which 110 mills were represented, it was decided to close down for two weeks from April 23. The meeting was composed of manufacturers both outside and in the Interstate Red Cedar Shingle Company, about equally divided between the two interests. A committee was appointed to confer with the mills and secure signatures to the rgreement to close for the time specified.

#### BUSINESS NOTES.

Messrs. C. S. Powell & Company, exporters of joinery, Canadian and American hardwoods, etc., have opened an office at 604 Temple Building, Toronto, where they will be pleased to receive a call from any person interested in the export lumber trade.

The Laidlaw Lumber Company, Limited, has been incorporated, with a capital of \$300,000 and head office in Toronto, to acquire the lumber business now carried on under the name of R. Laidlaw Lumber Company at Toronto and Sarnia, and that conducted under the name of George H. Belton at Lond. a, Ont. The incorporators are: Robert Laidlaw, W. C. Laidlaw and C. G. MacBeth, of Toronto; G. H. Belton, of London; and John McLeod, of Buffalo.

#### THE GLASGOW MARKET.

Masara, Edmiston & Mitchells, of Glasgow, report as follows concerning the umber market :

The usual quarterly statement of the work of logs and lumber at this date as compared with previous years is attached herewith. In the case of Canadian timber, waney pine is 50 per cent, more than at same date last year, but square pine shows a reduction, as also does elm and ash, unile oak is about the same. In lumber, est pine deats and siding show an increase, as also 3rd and 4th pine, but, as will be observed, there is a considerable decrease in spruce. The most striking difference is perhaps shown in the stock of teak, which, though of quite moderate dimensions, considerably exceeds that of last year, the explanation being that then the stock was abnormally low. In the case of the other items enumerated, there is nothing particularly calling for attention, stocks generally being of moderate dimensions. The consumption of logs and tumber has been of fairly satisfactory dimensions, though wider that of the first three months of last year.

Contracting business has so far been disappointing, Quebec shippers having experienced unusual difficulty in inducing buyers to respond to the enhanced prices this year, though this is perhaps not very surprising in view of the fact that the trade outlook by no means warrants too optimistic a view of the future.

Business during the past month has been rather dull on the whole, buying having

been pretty much of a retail nature, while tre tendency in prices has been easier.

In American hardwoods there has been a fair demand for poplar logs and lumber, but in low-grade stock the import has exceeded the demand, and shippers would act wisely in curtailing shipments of such. Oak boards have been in more active demand, and high grades are scarce.

The shipbuilding returns for March show that 27 vessels of 44,813 tons have been launched, as compared with 12 voisels. aggregating 35,000 tons, in same month last year. It is gratifying to note that new work has been a little more plentiful during the month, although there still remains lots of room for improvement in this direction.

WHITE PINE Business during the month has been quiet. The import consists of about 130 leads via the United States. Stocks are moving off slowly, one or two small sales being reported, but nothing doing in square timber.

RED PINE There has been the usual small business and the stock is almost exhausted, there being only about 70 loads in first hands.

OAK - There have been rather more enquiries during the month, but these have been met chiefly from the Southern States wood on account of the cheaper price. Quebec timber is difficult to move, and stocks being heavy, prices are easier.

ELM-There has been a fair demand, especially for large-sized rock elm, and the stock of this class being small, prices have firmed up considerably, 34. 9d. to 35. 10d, per cubic foot being asked for 45 feet

average cube. Stocks of second-class and soft wood are still heavy and moving off

QUEBEC BIRCH. There has been no import this month, and the stock on hand (which c. isists chiefly of Lower Port logs) amounts to about 400 loads. The demand is very limited, and quotations are merely nominal round about is, 8d. for ibanch average up to 28, for 17 12 mich average.

LOWER PORT BIRCH. There is still a quantity of Picton wood in stock, and it is moving off slowly. Value of 15-inch is about 17d. to 18d. Of planks there are about 600 loads on hand, chiefly poor

quality.

AsH -The stock on hand only amounts to about 100 loads, and consists chiefly of inferior logs. It is inly at an odd time that there is an enquiry for this wood newadays, and only then for good quality. Ash lumber has come more into favor of late, and the new shipments which come to hand are mostly disposed of from the ship a side.
