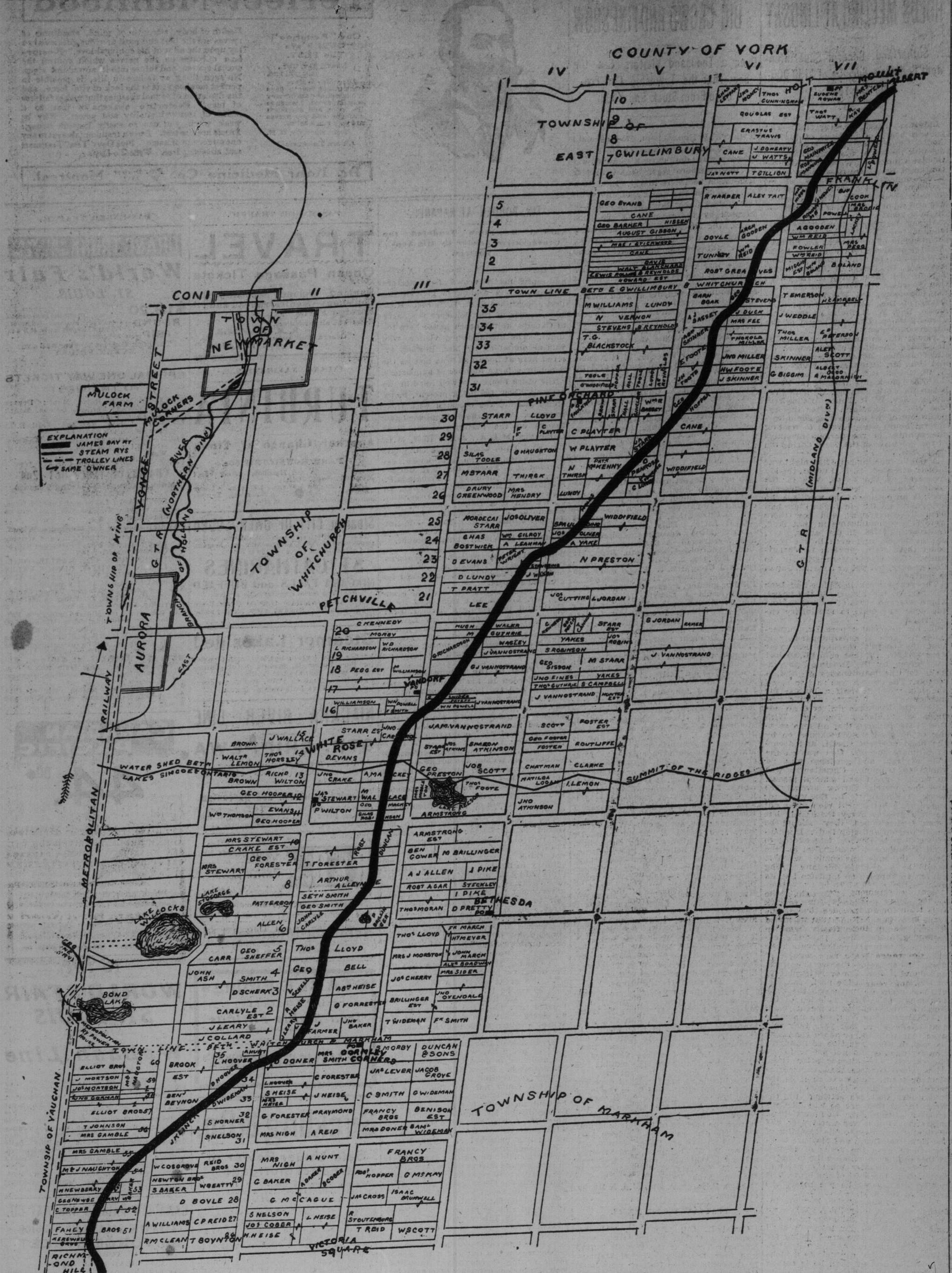

The committee finally concurred that as they had taken the pupils from the fifth book classes where they were all being taught they were bound to do their best for them. The full recommendation was finally passed, not, however, before Mr. Boland put and lost a motion to find a place for Connor O'Dea, who was left out in the reorganization of the Technical High School. The appointments were at the Collegiate: A. Cosens of Brampton to Jameson, T. J. Ivey of Scarboro to Jarvis, C. E. Kilmer of Ayrton to Harbour.
