An Act for the more expeditious transaction of Public business in certain cases.

WHEREAS great inconvenience and injurious delays in the effective transaction of the Public business, result from the provision contained in divers Acts of the Legislature of this Province, requiring that certain administrative Acts should be put into execution by "the Governor in Council," and it is expedient that the said Legislative enactment should be amended, Be it therefore enacted, &c., as follows:—

Preamble.

It shall hereafter be lawful for the Governor or person administering the Government of this Province, in his discretion to put into execution all such administrative Acts, without the previous formality of an order in Council, as in the case of all other administrative Acts of greater or less importance, for the execution of which no formal deliberation or order in the presence of or by the Governor in Council is required by Law.

Governor to act alone in certain cases.
