I.O.D.E. Presentation To Harkins Academy

During the past month anoth stage in the development of the War Memorial has been reached Memorial pictures to the provincial committees, who in turn, will present them to schoois throughout Canada. The basis of the allotment has been the number of schools and children in each prov-
ince, and each provincial committee, with the co-operation of the Department of Education, will select the schools to which the collections will be sent. Most of the pictures in the
collections are reproductions of paintings included in the collection paintings as the Canadian War Memorial, which were executed under the direction of the Canadian War Records Ofice of London.
