CONSUMPTION BY INGESTION.
Dr. Blaine holds that the disease is Acquired from Meat and Milk.
N. Y. Sea.
Dr. M. D. Blaine read a paper before the New York Academy of Medicine on "Bovine Tuberculosis—its communication by inhalation, ingestion, and hereditary transmission, and its relation to public health." Dr. Blaine said that consumption, or tuberculosis, is both inherited and acquired. He held that as the so-called lower animals have organs similar in construction and material to those of man, the disease existing in the one is capable of reproduction in the other, and that it is natural that man, who drinks the lower animal's milk and eats their flesh, should contract their diseases through ingestion. CITY COUNCIL.

December Session of the Board of Aldermen and Common Council. The regular monthly meeting of the city council was held on Tuesday evening, Nov. 23, 1888. The Mayor, the Mayor pro tem, and the members of the board were present except Ald. Davis and Ald. Edgemoor, after his long absence in the old country, was in his chair and seemed better prepared than ever to turn his attention to civic affairs.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES. His Worship the Mayor from committee appointed to inquire into the burial of the poor, reported very much to the satisfaction of the council that the committee had attended to the matter and had provided a plot of ground in the vicinity of the almshouse for that purpose.

The streets committee stated in their report that they had under consideration the plan of numbering the houses in the city, but considered that the plan as proposed should not be adopted by the council until the matter was further looked into.

The committee recommended that a storage shed be erected in the rear of the almshouse at a cost not exceeding \$125 for protection of city property. Considerable discussion followed. Ald. Hazen and others pointed out that instead of expending a further sum for the protection of property that was absolutely valueless to the city, such as the roller, watering cart, engine, etc., that the committee would dispose of the same for what they would bring. Ald. Parker stated that the committee had been previously authorized to sell these articles and had endeavored to do so at every opportunity that offered, but had not succeeded. He pointed out the advantages of having a building erected for the storage of these and other city property. Ald. Hazen's amendment was lost and the recommendations of the committee prevailed, the report being adopted.

The city clerk reported that the McCafferty matter had been finally settled and that the justice committee recommended that the balance of his account, the sum of \$375 be paid. In answer to Ald. Edgemoor, the city clerk stated that the amount ordered to be paid Mr. McCafferty made the full amount of the contract and nothing more, and that the city had lost in the transaction the amount of the costs \$10 only. Report adopted.

The street lamp committee reported that three gasoline lamps had been erected on college road at a cost of \$28.25, and that the lamps were giving every satisfaction. Ald. Sharkey advocated the placing of a gas lamp at the corner of Newham and Regent streets for the benefit of the residents on Newham street, and he made a motion to this effect. Ald. Edgemoor and others thought that the lamp should be placed near the middle of Newham street, and thought that, owing to the lateness of the season, a gasoline lamp would answer the purpose for the present. On motion the matter was referred to the lamp committee.

MCCAFFERTY MATTER. Ald. Parker, chairman of road committee, moved that the committee be authorized to ask for tenders for 800 perch of gravel from the bed of the St. John for road purposes. Ald. Parker advocated the use of such material in preference to broken stones and thought that the experiment should be made. Such material was largely used in other cities, and from inquiries he had learned that it was less expensive and even more endurable than the stone. In answer to an inquiry, he stated that 800 tons of gravel would make, he thought, as much road as 800 perch of stone. The matter was quite lengthily discussed, Ald. McCafferty and McPherson being opposed to the innovation, the latter claiming that a number of men around town were largely dependent on stone breaking for their livelihood and to pay their taxes. The majority of the board, however, favoring making the experiment, as the quality of stone used had not given satisfaction. The road committee were finally authorized to ask for tenders for 800 tons of gravel and also 1,000 perch of stone.

ROADS. Ald. Parker said that as it was the intention of the council as soon as the city finances would admit to erect asphalt pavement on the whole length of the northern side of Queen street, he moved a resolution thanking the Dominion government for the asphalt walks they had constructed on Carleton street and requesting them to continue the asphalt construction in front of the government buildings and property on Queen street. The resolution carried and also a similar memorial to the provincial government for construction of asphalt pavement in front of the Normal school. After a worthy contest between Ald. Sharkey and McCafferty concerning the By-law street sidewalks, the council adjourned.

Lighting the Bridge. A more was made at the last session of the council to have the matter of lighting the bridge attended to. Ald. Wiley moved and it was resolved that a committee be appointed to interview the city council as to the lighting of the bridge and to make arrangements with that board for the same. If conclusions were arrived at. There was a general feeling in favor of taking steps to have the bridge lighted for another summer, and it is more than likely that the council will lend practical aid in the undertaking. The lamp committee of the city council was appointed to meet the city council at their meeting next month to take the matter into consideration.

Inviting Miramichi. The farmers around Woodstock and that section of the county are sending out their agents to spy out the land around Miramichi with the object of opening up a market here for their farm produce. Some of them were in Newcastle and Chatham last week and effected some sales of hay and butter. What have our own farmers got to say to this? A little more attention to their farms is the only way to meet these "blasted foreigners."—Newcastle Advocate.
