"St. Julian" is full sixteen hands high and "Maid S." is only a shade less. Much diversity of opinion has existed among horsemen as to the best height of the trotting horses for both speed and endurance combined. The late Hiram Woodruff considered fifteen hands two inches as the best type, and cited the swift and game mare "Peelers" as an instance of the correct model. But, since his day, the trotting horse has improved in form as well as in speed. Certain it is that today the great performers are large horses. Not only are "Maid S." and "St. Julian" sixteen hands high, but "Ratus" overtops them, and "Edwin Forrest" and "Trinket," "Clington" and "Edwin Thorne" and "Black Cloud" and "Jerome Eddy" and "Smuggler" raised the standard to the same height. The trotting horse may be a grand performer, and still be small, but other things being equal, he will be a grander performer if he possesses greater size. This assertion is made in the face of the fact that "Flora Temple" for years the queen of the turf, was only fourteen hands and three-quarters high, and "Goldsmith Maid" was only two inches taller. The large horses are so greatly in majority that these two instances are really exceptions to the rule. The large horse has so much greater sweep and power of stride. Moreover, he has so much more steadiness of purpose that he can literally wear out his smaller rivals by the very excess of his physique. So very positive has this conviction become among horsemen that they do not expect more than a second-class performer from a small trotter.
