# ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETY.

## ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1854.

PRESENTED 5TH JANUARY, 1855.

The Committee of Management appointed at the last Annual Meeting of your Society have the honor to submit the following report of their transactions for the past year :

The Sub-Committee of Charity have used their utmost endeavours to see that the charitable fund of the Society was applied to legitimate and deserving objects.

They have expended a sum of £88 6s 6d. the details of which will be found in the Register of their proceedings now on the table for inspection.

In connection with this branch of the Society's operations we have to report that at a quarterly meeting, held on the 25th March last, a recommendation was made by your Committee that a sum of £50 should be invested with the public subscription made in this city on behalf of the widow and children of our late Vice-President. W. B. Meyer, which recommendation was unanimously concurred in. The amount was duly paid into the hands of C. Wurtele, Esquire, and the collections have been subsequently invested in the hands of trustees for the above object.

A resolution was passed by your Committee on the 10th of April last, that that part of the 7th section of the By-laws providing that any balance over £10 being at the credit of the Charitable Fund be rescinded, and that such balance do remain at the credit of the Charitable Fund, for the charitable purposes of the Society, but as this involves a change of a By-law, it is requisite that it should receive the sanction of a General Meeting, and is now submitted for that purpose.

It has always been the custom of the Society to welcome a new Governor. In conformity with this usage, a deputation waited on His Excellency Sir Edmund Head, on the 3rd instant, to

present a congratulatory address and were most cordially received.

The Address and His Excellency's reply will be read for the satisfaction of those members who were unable to attend on the occasion.

The financial affairs of the Society, the particulars of which will be found in the Treasurer's Report, continue satisfactory.

There is one point however which your Committee cannot abstain from alluding to, and with regret, namely, the arrears, which have considerably increased, and they trust that in view of the pressing calls which the Society may expect during the present winter of dear bread and fuel, that these arrears will be promptly diminished.

Our last anniversary was celebrated by the attendance of the members at a service in the Cathedral, the Sermon being preached by the Patron of the Society, the Lord Bishop of Quebec; prayers were read by Rev. Dr. Mackie, one of the Society's Chaplains, assisted by the Rev. Mr. Pleas.

The Society was again indebted to the Organist of the Cathedral, John Carter, Esq., the Ladies and Gentlemen of the Choir, and other amateur Musicians, who kindly gave their valuable assistance in the performance of a very gratifying Musical Service. A number of the Members also celebrated the day by dining together at Russell's Hotel.

During the past year the Society has secured an addition of one life and one ordinary member. The obituary list of the Society has, your Committee lament to say, been added to during the past twelve months, by the death of Messrs. W. B. Meyer, A. Hawkins, and W. Holchouse, the two former were original members, W. B. Meyer Esqr., being at the time of his death, your first Vice-President. A number of the Members paid their last mark of respect by attending his funeral.

To the late Mr. A. Hawkins, the Society was indebted for much valuable aid rendered to the Committee, his influence as Shipping Master of the Port of Quebec being of essential service.

## REPORT OF THE CHARITABLE COMMITTEE FOR 1854.

The Charitable Committee have to report that during the year past, relief has been afforded in forty-seven (47) cases of distress, at a cost of £88 6s. 6d. currency.

The ravages of the Cholera deprived many families of their protectors, and threw upon the bounty of your Society, many widows and children—all of whom were assisted; several aged and infirm persons were forwarded to England, and supplied with sufficient means to enable them to reach their native places. In procuring passages, the late Mr. Hawkins was indefatigable, and in his death the Society loses a member who was ever kind and active in promoting the objects for which the Society was at first instituted.

The Committee have also to express their thanks to the Physicians of the Society, who have in several cases afforded valuable and effectual assistance.

The Committee would strongly urge upon the members of the Society, the duty of investigating cases, before referring them to the Charitable Committee.

REPORT  
OF THE  
TREASURER OF THE ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETY  
FOR THE YEAR 1854.

---

The Treasurer, in presenting his Annual Report, has again the pleasure of congratulating the St. George's Society upon the great extent of usefulness, which the transactions of the Charitable Committee, during the past year, will amply testify. No less a sum than £88 6s. 6d. has been expended in charity, and also the sum of £50 was voted by this Society towards the Meyer Fund.

The Treasurer has much pleasure in informing the members that the sum of £1,513 9s. 11d. has been expended in charity since the formation of the Society, being an average of £75 each year.

The expenditure of the Charitable Fund has exceeded the income by £12 5s., to which amount it now stands indebted; the small sum of five pounds has been added to the permanent fund, being for one life member: the total amount being £1,381 8s. 9.; £1,800 of which is invested in Bank Stock and other securities, and the balance remains to be invested.

One life and one ordinary member have been added to the Society since the last Annual Report.

The interest of the permanent fund this year has been £91 16s. 9d., being £3 10s. 3d. over the sum expended by the Charitable Committee, and to this fund only are the Society able to meet the demands for charity.
