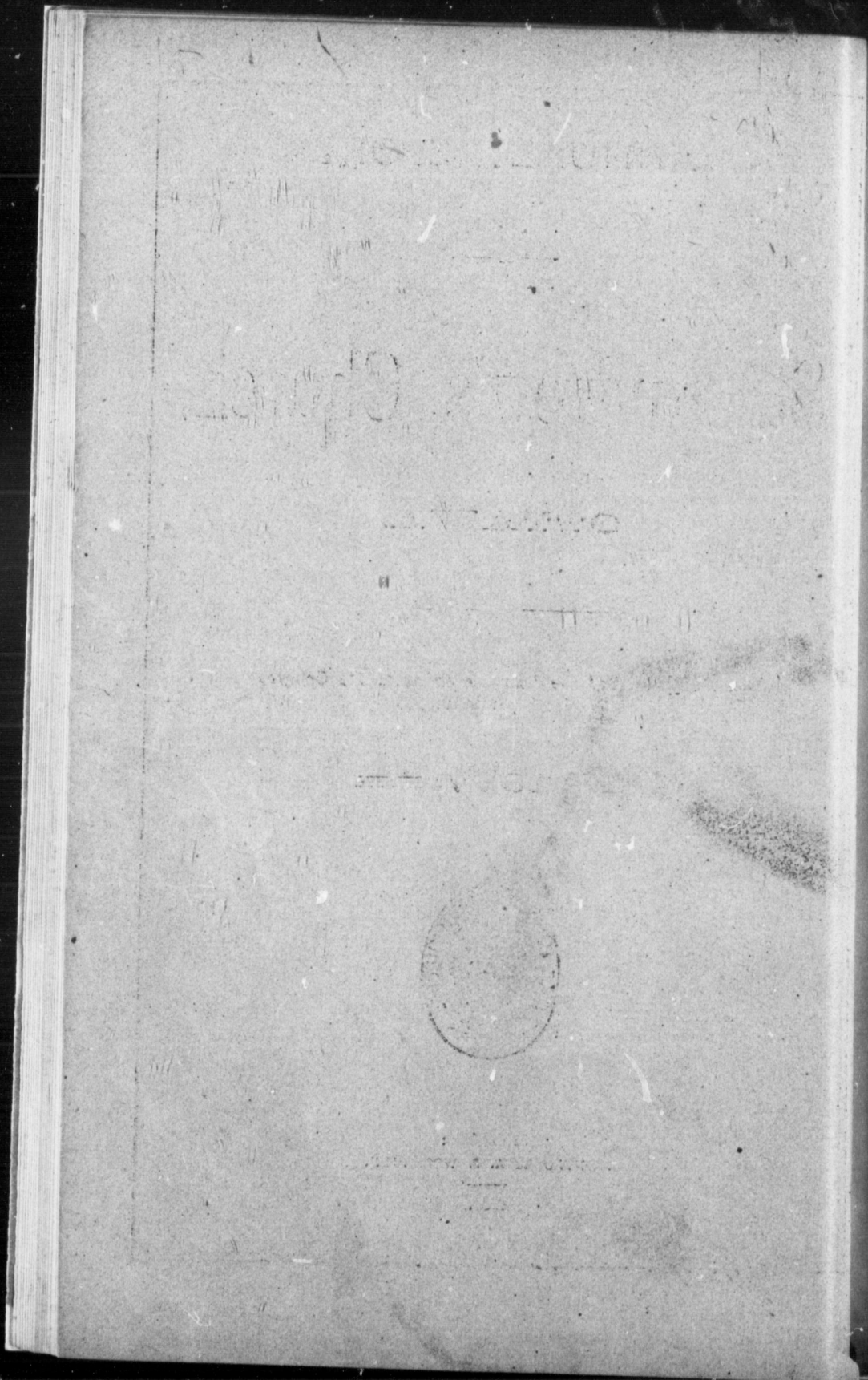

PASTORAL LETTER.

To the Members and Adherents of St. Andrew's Church.

MY DEAR FRIENDS:—I ask your kind attention to the various encouraging reports embodied in this pamphlet, though I would not have you forget that they are by no means an infallible index of Church life. The best results of Christian work elude verbal description, and cannot be traced in statistics. I am led to hope that as a result of our united efforts during the year, you are conscious of some measure of spiritual blessing, and some fresh stimulus to work while it is called day in the vineyard of our common Lord. Death has been busy among our ranks, and we have to mourn the absence of some whose life was a Christian epistle, and who have now entered into rest.

I have been much encouraged by the regularity of your attendance upon the services of the Church, as well as by the constant presence of strangers to whom I unite with you in extending a cordial welcome.

I earnestly pray that the Divine blessing may accompany my efforts to lead you into a broader comprehension of the truth as it is in Jesus, and a more faithful embodiment of the same. It will be a source of grateful joy to me to know that any word of mine has been the means of comfort or guidance or inspiration in your lives,—that I have not labored, brain and heart, in vain, nor spent my strength for naught.

I cannot adequately acknowledge the intelligent and sympathetic aid which has been rendered me by many faithful workers in the different departments of our activity. This Christian ministry on the part of others has often helped me to bear burdens which at no time seem light, and has inspired me to renewed endeavors.

The success of the Institute established at my suggestion last autumn, and maintained by the zealous co-operation of its officers and members, must be most gratifying to those who take an interest in the welfare of the Church. I have every confidence that it will grow rapidly, and continue to deserve the sympathy of all classes in the congregation.

It is a source of pleasure to me to know that means are being taken by the sale of part of the glebe, to reduce the Church debt. If we had

not the misfortune to possess real estate, I should long ago have made direct appeals to your liberality in this matter.

I am engaged at present in pastoral visiting over the whole congregation, though on account of many other kinds of work, I am obliged to proceed somewhat slowly. I think I need scarcely say that it is my desire and pleasure to see you in your homes when I can; and especially in your seasons of perplexity and sickness and grief.

I cordially invite your further assistance in those forms of Christian work for which you have largest opportunity. I ask you to be thoughtful and regular hearers of the Word; but I desire especially that you shall be doers of the Word, and that as pastor and people we shall be still more closely united in the bonds of sincere and earnest love for the Lord Jesus Christ.

REPORT OF THE KIRK SESSION.

In presenting their Annual Report the Kirk Session desire to unite with the whole Church in giving thanks to God for His continued mercies during another year. Nothing of extraordinary interest has occurred in the congregation since the last Report ; but there has been a steady maintenance of energy in the different branches of Christian work, with most gratifying results.

The Sabbath services have been largely and regularly attended, the ordinary collections showing an advance upon last year. Notwithstanding the utmost endeavor to provide permanent seats for all who desire to be adherents of the congregation, there are still several families as yet unaccommodated. The Session desire in the name of the congregation to assure these persons, as well as the strangers who are in the habit of worshipping more or less frequently with us, that they will always be made heartily welcome. The Session feel that it would be most unjust that anyone should be deterred from regular attendance because all the seats are nominally taken.

There has been a slight increase, on the whole, in the Wednesday evening services, though the numbers are somewhat fluctuating. But as in former years, the Session, while feeling grateful for a growing improvement in this regard, desire affectionately to urge upon all who could be present at this hour of worship, a careful consideration of the duty and privilege thus placed before them.

It is gratifying to be able to state that the Sabbath Schools in connection with the Church were never in a more prosperous condition than at present, either in point of attendance or general efficiency. The Session would again record their appreciation of the devoted services rendered in this department of Church work.

The Bible Classes for young men and women have been fused into one, under the leadership of Mr. C. Falconer. This Class is held on Sabbath afternoons and is thrown open to all. It has been well attended and the Session desire to commend it to those who have not yet availed themselves of this opportunity of Bible study.

The Ladies' Aid Society have had unusual demands made upon them this year, but by persevering industry and self-sacrifice have been able to overtake the duties involved in the various departments of their valuable work.

The District Visitors deserve hearty thanks for having maintained their efficient support by visiting the congregation every month, and acquainting the pastor with its affairs.

During the year an Institute has been formed in connection with the Church, having for its object the intellectual and moral improvement

of its members, and the furtherance of Christian work. The venture has been most successful. A large membership is already enrolled, and the meetings have been of a high order. It is hoped that all interested in the welfare of the congregation, and especially the young people, will connect themselves with this organization, and that in the near future the Institute will be in a position to undertake some practical Christian work.

During the year thirty-eight names have been added to the Communion Roll. The present number of communicants is three hundred and eighty-six, the slight decrease as compared with last year being accounted for by the fact that the Session have just carefully purged the Roll.

The Session record with much pleasure the fact that a large number of new names are found in the list of those contributing to the benevolent and missionary enterprises of the Church, and they are encouraged to hope that each year will show a steady increase in this regard until all who are in a position to do so avail themselves, according to their ability, of this privilege of assisting Christian work.

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

The Annual Meeting of the Congregation of St. Andrew's Church was held in the Lecture Room on Monday evening, 7th March, 1887, Mr. James Cunningham, President of the Temporal Committee, in the chair.

The minutes of last Annual and Special Meetings were read and confirmed.

The reports and accounts of the Temporal Committee were read.

Moved by Mr. Hamilton, seconded by Mr. Wood, that the report of the Temporal Committee be received and adopted, and that the incoming committee be instructed to give effect to the recommendation contained therein in regard to effecting increased insurance on the church building, furniture, etc.—Carried.

Report and accounts of the Kirk Session, Ladies' Aid Society, Schedule Fund Account, St. Andrew's Church Institute, were read.

Moved by Mr. Hamilton, seconded by Mr. McRae, that the reports and statements which have been presented to this meeting be approved, and that the same be printed and distributed to the congregation under the directions of a committee consisting of Rev. Mr. Herridge, Messrs. E. H. Bronson, P. Larmonth, C. S. McNutt and James Cunningham.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Hood, and seconded by Mr. F. P. Bronson, that the thanks of this meeting are due and are hereby tendered to the members of the Ladies' Aid Society, and to the District Visitors for their valuable assistance in church work during the past year.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. McRae, and seconded by Mr. Larmonth, that the thanks of the congregation are hereby tendered to the members of the Choir for their efficient services during the past year.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. A. H. Taylor, seconded by Mr. Halkett, that the election of members of the Temporal Committee be by individual nomination and ballot, and that the chairman appoint two tellers of the ballot.—Carried.

The President appointed Mr. Wm. Hamilton and Mr. J. B. Halkett tellers of the ballot.

After all present who wished had voted, the ballot was declared closed.

The tellers reported the result as follows: Messrs. James Cunningham, Geo. L. Orme, J. W. McRae, Peter Larmonth, John S. Durie, C. C. Ray and Wm. Hutchison, and these gentlemen were declared elected as a Temporal Committee for the ensuing year.

Moved by Rev. W. T. Herridge, seconded by Mr. Halkett, that the thanks of this meeting be tendered to the retiring President and members of the Temporal Committee, and especially to the retiring Secretary-Treasurer for his indefatigable labours in the interest of the Church.—Carried.

REPORT OF THE TEMPORAL COMMITTEE.

To the Congregation of St. Andrew's Church, in General Meeting assembled:

Your Committee as usual desire to exhibit an account of their management of the business of the congregation during the past year.

The amount collected from Pew Rents and Glebe

Rents to 15th February, is.....	\$4,637 86
Against collection last year	5,632 42
Falling off.....	\$994 56

This is explained by the unusual amount of arrears collected last year and the loss of rent owing to the cancelling of the lease to Slattery in order that Spenceville might be offered for sale.

In conformity with a resolution passed at the General Meeting in March last, your Committee have caused that part of the glebe lot east of the Rideau Canal to be surveyed into lots and advertised for sale. So far nine lots have been sold to four parties, at the rate of two hundred dollars for 66x99 feet, amounting to \$1,800 on time with interest at six per cent. per annum of which one hundred dollars have been received in part payment, that is, twenty-five dollars from each purchaser.

Also a plan of the land has been prepared dividing it into lots which are marked off on the ground as laid out on the plan.

The action taken by the Committee in this matter and the plan prepared by W. J. Macdonald Esq., P. L. S., was approved by the Congregational Meeting, duly convened, held on the 26th January last, and the name of Spenceville confirmed.

It should be understood that at present perfect titles cannot be given for the lots sold owing to the fact that the place is covered by a mortgage of fifteen hundred dollars, a remedy for this condition can only be found by paying off said mortgage which may be done when sufficient funds are raised for that purpose.

Sales however may be continued as heretofore, the Corporation being responsible for the completion thereof at a suitable time.

It seems well to place on record that, according to the resolution first referred to, the moneys received from the sale of any of this property can only properly be applied to the reduction and payment of the mortgage debts of the congregation until these are paid up—excepting of course any expenses incurred in carrying out the sales.

Your Committee recommend that application be made in time for another amendment to the Act of Incorporation with the view of simplifying the process of effecting and completing sales of the glebe lot or portions thereof, also any other improvements in the Act that may be thought desirable.

It is proper that the congregation should know that the mortgage debt due to Mr. Murray, of Aberdeen, £6000 sterling, may be paid to him in Aberdeen on the 18th day of March, 1891, by giving six months previous notice of intention to pay, otherwise it will be payable on the 18th March, 1896.

Existing leases on the Glebe lot will all have expired on the 1st April, 1891—some of them will lapse in 1889, but these will probably be continued till 1891.

The insurance policies on the Church, Manse and Caretakers house, also on Corning house, Greaves house and Robertson house on the Glebe lot amount to \$40,750.00. Statement in detail herewith.

As will be noticed, the insurances now in existence are

\$31,000 on Building of Church,
1,300 on Church Furniture,
2,500 on Organ,
850 on Stained Windows,

and your Committee would recommend that the above be increased by

\$9,000 on Church,
1,200 on Furniture and
500 on Organ,

and if this suggestion is approved of, that it be carried into effect without delay.

As the eleventh year of their existence as a Society draws to a close, the office-bearers of the Ladies' Aid Society feel that, on the whole, they have no reason to be discouraged at the general result. The average attendance has only been 17 (seventeen), as against 19 (nineteen) last year; the largest number present at any one meeting having been 22 (twenty-two), the smallest 10 (ten). The number of new organizations, as well as the exceptionally stormy character of the winter, may probably in part account for this. Many of their most valuable assistants are only occasional attendants at the meetings, while they do not cease to work for them at their own houses.

The meetings have again been held in the Bible Class room of the Church this season, but the Society having provided themselves with a coal stove have found the room much more comfortable.

Three entertainments were given during the year—one on the 2nd of April last, "An Evening with Longfellow," realizing \$105.10 (one hundred and five dollars and ten cents); "A Christmas Fair" on the 16th of December, the proceeds of which, \$230.00 (two hundred and thirty dollars), were handed over to the Orphans' Home Trustees, to assist them in furnishing their new Home; the third, the anniversary one, on the 29th of January. All were exceptionally good. The anniversary one was again free, and the attendance was perhaps the most representative of the congregation that they have had for years. The whole amount raised during the year from all sources has been \$446.01 (four hundred and forty-six dollars and one cent).

At the first meeting of the Society for 1886-87, Mrs. Herridge was unanimously elected Honorary President, and kindly consented to accept the office. The Society have again to mourn the loss of two of their most popular members—Miss Stewart and Mrs. Drysdale. It is also a source of deep regret to them that Mrs. Elliot, who has from the first organization of the Society so efficiently discharged the arduous duties of Secretary-Treasurer of the Poor Relief Committee, has been obliged through ill-health to retire.

Donations of \$25.00 (twenty-five dollars) each were given to the Upper and Lower Town Sunday Schools, to add to their libraries; one of fancy work to the Busy Bees, for their bazaar in aid of the Orphans' Home, and one of \$9.72 (nine dollars and seventy-two cents) to purchase articles for the Rev. Mr. Ami's Annual Christmas Tree.

The Society desire once more most heartily to record their grateful thanks to the many friends who have so willingly and generously assisted them by donations, lending decorations, and in various other ways. These thanks are also due to the members of other congregations, as well as of St. Andrew's, who have so kindly aided them in getting up their programmes, and also to the Church Institute for allowing them the use of their piano for their entertainments.

REPORT.

The number of scholars on the roll is 277, an increase of 17 over last year. The average attendance—157, may appear small as compared with the number on the roll, but this is accounted for by the large number (80) in the infant class, whose attendance is of course less regular than the older children. The teachers and officers number 34. The school is composed of 25 classes—12 of boys, 12 of girls, and the infant class of boys and girls together. These classes are taught by 18 ladies and 6 gentlemen. We regret the loss to the school during the past year of Miss Patterson, Mr. Claire, Dr. Robertson and Mr. Ross, and we have welcomed to our ranks Miss Nellie Halkett, Miss Jessie Grant, Miss Jessie Gordon; and on the reserve list, Miss Mitchell and Miss Russell.

Two classes of boys are without teachers, and we appeal to the members of the Church to come forward and help us in this work.

Especially we ask the assistance of the men ;—the women take hold of this work so nobly that the proportion of female to male teachers is three to one.

The Sabbath collections in the school are devoted wholly to Missions, and this year amount to \$158.04, a slight increase on the amount collected last year. This sum has been allocated as follows:—

A large addition has been made to the Library during the year—about 150 volumes, carefully selected by a committee of teachers. Some of the old books have been removed, and a few lost, but the Library contains now 842 volumes. The cost has been partly met by special collections by the scholars and teachers, by the surplus remaining over and above the expenses of the annual festival, and a grant of \$25, kindly made by the Ladies' Aid Society.

The Session has made its annual grant of \$100 for the ordinary expenses of the school.

The festival held in January was largely attended and greatly enjoyed. After tea, in the school-room, the children with their parents and friends assembled in the body of the Church, where Rev. Adam Chambers gave his illustrated lecture on the Pilgrim's Progress.

Opportunities are afforded the scholars from time to time, of taking the Total Abstinence Pledge ;—the approval of parents being always understood.

Many of the teachers avail themselves of the help given by the Normal class which meets every Saturday evening for united study of the lesson for the following Sabbath.

We rejoice in the fact that during the year some of our scholars have united with the Church on profession of faith. Our earnest prayer is that many more may do so during the coming year. Having this end constantly in view, we would humbly continue our work, sowing the precious seed in the hearts of the young,—remembering that "neither is he that planteth anything, neither he that watereth, but God that giveth the increase."

To the Members of St. Andrew's Church, Ottawa.

BRETHREN :—The undersigned, have the honor to report, for your information, that on the 18th October, 1886, in response to an invitation of our pastor, a number of gentlemen connected with the Church, met for the purpose of consultation respecting the advisability of organizing a society for religious and intellectual improvement, as also the laudable object of making members of the congregation better acquainted one with another.

The result of their deliberations was the appointment of a committee to frame a constitution and rules for the government of such a society as was contemplated. The constitution and rules being adopted, the organization was formed under the name of St. Andrew's Church Institute, of Ottawa, with Rev. W. T. Herridge, Honorary President, also a President and other officers, a Ladies' Committee and an Executive Committee of Gentlemen.

From its inception, the Institute has been most successful and, we believe, has been honored by the Master in carrying out its distinctive mission. Without doubt, many are known, who before were strangers to each other, and latent talent has been discovered which may yet be utilized in the furtherance of the great work of the Church.

Under the Constitution, those joining the Institute must be either members or adherents of St. Andrew's Church. The membership, at present, numbers 122, a very creditable record, we submit, considering the short time the Institute has been in existence.

Meetings are held, on an average, twice a month, from the beginning of October to the end of April, at which entertainments are provided, consisting of essays by the members, debates, recitations, readings and music. Besides ordinary meetings, open only to those belonging to the Society, several public entertainments have taken place. When such have been announced the lecture room has been filled by an appreciative audience, showing that the Institute not only holds high rank among the societies of the city, but has, to a very great extent, succeeded in its endeavor to furnish something superior to what generally forms the programme of similar organizations.

With the earnest hope that efforts of the Institute may result in adding to the welfare and prosperity of our beloved Church, above all redound to the glory of our Father in Heaven, without whose blessing nothing can be accomplished.

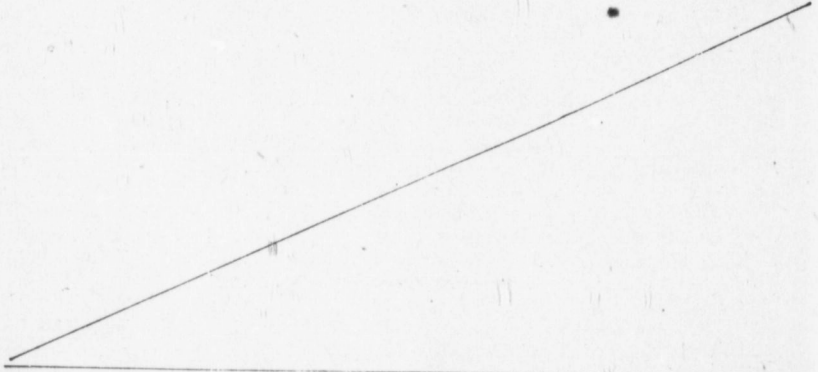
