**PROHIBITION AND INLAND
REVENUE CONVICTIONS**
At Dalhousie last week Excise Officer Stewart, working in conjunction with Inspectors Smith and Doyle of Campbellton, obtained four convictions under the Inland Revenue Act, for manufacturing spirits and home brew. Those convicted were Wm. Harquail, fined \$50.00; Arthur Charbonnet, \$50.00; Theo. Madson, \$50.00; and Joseph Pirolet, \$50.00. Last week Officer Stewart with Inspectors Quintermain and Manderson made a seizure of home brew and part of a still in Newcastle. This will likely result in the conviction of Philip Le Galley and Annie Maloney who were the owners of the "beehive" mill. The inspectors also had three prohibition seizures in Newcastle last week.
On Tuesday Inspectors Smith and Kane obtained a conviction against Joseph Winchester of Dalhousie for illegal selling. The penalty was \$50.00 and costs or three months in jail. Winchester chose the latter.

**PROPERTY OWNERS
WILL VOTE**
Town Bill for Authority to Issue Bonds for Improvements Amended.
Last week a delegation of Campbellton citizens met the Municipal Committee of the Local Legislature and discussed the Town of Campbellton bill to authorize the issuing of \$25,000 bonds for certain water and sewerage extensions. The bill was amended to provide for the payment of capital expenditures as represented in the overdraft.
The delegation while favoring some of the work planned, thought the time not ripe for the whole program, but expressed themselves willing to abide by the decision of the property owners on a referendum.
The request was favored by the committee and we understand the bill has been recommended with the amendment asked for.
This means that if the property owners are favorable the work as planned will be carried out.
No doubt the Town Council will call upon the citizens at an early date.

FOR BETRAYER**
M. Jeannes Declared Guilty of Betraying Nurse Edith Cavell.
Brussels, April 5.—M. Jeannes, betrayer of Edith Cavell, British war nurse, was Tuesday found guilty and sentenced to death.
Miss Cavell was executed by the Germans during their occupation of Belgium on the ground that she was a spy and revealed secrets to the Allies.

RED CROSS SOCIETY ACTIVE

Hotel Dieu Hospital Offers Free Eye, Ear, Nose and Throat Treatment to Poor Children of Town.

A committee meeting of the recently organized Red Cross Society was held in the Knights of Columbus Hall here on March 24th. Communique from the Hotel Dieu Hospital and Dr. Coeture were read. Through its letter the hospital offered free of charge, the use of the operating room for eye, ear, nose or throat work to the poor children of the town, on condition that the applicant for treatment had a certificate from confidential authority. The offer also embraced twenty-four hours free nursing. In his letter Dr. Coeture offered to examine and operate, free of charge on any of these applicants sent by the Red Cross Society for eye, ear, nose or throat treatment. The society very gratefully accepted these generous offers.

THE MODERATION LEAGUE.

Even in this advanced age of civilization and culture when a moderate education can be secured at a minimum cost it is amazing what a number of ignoramus this progressive land of ours is producing. To think of this sad fact in a general way is not disturbing but when the matter touches our own community the thought becomes significant to all conscientious citizens. To many, according to their conduct, Campbellton is bounded on the east by Richardsville, on the north by the Restigouche River, on the west by Morrissey Rock, and on the south by the Tobique and Balmoral "wet belt" where the inhabitants manufacture hooch for a living and cut pulp and grow potatoes in their spare time. Such is their little world. Of what is going on outside this circle of their existence they know little and care less. What does it matter anyway. What is good for them is good for the "outside
