Expenses of collection \$25,000. The Old Bishop's college to cost as follows: Paid for Bishop's property \$67,000 less mortgage \$1,500. Balance \$65,500.

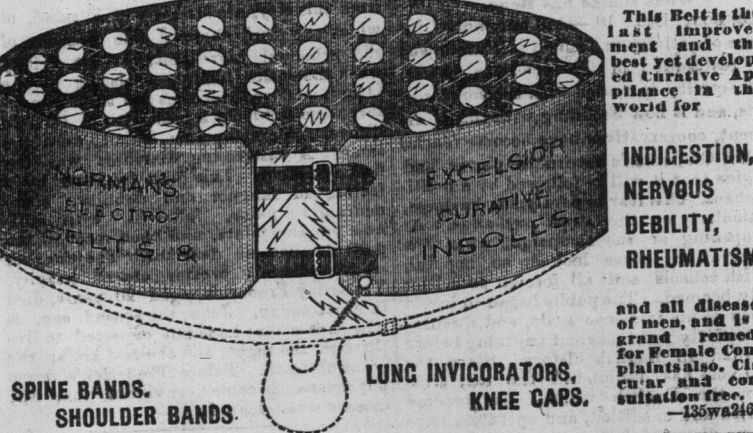
