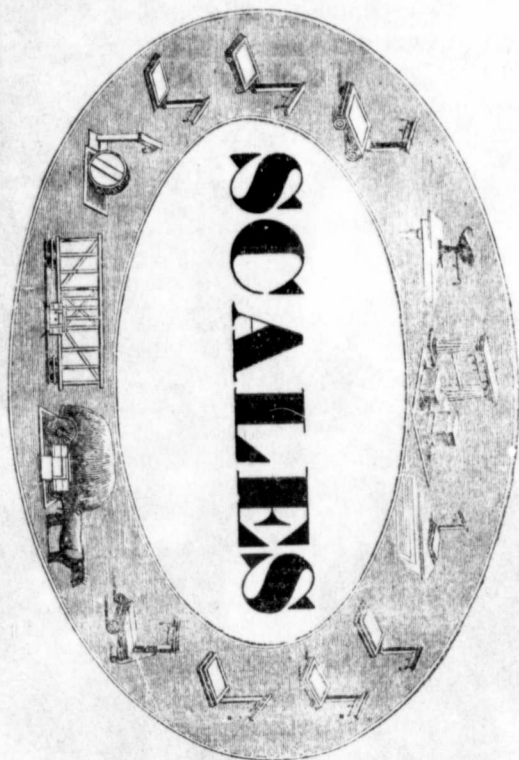

SKETCH OF THE CITY OF HALIFAX.

THE City of Halifax—the Capital of the Province of Nova Scotia—is situated on the western side of one of the finest harbors in the world, on the declivity of a commanding hill, the summit of which is 260 feet above the level of the sea, surmounted by the Citadel known as Fort George, which, from its position, commands the whole city and harbor, and is considered impregnable.

The city extends about two and a half miles from north to south, and its average width is about three quarters of a mile. The population, according to the Census of 1861, was 25,026. Halifax was founded by Lord Cornwallis on the 21st June, 1749, when, having been appointed Governor of the Colony, he arrived at Chebucto, as the Bay was then called. It was incorporated in the year 1841, and its municipal affairs are under the supervision of a Mayor and Recorder, with a Board of 18 Aldermen, annually returned from the six Wards into which the city is divided.

The streets are well lighted with Gas, and are laid out as systematically, at right angles, as the nature of the ground will allow. Large sums of money are now being expended in improving the roadways, and in laying the sidewalks with brick or stone. The city has suffered repeatedly from extensive fires; but these disasters have resulted in the erection of a very handsome style of stone and brick buildings in place of the wooden structures, of which formerly the whole city was nearly built. The southern portion of the city, with its extension to the westward, known as Spring Gardens, is a most delightful district, devoted principally to private residences, all of which denote the comfortable circumstances of the occupiers; while those of the more wealthy, surrounded by delightful grounds and shrubberies, exhibit an elegance seldom met with in the Lower Provinces.

Between this district and the north end of the city, and immediately in the rear of the Citadel, lies the district known as the Common—a splendid tract of land, 250 acres in extent, devoted to Cricket and other games, and where the military reviews are held. The district known as New Town, in the neighborhood of the Wellington Barracks, is growing rapidly. Here are many fine private residences, which, with their charming gardens, the splendid view of the harbor, and the opposite wooded hills of Dartmouth, render this a delightful portion of the city. In fact, which ever way the eye turns, it is evident that the

city is one of great capabilities, and that, should it be its good fortune to become, through the proposed railway system, the outlet of the riches of the West, together with the gold, iron, and coal mines of the Province, a great future is before it, whilst it is already one of the richest cities in North America of its size.

Amongst its numerous public buildings is the Province Building, situated in the centre of the city, built of free stone, 140 feet long, 70 feet wide, and 42 feet in height; contains all the Provincial Offices, Legislative Library, Council Chamber, and House of Assembly. The new Court House, situated in Spring Garden Road—a large, handsome freestone building—containing the several Law Courts, Prothonotary's Office, &c. Dalhousie College, new Club House, Banks, Insurance Offices, and mercantile houses, built of free stone, would do honor to any city in Europe, and cannot be surpassed for architectural beauty by any city of the same size on the continent of America.

Halifax is able to offer a very varied list of amusements, viz., the Temperance Hall, devoted to lectures throughout the winter, Exhibitions of Panoramas, Concerts, and Public Meetings.

Mason's Hall—Its spacious rooms are used for public balls during the season, bazaars and public meetings, as well as by the fraternity.

The Lyceum, devoted to dramatic representations. The Horticultural Gardens are thrown open to the public twice a week, when visitors are regaled with the delightful music of Military and Naval Bands. Bazaars, fetes, with evening entertainments and fire-works, afford a constant and pleasing change of programme. During the winter months the new Skating Rink, being lit with gas, and the visitors enlivened with the music of Military Bands, affords the ladies and gentlemen of Halifax an opportunity of enjoying, in all weathers, the pleasing and healthful exercise of skating.

Leahy's and Rhind's Gardens, north-west corner of the Common, and Harris's Hot-house, near the Dockyard, are worthy of a visit; whilst Downs's Aviary, on the N. W. Arm, forms a most charming retreat. The exhibition contains specimens of Natural History, preserved as well as alive, from all parts of the world. Frequent excursions up the Basin and the waters of the N. W. Arm serve to afford strangers, as well as citizens, a constant round of recreation, both summer and winter.

THE HARBOR.—The magnificent and picturesque Harbor of Halifax is so spacious and land-locked that a thousand vessels might ride in it in safety. It is accessible at all seasons of the year, and is to be prized for the facility of its entrance, general situation, and proximity

to the Bay of Fundy and all the interior settlements of the Province. It is situated in latitude $44^{\circ} 40'$ North, and $63^{\circ} 40'$ longitude West. It lies nearly North and South, extending about sixteen miles in length, and terminating in a beautiful sheet of water called Bedford Basin, within which are ten square miles of safe anchorage. The entrance is marked by Sambro Island, on which a lighthouse was erected soon after the settlement of the town by the English. A party of Artillery is stationed here to correspond with the Citadel by signals; and a Battery is erected to defend the entrance to the harbor.

Three miles from Halifax, and near the mouth of the harbor, is McNab's Island, which is three miles in length, and half a mile in breadth, and contains about 1690 acres. On its western side is a long gravelly point of low land called Meagher's Beach, on which stands Sherbrooke Tower. On the top of the tower is a lantern shewing a fixed light, by the aid of which vessels avoid the dangers of the Thrumpeap Shoals, which extend some distance to the southward of the beach. The north end of the passage, on the eastern side of the harbor, is protected by a stone tower called Fort Clarence, or the Eastern Battery. Opposite to the city, and mid way between it and Dartmouth, is George's Island, regularly fortified, and from its admirable position, forms one of the chief defences of the place. To the south of the city, at Point Pleasant, are several very powerful Armstrong batteries, which, from their admirable position, command the entrance to the harbor. The Queen's Dockyard is the most important of the Government establishments; within its enclosure are vast warehouses, workshops, and residences; and when the proposed Dry Dock (capable of receiving the heaviest ship in the service) is complete, the whole will form the largest and most efficient establishment of the kind in America. The Admiral's house (a plain stone building) stands on an elevated piece of ground in the rear of the Dockyard, that overlooks the works and the harbor.

On the eastern side of the harbor, opposite the city, is situated the pretty village of Dartmouth, containing about 3,155 inhabitants. It is connected with the city by Ferry Steamboats running every quarter of an hour. The village possesses the outlet of the Shubenacadic Canal, the two Marine Slips, on which vessels are raised for repairs, a large Gold Quartz Crushing establishment, and several Factories and Tanneries. The Hospital for the Insane occupies a most commanding position to the southward of the village. From the grounds may be obtained one of the finest views of the city. A visit to the lakes just beyond—the scenery of which is picturesque—will repay the tourist.

STEAMERS, PACKETS AND STAGE LINES.

The steamer from England *via* Cork Harbor, Ireland, is due at Cunard's Wharf fortnightly, say on every other Tuesday evening, and proceeds immediately to Boston.

The steamer from Boston for Liverpool, G. B., is due at Cunard's Wharf fortnightly, say on every other Thursday (about midnight) of the same week that the steamer from England arrives.

EXPLANATION OF SIGNALS ON SHIP STAFF, CITADEL HILL,

When vessels are seen from the Citadel or reported from an outpost.

The balls are hoisted at the east or west arm according to the quarter the vessel first appears in.

For a square rigged vessel, two balls of a size, one at the outer, the other at the inner halliard, close up.

A Ship or Barque, a large ball at the end of the yard, with a small one at the inner halliard.

A Brig, a small ball at the end of the yard, and a large one at the inner halliard.

A Brigantine, a cross close up at the outer halliard.

Two or more do., a cross half hoisted.

A Schooner, a cross close up at the inner halliard.

The upper yard is used to designate steam vessels.

One ball east or west indicates a steamer in that direction.

A small ball out and a large one in, a Branch Packet or Merchant Vessel.

A large ball out and a small one in, a Man-of-War or Royal Mail Steamer.

Numbers are indicated as directed from the lower yard.

The lower yard is used for sailing vessels only.

When the description of vessel is ascertained the following descriptive colors will be hoisted at the mast head:

A Union Jack, Flag Ship.

A Union Jack with Pendant over it, a Man-of-War.

A White Pendant with two Blue Crosses, a Transport; if a Man-of-War, the Union over.

A white Pendant with a Blue Ball, a Steamer; if a Man-of-War, the Union over.

A Red Flag pierced White, Royal Mail Steamer from England.

A Blue and Red Flag crossed White, do. from Boston.

A White and Blue Pendant, do. from Newfoundland.

A White and Red Pendant, do. from Bermuda.

A Blue Pendant, a Ship.

A Blue and White Pendant, a Barque.

A Red Pendant, a Brig.

A Red and White Pendant, a Brigantine.

A White Pendant, a Sloop or Schooner.

A White and Blue Pendant vertically divided, a Foreign or Neutral Man-of-War.

A Foreign or Neutral Merchantman, National Flag, with descriptive Pendant.

When an English Packet arrives between evening and morning gun fire, a Red Triangular Flag will be kept flying at the mast head from 7 till 8 o'clock A. M.

This Institution (Established August, 1856, and Incorporated April, 1862, by Act of Assembly) is the only one of the kind in the Lower Provinces, and has been established with the view of providing means of education for the neglected Deaf and Dumb of Nova Scotia and the adjoining Provinces. Since it was opened between sixty and seventy persons have received substantial benefit through its agency. The number of pupils at present is between forty and fifty, male and female, from all parts of the Provinces. The course of training is similar to that of such establishments in Great Britain and the United States. Natural signs and the Finger Language are the chief instruments employed in communicating knowledge; and the acquisition of written language constitutes for them the grand medium of intercourse with society.

An annual Provincial grant of \$2000, the receipts from pupils, and voluntary contributions, supply the means of support. The annual expenditure amounts to about \$5000, being on an average about \$125 per head for each pupil, which is less than the cost of similar institutions in Canada and the United States.

Further particulars may be known on application to the Principal of the Institution.

Visitors from the country admitted to inspect the Institution every day except Sunday; residents in Halifax on Tuesdays and Fridays only, between two and four o'clock p. m.

PROVINCIAL HOSPITAL FOR THE INSANE.

There were in the Hospital January 1st, 1862, 117 (62 males and 55 females). The whole number admitted in three years was 193, of whom 76 were discharged (37 restored, 25 improved, 14 died). In 1861, the current expenses of the Hospital for supplies—fuel, labor, &c.—were \$15,670 24 cts. Received from private patients, \$4144.

Terms—Board per week, for patients supported by their respective Counties, \$2 50 for males; \$2 for females. Private patients pay \$4

per week. Satisfactory proof being given of the inability of parties to pay this sum, a deduction is sometimes made.

ADMISSION.—Private patients are admitted upon payment of one quarter's board (in advance), bonds being entered into for subsequent payments. County patients require an order signed by the Sheriff or two Justices of the Peace. In all cases two Medical certificates are required. A benevolent fund, bequeathed by the late John Brown, Esq., is appropriated to the partial support of indigent patients.

ARRANGEMENTS.—The various services of the Hospital are upon the most approved principles. The heating is entirely by steam; the supply of water is ample, and of excellent quality; gas is made on the premises for lighting the building; the ventilation, the cooking, and the washing are by steam; the bread used is baked on the premises; the Library is well stocked with books; the halls are hung with pictures, and the rooms well furnished.

VISITORS.—The Hospital is open for visitors every Tuesday and Friday from 2 to 5 p. m. Orders of admission to be obtained at the office of the Board of Works.

THE CITY WATER WORKS.

The Water Works of the City were commenced by a private Company about the year 1846.

By this Company the domestic wants of the citizens were supplied with very tolerable satisfaction; but the disastrous fires of 1859 and 1860 proved their total inadequacy to subdue a great conflagration. The Company not being disposed to incur the outlay necessary for the enlargement of their works, the Corporation made arrangements to purchase them, and the Water Works passed into the hands of the City authorities accordingly in July 1861. The Corporation paid the Company the full cost of the Works, namely £56,000. At least as much more will be required to make them thoroughly efficient for all parts of the City. Up to the time of the transfer the Company had laid down about 21 miles of iron pipes, a considerable part of which were very small. Since the Works have become the property of the City the Commissioners of Water Supply have replaced more than one-third of the whole by large pipes, varying from 24 to 9 inches diameter. The main pipes from the Lakes, laid down by the Company, were capable of delivering at St. Andrew's Cross about two millions of gallons every 24 hours; the present mains will deliver at the same place, and in the same space of time, not less than five millions. The large pipes in the streets, however, will only be used to supply the fire hydrants, of which, when the system is complete, there will be one at the corner of every square in the City. At present there are about 60 large fire hydrants put down, which upon a recent trial worked to admiration. The Chairman of the Board of Commissioners in the Report on City affairs lately published, states it to be the ultimate intention to have a High Service and Reservoir for the benefit of the upper parts of the City.

SCALE OF RATES FOR WATER.

The Commissioners of Water Supply with the concurrence and approval of the City Council, have adopted the following Scale of Rates for Water:

One-eighth per cent. upon the value of Real Estate along which mains are laid.

Seventy-five cents for each of the occupants of Dwelling Houses, supplied, or which the Commissioners have been, or are, prepared to supply with water.

Twenty-five cents for each of the occupants of all Shops, Offices, and places of business where the water is or can be introduced.

Two dollars each additional upon Liquor Shops.

Two dollars for each horse kept by others than Truckmen and Cabmen.

One dollar each for horses owned by Cabmen and Truckmen.

Fifty cents each on Cows.

Four Dollars each on Water Closets and Baths.

STEAM ENGINES.—Stationary, for each horse-power up to, and not exceeding 10 horses, \$3 per horse, except in cases of special contract.

BREWERIES.—Where the consumption does not exceed 1000 gallons daily, Breweries will be charged at the rate of 5 cents for every 100 gallons. Where the consumption exceeds 1000 gallons daily, the rate to be 4 cents for every 100 gallons; the quantity, if necessary, to be ascertained by meter; or, if parties prefer, a special agreement may be made.

DISTILLERIES.—The same rate as Breweries.

HOTELS AND BOARDING-HOUSES—Will be charged the usual rate, with 50 per cent. additional; except in case of special agreement.

BAKERIES—To be charged in addition to the regular rate one cent per barrel for each barrel of flour of average daily manufactured.

Any cases not included or specified in the above Scale of Rates to be decided by the Commissioners.

RULES FOR REGULATING THE SUPPLY OF WATER.

1. The Water Rates are payable semi-annually, in advance, at the Office of the Water Commissioners, in Argyle Street, on 1st of May and 1st November of every year.
2. Every separate house or building is entitled to one $\frac{1}{2}$ inch service pipe. Where pipe is supplied larger than half-inch—or where there is more than one service-pipe—an extra charge will be made.
3. Citizens are required to keep the service-pipes within their premises in good repair and protected from frost at their own expense; they will be held liable for all damage that may result from neglect of this rule.
4. Unnecessary waste of water will not be permitted, under penalty of having the water turned off; and there shall be no concealment of the purposes for which the water is required.
5. No alterations shall be made in any of the pipes, or fixtures, except under the direction of the Commissioners, or their agents, who must have free access, at proper hours, to the water fixtures, in all premises, as often as may be required.
6. No person will be permitted to use the water for any purpose requiring an extra supply, without paying an additional rate; or to sell the water, except where an arrangement to that effect is made with the Commissioners.
7. The city authorities cannot be held liable for stoppage of water

occasioned by frost or other accidental causes. They will do all that lies in their power to prevent casualties, but do not hold themselves bound to repair damage. As it is difficult, at all times, to avoid inconvenience to citizens while necessary works are in progress, it would be well for parties having steam or water boilers to provide themselves with tanks.

8. Parties detected in the act of injuring the pipes, hydrants or other works connected with the water; or of obstructing the flow of water; or of putting impurities into it—will be promptly prosecuted for felony.

9. The Commissioners shall have the privilege of placing metres in any premises, supplied with water by the City, whenever they may deem it advisable.

10. The City reserves to itself the right of stopping the supply for manufacturing purposes, or for any other purpose, if the supply of water for domestic purposes should render it necessary.

11. Every citizen has the right of Appeal to the City Council.
