WHOLE REPUBLICAN TICKET CARRIED IN VERMONT STATE

White River, Vt., Sept. 1.—The Republicans won the election in Vermont today by carrying the state for Lieutenant-Governor George H. Prouty, of Newport, for governor, by about 28,000 votes over James E. Burke, his Democratic opponent. The plurality was the smallest on a presidential year since 1892, when it was only 12,888, and was followed by a larger than in 1888 and only slightly less than in 1890.
